The Board of County Commissioners met this day in special session, as advertised, with all members present.

A motion was duly made by John L. Yerkovich, seconded by Fred Radosevich and carried that the following Resolution be approved as presented:

**R E S O L U T I O N   8 9 - 5**

WHEREAS the Sweetwater County Planning and Zoning Commission after holding a duly advertised public hearing in accordance with the procedural requirements of the Zoning Resolution of Sweetwater County, Wyoming, has recommended and certified the following text amendment to Section 13 bbb. Trucking. of the Zoning Resolution of Sweetwater County, Wyoming:

Change the definition to read: "A trucking business for the purpose of this Resolution located in an I-1 (Light Industrial) zone district shall be one limited in the scale of its operation. No more than ten (10) trucks and their single trailer units shall be allowed in association with the Permitted Use. Maintenance buildings shall be limited to no more than (2) truck bays. Offices are permitted. Storage of fuel shall be in accordance with the pertinent district regulations."

WHEREAS the recommended and certified text amendment to the Zoning Resolution is consistent with the purposes and goals of the adopted Sweetwater County Comprehensive and Land Use Plans and would be adopted pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 5, Sections 18-5-201 through 18-5-207, Wyoming Statutes Annotated, 1977 Republished Edition, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the aforementioned text amendment to the Zoning Resolution of Sweetwater County, Wyoming, be adopted and incorporated into said law.

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A motion was duly made by Fred Radosevich, seconded by John Yerkovich and carried that the following Resolution be approved as presented:

**RESOLUTION 89 - 4**

WHEREAS the Sweetwater County Planning and Zoning Commission has recommended the approval of the zone change requested by John Bunning Company from I-1 (Light Industrial) to I-2 (Heavy Industrial) for the purpose of locating a truck terminal on the following described real property located west of Rock Springs, Wyoming, on the West side of U.S. Highway 191:

A piece, parcel, or tract of land situated in the S/2 of the N/2 of Section 18, Township 18 North, Range 105 West of the 6th Principal Meridian Sweetwater County, Wyoming, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the W/4 corner of said Section 18 which point is monumented by a standard BLM iron pipe with brass cap (BLM 1981 Resurvey); thence north along the west line of Section 18 for a distance of 1319.36 feet to a point monumented by a Berntsen Monument dated 1984;

Thence South 89 degrees 41' 35" East along the north line of the S/2 of the NW/4 of Section 18 for a distance of 1957.06 feet to a point on the Westerly right-of-way line of U.S. Highway 191 said point being monumented by a 5/8 inch diameter rebar with aluminum cap;

Thence Southeasterly along the Westerly right-of-way line of the U.S. 191 for a distance of 1508 feet more or less to a point on the East-West centerline of Section 18, said point being monumented by a 5/8 inch diameter rebar with aluminum cap;

Thence North 89 degrees 43' 25" West along the East-West centerline of Section 18 for a distance of 2664.33 feet to the W/4 corner of Sections 18 and point of beginning. Above described parcel contains an area of approximately 70 acres.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the aforementioned zone change be approved as recommended by the Sweetwater County Planning and Zoning Commission.

Also the four rate structure be added to the benefit policy as follows:

- 1 Single
- 2 Single parent with children
- 3 Husband and wife
- 4 Family - husband and wife with children

Chuck Bonomo, Fair Manager, and Leon Kjellgren met this day with the Board regarding water well casing problems at the fair grounds. Mr. Bonomo and Mr. Kjellgren asked permission to hire a firm to log the well and to pinpoint the problems.
