### RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION IMPOSING AN EMERGENCY TELEPHONE CHARGE UPON TELEPHONE EXCHANGE ACCESS FACILITIES WITHIN THE COUNTY OF SWEETWATER, WYOMING.

WHEREAS, SS16-9-101 through SS16-9-106, W.S., 1977, as amended authorized the provision of an emergency 911 service and allows the governing body to impose a monthly uniform charge in an amount not to exceed fifty cents (\$.50) on each local exchange access line and those portions of the governing body's jurisdiction for which the 911 system is to be provided; and

WHEREAS a public hearing was held on January 16, 1990 to take comments from the public of Sweetwater County and that the comments and information received at said public hearing were uniform in their support for said emergency telephone charge; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, Sweetwater County, Wyoming, finds that it is in the best interest of the public of Sweetwater County that they be provided with emergency telephone service; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioner, Sweetwater County, Wyoming, finds that it is in the best interest of the public of Sweetwater County to impose a charge upon telephone subscribers within said County and to authorize telephone service suppliers to collect said charge and to enter into an agreement with the governing bodies of other public agencies pursuant to SS16-9-101 et. Seq.

W.S. 1977, as amended, in order to operate and fund the emergency service system established within Sweetwater County;

THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

1. Pursuant to SS16-9-101 et. seq., (W.S. 1977, amended) there is hereby imposed upon all telephone exchange access facilities within the County of Sweetwater, State of Wyoming, a monthly uniform emergency telephone charge in the amount of fifty cents (\$.50) on each local exchange access line within said County.

2. The emergency telephone charge will be governed, determined and regulated in accordance with SS16-9-101, et. Seq., (W.S. 1977, as amended) and the applicable rules, regulations or orders of the Wyoming public Service Commission lawfully adopted or issued by said Commission.

3. Telephone service suppliers providing telephone service in the County of Sweetwater, State of Wyoming are hereby authorized to collect the emergency telephone charge imposed by this Resolution in accordance with said Statute.

4. The effective date of the Resolution shall be March 1, 1990, and shall continue in effect for one calendar year from said date.
