A proposal by Bill Coffey, County Director for the Agriculture Extension Service, regarding the temporary status of the current 4-H agent was discussed. A full time, benefited position through Sweetwater County rather than the University was requested. The Board agreed to allow the request on a temporary basis and would evaluate the position at a later date. The Board expressed their desire that the agent continue to work closely with the University.

A motion was duly made by John L. Yerkovich, seconded by Linda M. Taliaferro and carried that the following Resolution be approved:

R E S O L U T I O N

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ELECTION ORDINANCE OF THE RELIANCE FIRE DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Reliance Fire District is a fire protection district organized on November 21, 1977, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 35-437 through 35-445, Wyoming Statutes 1957 (1975 Cumulative Supplement), (now Sections 35-9-201 through 35-9-209, Wyoming Statutes Annotated 1977); and

WHEREAS, no election ordinance thereafter was adopted by said initial Board of Directors as required under provisions of Wyoming law; and

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WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Sweetwater County, Wyoming, thereafter conducted an election of Board of Directors for the District on May 5, 1981; and

WHEREAS, on the 29th day of March, 1982, the Board of Directors of the District adopted an election ordinance in accordance with law, which election ordinance was thereafter approved by the Board of County Commissioners on the 6th day of April, 1982, all as required by law; and

WHEREAS, the Board thereafter conducted annual elections in the years 1982, 1983, 1984, and 1985, in accordance with law and said election ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Board did not conduct the annual election specified in said election ordinance to be held the 1st Tuesday in May, 1986, by virtue of the amendment of Section 35-9-202, W.S., and the requirement of said statute that board elections be conducted in the year 1986 and thereafter only upon the prior adoption by the Board of an election ordinance specifying biennial elections, and the approval of such election ordinance by the Board of County Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, on the 1st Tuesday in May, 1986, the term of office of Board Member Clifford Renz expired, and Board of Directors on said date appointed Clifford Renz to fill the vacancy thereby created until the next election of directors of the District; and

WHEREAS, on the 22nd day of December, 1986, the Board of Directors of the District adopted an election ordinance in accordance with law, which election ordinance was thereafter approved by the Board of County Commissioners on the 6th day of January, 1987, all as required by law, which election ordinance specified the date of the statewide primary election as the biennial election date for Board elections of the District, commencing in the year 1988, and which election ordinance further specified that an election would be held on January 27, 1987, for the purpose of electing one member of the Board to serve until the Statewide primary election in the year 1990, such elected member to succeed to the term of office held by appointment by Clifford Renz, which election was conducted on said 27th day of January, 1987, in accordance with law, at which election Clifford Renz was elected to serve until the biennial election of the District in the year 1990; and which election ordinance further specified that the vacancy in the term of office then held by Charles A. Johnson, which was to expire on the first Tuesday in May, 1987, was to be filled by the Board at such time by appointment, such appointed member to serve until the 1988 biennial election of the District and that the vacancy in the term of office held by Buddy Nauman, which was to expire on the first Tuesday in May, 1988, should likewise be filled by the Board at such time by appointment, such appointed member to likewise serve until the 1988 biennial election of the District, said election ordinance further providing that commencing in 1988 and every fourth year thereafter, two (2) members of the Board were to be elected and commencing in 1990 and every fourth year thereafter, one (1) member of the Board was to be elected; and

WHEREAS, the Board did not conduct the biennial election specified in said election ordinance to be held the third Tuesday in August, 1988; and

WHEREAS, on the third Tuesday in August, 1988, the term of office of Board members Charles A. Johnson and Buddy Nauman expired, and Clifford Renz, being the sole remaining member of the Board

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of Directors, on said date appointed Charles A. Johnson and Buddy Nauman to fill the vacancies thereby created until the next election of Directors of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Board has elected to specify the date of the statewide general election as the 1988 biennial election date for Board elections of the District, and has determined that an election should be held on the 8th day of November, 1988, for the purpose of electing two (2) members of the Board to serve until the biennial election of the District in the year 1992, such elected members to succeed to the terms of office now held by appointment by Charles A. Johnson and Buddy Nauman, and that commencing in 1990 and every fourth year thereafter, one (1) member of the Board shall be elected, and commencing in 1992 and every fourth year thereafter, two (2) members of the Board shall be elected; and the Board has further determined that, commencing in the year 1990, the biennial election date for Board elections of the District shall be the date of the statewide primary election; and

WHEREAS, on the _____ day of October, 1988, in accordance with Section 35-9-202, W.S., as amended, the Board of Directors of the Reliance Fire District passed and approved an election ordinance specifying the time, place and conduct of biennial elections to be conducted by the Board, which election ordinance has been submitted to this board for approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING:

Section 1. That the election ordinance passed and approved by the Board of Directors of the Reliance Fire District on the _____ day of October, 1988, is hereby found to comply, in all respects, with the requirements of applicable law, and the same is hereby ordered to be approved.

Section 2. That said election ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect from and after the date of this Resolution.
