Gordon Hiller from Intermountain Benefit Administration met this day with the Board regarding a life, medical reinsurance and administrative services proposal for Sweetwater County for a self funded insurance program. After hearing how the self funded program works, the Board thanked Mr. Hiller for his time and work and informed him when they made a decision regarding the insurance for county employees they would contract him.

A motion was duly made by John L. Yerkovich, seconded by Fred Radosevich and carried that the proposed Resolution for the running at large of domesticated (or domestic) animals in unincorporated areas of Sweetwater County be advertised according to law.

A motion was duly made by Fred Radosevich, seconded by John L. Yerkovich and carried that the Bureau of Land Management be notified that Sweetwater County has no objections to the proposed right-of-way through Crossroads West Park and the Sweetwater County Trap Club for the proposed supplemental water supply pipeline to be constructed by the Clearview Improvement and Service District.

A motion was duly made by John L. Yerkovich, seconded by Fred Radosevich and carried that the following Resolution be approved:

RESOLUTION NO. 89 -

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING LINDA M. TALIAFERRO, AS CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING, AND ALBERT B. VESCO, AS SWEETWATER COUNTY CLERK, TO EXECUTE AN APPLICATION FOR LAND FOR RECREATION OR PUBLIC PURPOSES, COVERING A TRACT OF LAND OF 22.28 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, CONTAINED IN SECTION 30, TOWNSHIP 20 NORTH, RANGE 108 WEST TO THE 6TH PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN, SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING.

WHEREAS, the United States of America, Department of the Interior, Bureau of Land Management, is the owner of Lot 8, Section 30, Township 20 North, Range 108 West of the 6th Principal Meridian, together with that portion of Section 30 lying South of the Green River, in Sweetwater County, Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, the construction of this bridge on the Lower Farson Cutoff Road (County Road 4-8) will increase recreational and tourism opportunities by making a number of isolated sites in the Fontenelle area more accessible to the public; and

WHEREAS, several private companies have committed \$167,075, (51%), toward the total constructions costs of this project; and

WHEREAS, Sweetwater County will contribute \$16,500 of "in-kind" engineering services and road approach work and Lincoln County will provide \$13,000 of "in-kind" road approach work toward the total costs of this project;

R E S O L U T I O N

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT, APPOINTMENTS, TERMS, OFFICERS, MEETING, FUNCTIONS, AND DUTIES OF A REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY IN SWEETWATER COUNTY, STATE OF WYOMING IN ACCORDANCE WITH W.S. #18-14-101;18-14-102; AND 18-14-103.

WHEREAS, the State of Wyoming has enacted a law pertaining to Regional Transportation Authorities empowering a county to own, maintain and operate a public transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Sweetwater County desires to establish a coordinated county-wide public transportation network and would commit funds to provide for support of said transportation network; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has established by resolution a County Transportation Board on April 5, 1989;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Sweetwater County that:

Section 1. There is hereby established a transit authority to be known as the "Sweetwater County Transit Authority". Said Authority will provide a level of transportation service that is based on funding and ridership. This Resolution shall become effective on the day and date first above written and shall continue in force without specific term.

Section 2. (a) There is hereby established a Board to be known as the "Board of the Sweetwater County Transit Authority". The Board shall consist of five (5) members, who shall be residents of the County, said members to be appointed by the Board of the County Commissioners of Sweetwater County, Wyoming. The term of the members of the Board shall be three (3) years, except that two members of the first Board appointed shall serve for three (3) years, two member for two (2) years, and one member for one (1) year. Members may be reappointed for one additional term. A vacancy on the Board shall be filled for the unexpired term by appointment by the Board of County Commissioners. The Board of County Commissioners shall have the power to remove any member for cause.

(b) At its first meeting following the appointment of its members, and thereafter at the July meeting of each year, the Board shall elect a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, and Secretary-Treasurer from among its members. The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings, and in his/her absence the Vice-Chairperson shall preside. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all the proceedings at each meeting and shall transmit copies thereof to the County Clerk and to each member of the Board of the County Commissioners. The Secretary-Treasurer shall keep a file of minutes of the meetings.

(c) The Board shall hold at least one regular meeting in each quarter at such time and place as may be fixed by the Board. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the Chairperson, or in his/her absence, by any three members of the Board. A majority of the number of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board. No action of the Board shall be valid unless such action shall receive the approval of a majority of the members appointed to the Board.

(d) The Board may employ such employees as it may deem necessary for the operation of the Authority and may also contract with legal counsel, engineers, and other consultants for such services as it may require. The Board shall fix the compensation of such employees as it shall deem necessary. The members of the Board shall serve without pay or compensation of any kind except for actual expenses incurred by such members.

(e) In addition to the other powers vested in it by law, the Board may exercise all powers granted to it by the "Regional Transportation Authority" act, W.S. #18-14-141; 18-14-102; and 18-14-103.

(f) The Board shall adopt such rules and regulation governing its organization and procedures governing the management of transportation within the County as it deems necessary, which rules and regulations shall not be inconsistent with Wyoming law. A copy of said rules and regulations shall be filed as provided by law. The Board may enforce its rules and regulations by appropriate legal proceedings.

Section 3. The Board shall be subject to the Uniform Municipal Fiscal Procedures Act, Sections 16-4-101 through 16-4-407, Wyoming Statutes 1977.
