EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF A REGULAR
MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

OF SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING, HELD ON JUNE 4, 1991

The Board of County Commissioners of Sweetwater County, Wyoming met in the City of Green River, Wyoming, at 1:30 p.m. on June 4, 1991.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, and, upon roll call, those present and absent were as follows:

Mr. Radosevich stated that he planned to introduce a resolution which would provide for the issuance of pollution control revenue refunding bonds by the County to aid FMC Corporation in refinancing the improvements or additions to certain solid waste disposal or pollution control facilities near its Green River plant in Sweetwater County, Wyoming.

The following resolution was introduced by Mr. Radosevich, read in full and considered:

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE
OF UP TO \$1,830,000 TAX-EXEMPT ADJUSTABLE MODE
POLLUTION CONTROL REVENUE REFUNDING
BONDS (FMC CORPORATION PROJECT) 1991 SERIES OF
SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING
AND AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING THE EXECUTION
AND DELIVERY OF AN INDENTURE OF TRUST, A THIRD
AMENDATORY LEASE AND AGREEMENT, A PLACEMENT
AGREEMENT, PLACEMENT MEMORANDA, INSTRUMENTS
RELATED THERETO AND OTHER MATTERS
IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.**

WHEREAS, Sweetwater County, Wyoming, (the "County") is authorized by Title 15.1, Sections 701 to 710, inclusive, of the Wyoming Statutes Annotated, as amended (the "Act"), to issue its Pollution Control Revenue Bonds for the public purposes set forth in the Act, including the abatement or control of pollution of the environment of the State of Wyoming, and to expend the proceeds thereof to defray, among other things, the cost of acquiring or improving projects as defined

in the Act which include pollution control facilities or other improvements and to lease, or enter into other arrangements relating to the same; and

WHEREAS, on July 21, 1981, the County adopted a Resolution authorizing the issuance of its \$1,830,000 Pollution Control Revenue Bonds, 1981 Series (FMC Corporation Project) (the "Original Bonds"), the proceeds thereof to be used to defray costs incurred in connection with the pollution control and abatement facilities referred to in said Resolution to be constructed and installed at the manufacturing facility owned and operated by FMC Corporation (the "Company") at its Green River Plant in the County; and

WHEREAS, on May 21, 1991, the County adopted a Resolution providing for the redemption of the Original Bonds in accordance with Section 301 of the Second Supplemental Indenture of Trust dated as of July 1, 1981 from the County to Commerce Union Bank, as trustee; and

WHEREAS, the Company has asked the County to authorize the issuance of up to \$1,830,000 Pollution Control Revenue Refunding Bonds (FMC Corporation Project) 1991 Series (the "Bonds") the proceeds of which will be used to refund the Original Bonds; and

WHEREAS, to refinance the cost of the Project and to incorporate other changes in the Original Bond documents, the County desires to issue the Bonds in the amount of up to \$1,830,000 pursuant to the Indenture of Trust by and between the County and First-Citizens Bank & Trust Company, as Trustee, (the "Trustee") dated as of July 1, 1991 (the "Indenture"); and

WHEREAS, a public hearing is being conducted by the County on June 4, 1991 at 1:30 P.M. at the Board of County Commissioners meeting room, Sweetwater County Courthouse, Green River, Wyoming after public notice of such hearing was published at least 14 days prior to the meeting in a newspaper of general circulation within the County; and

WHEREAS, the County considers the issuance and sale of the Bonds in the amount and for the purpose hereinabove set forth will be appropriated and consistent with the objectives of the Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING THAT:

Section 1. To accomplish the purposes and objectives of the Act, to refinance the cost of the Project, Bond of the County are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$1,830,000. The Bonds shall be designated "Pollution Control Revenue Refunding Bonds (FMC Corporation Project) 1991 Series" shall be dated, shall bear interest at such rate of interest, shall be payable as to principal, interest and premium, if any, shall be issued in the form, shall mature, shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity and shall have such other details and provision as are prescribed by the Indenture.

Section 2. The Bonds shall be special obligations of the County, payable solely out of the revenues or other receipts, funds or moneys derived from the lease, sale or other disposition of the Project and pledged under the

Indenture. The payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on and purchase price of the Bonds shall be secured by a pledge and assignment of revenues and other property as provided in the Indenture.

Neither the members of the County nor any person executing the Bonds issued pursuant to this resolution and the Act shall be liable personally on the Bonds by reason of the issuance thereof. The Bonds shall not be in any way a debt or liability of the State of Wyoming or any political subdivision other than the County, either legal, moral or otherwise, and neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the State of Wyoming or any political subdivision thereof other than the County shall be pledged to the payment of the principal of, premium, if any, or interest thereon or the purchase price thereof.

Section 3. The Indenture, substantially in the form submitted at this meeting and made a part of this resolution as though set forth in full herein, hereby is approved. The execution and delivery of the Indenture between the County and the Trustee is hereby authorized. The Chairman or other authorized representative of the County is hereby authorized to execute, acknowledge and deliver the Indenture with any changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by the Chairman and the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the County is hereby authorized to affix the seal of the County on the Indenture and attest the same. The execution of the Indenture by said Chairman or other authorized representative shall be conclusive evidence of any approval required by this Section.

Section 4. A Third Amendatory Lease and Agreement, substantially in the form submitted at this meeting and made a part of this resolution as though set forth in full herein, hereby is approved. The execution and delivery of the Third Amendatory Lease and Agreement between the County and the Company is hereby authorized. The Chairman or other authorized representative of the County is hereby authorized to execute, acknowledge and deliver the Third Amendatory Lease and Agreement with any changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by the Chairman and the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the County is hereby authorized to affix the seal of the County on said Third Amendatory Lease and Agreement and attest the same. The execution of the Third Amendatory Lease and Agreement by said Chairman or other authorized representative shall be conclusive evidence of any approval required by this Section.

Section 5. Wachovia Bank of North Carolina, National Association (the "Placement Agent") is hereby designed as the Placement Agent in connection with the placement of the Bonds in accordance with the Placement Agreement referred to below. The Placement Agreement, substantially in the form submitted at this meeting and made a part of this resolution as though set forth in full herein, hereby is approved. The execution and delivery of the Placement Agreement among the County, the Placement Agent and the Company is hereby authorized. The Chairman or other authorized representative of the County is hereby authorized to execute, acknowledge and deliver the Placement Agreement with any changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by the Chairman and the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the County is hereby authorized to affix the seal of the County on said Placement Agreement and attest the same. The execution of the Placement Agreement by said Chairman or other authorized representative shall be conclusive evidence of any approval required by this Section.

Section 6. The distribution by the Placement Agent of a Preliminary Private Placement Memorandum and a Final Privates Placement Memorandum (in substantially the same form as the preliminary Private Placement Memorandum) (both hereinafter referred to as the "Private Placement Memorandum"), in form and substance consistent with this resolution, are hereby authorized and approved. The execution and delivery of the Placement Memoranda is hereby authorized. The Chairman or other authorized representative of the County is hereby authorized to execute, acknowledge and deliver the Placement Memoranda with any changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by the Chairman and the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the County is hereby authorized to affix the seal of the County on said Placement Memoranda and attest the same. The execution of the Placement Memoranda by said Chairman or other authorized representative shall be conclusive evidence of any approval required by this Section.

Section 7. The Chairman or any other authorized representative of the County, charged by this resolution with the responsibility for issuing the Bonds and each of them is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver any and all papers, instruments, opinions, certificates, affidavits and other documents and to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things necessary or proper for carrying out this resolution, the Third Amendatory Lease and Agreement, the Indenture, the Placement Agreement, the Placement Memoranda and the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 8. In case any one or more of the provision of this resolution, the Third Amendatory Lease and Agreement, the Indenture, the Placement Agreement, and Placement Memoranda or the Bonds issued hereunder shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision of the resolution, the Third Amendatory Lease and Agreement, the Indenture, the Placement Agreement, the Placement Memoranda and the Bonds shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provision had not been contained therein.

Section 9. The resolution shall take effect immediately.

William Klockenteger, P.E., Program Coordination Engineer with the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration, came before the Board to discuss the need of a "cooperator" in order to proceed with construction plans for a Forest Highway which is called the Eastside Flaming Gorge Highway. This planned roadway will be 44.4 miles from U.S. 191, 14 miles south of I-80 to U.S. 191 just north of Minnie's Gap. The jurisdiction would be 7.5 miles of the Forest Service, and 36.9 miles of Sweetwater County. As "cooperator" the County would be responsible for maintaining the route and acquiring any needed private right-of-ways. It was moved by Linda M. Taliaferro, seconded by Larry Caller and carried that the County as "cooperator" enter into an agreement with the Federal Highway Administrator.

It was moved by Linda M. Taliaferro, seconded by Larry Caller and carried that the Resolution 91-06-05-01 be approved as presented to vacate a portion of Main Street adjacent to Block 14 and executed a Quitclaim Deed to adjacent landowners, Orlando F. and Flavia Pineda.
