Bill Kouris and Roger Tanner from Overland Insurance Agency, Inc. met this day with the Board regarding the Federal Law, Section 89. The two representatives discussed a possible contract with the County to do a study as to whether or not the County would be in compliance with the new law. After a discussion, the Board informed Mr. Kouris and Tanner that the Board would research the proposal and would get back to them at a later date.

Representatives from the YWCA met this day with the Board requesting advance information about the YWCA's 1989-90 fiscal budget as the YWCA has begun early preparation for their budget. After a discussion the Board informed the representatives of the YWCA that it was still too early to determine if this year's projections were accurate or if the next fiscal year's revenues would have an increase. The representatives also asked the Board if they had any questions regarding the YWCA's programs and services. The Chairman, Linda M. Taliaferro, stated that she has heard positive comments about the YWCA from people who do use the Y's services, however, other taxpayers have spoken against the high cost of the program.

A motion was duly made by John L. Yerkovich, seconded by Fred Radosevich and carried that the Sweetwater County Library Board be allowed to submit a lease proposal to the U.S. Postal Service to build a new facility on County owned property in Reliance.

A motion was duly made by Fred Radosevich, seconded by John L. Yerkovich and carried that the claim, Charles Worley vs. Memorial Hospital of Sweetwater County, be denied.

A motion was duly made by John L. Yerkovich, seconded by Fred Radosevich and carried that the acceptance certificate SC-CFM 4-38 C Reliance Road Completion be approved.

A motion was duly made by John L. Yerkovich, seconded by Fred Radosevich and carried that the remodeling and installation of a computer room for the County Office Building in Rock Springs be approved and Joe Drnas be awarded the material contract in the amount of \$4,800.00 and Delta Electric be awarded the contract for the wiring phase in the amount of \$3,580.00.

A motion was duly made by John L. Yerkovich, seconded by Fred Radosevich and carried that Marvin Applequist I and Roger Moellendorf be appointed to the Sweetwater County Weed and Pest Control Board and that Dick Hodges be re-appointed to the Weed and Pest Control Board.

WHEREAS, Sweetwater County, Wyoming, hereinafter referred to as the "County," has in the past reimbursed transportation expenses of County officers and employees while using their private vehicles according to the methods set forth in Section 9-3-103 (a) (iii), W.S. 1977, as amended.

WHEREAS, the County has heretofore reimbursed County officers and employees for use of passenger vehicles, self-contained campers, motor homes, or four-wheel drives at a rate of 22.5¢ per mile; and

WHEREAS, on the advice of the County auditors, it is considered necessary and desirable for the County to adopt a formal policy regarding reimbursement of travel expenses for County officers and employees while using their private vehicles.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Sweetwater County, Wyoming as follows:

1. That in order to comply with the advice of the County auditors, it is deemed necessary and advisable that a formal policy be enacted for the reimbursement of actual and necessary travel expenses incurred by County officers and employees required to use privately owned vehicles in the performance of their duties.

2. That from and after February 1, 1989, the County will reimburse County officers and employees for the use of their private passenger vehicles, self-contained campers, motor homes, and four-wheel drives all at the rate of 24¢ per mile.

3. That all resolutions and parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

4. That immediately after its adoption, this resolution shall be filed by the Chairman and County Clerk, shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose, and shall take effect as of February 1, 1989.

WHEREAS, Cheyenne was the site of that first recognition of engineering as a profession, it is fitting that Cheyenne be the home of The Professional Engineering Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, the creation of a national museum and educational institution in Cheyenne will contribute to the overall health of education and the economy of all of Wyoming,
