A motion was duly made by Larry Caller, seconded by Linda M. Taliaferro and carried that Church and Dwight Company, Inc. be awarded the bid for an I.B.M. S/36 computer system package in the amount of \$5,000.00

**R E S O L U T I O N**

**A RESOLUTION REQUIRING IDENTIFICATION TAGS TO BE PLACED ON ALL KEGS OF BEER SOLD WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF SWEETWATER COUNTY, WYOMING TO PERMIT KEGS TO BE TRACED IF THE CONTENTS ARE USE IN VIOLATION OF LAW:**

WHEREAS, the City of Green River, Wyoming and the City of Rock Springs, Wyoming have enacted ordinances requiring the identification of kegs sold within their respective municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the County of Sweetwater, State of Wyoming is empowered and authorized by Section 12-4-101, W.S. 1977, to license and regulate or prohibit the retail sale of malt beverages within said county; and

WHEREAS, the health, safety, welfare and interests of the citizens of Sweetwater County will be served by the enactment of a resolution requiring the identification of kegs sold within the unincorporated areas of Sweetwater County so that they may be traced if the contents are used in violation of law:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF SWEETWATER, STATE OF WYOMING THAT:

Section 1. Keg Identification Required.

All licensees operating within the unincorporated areas of the County of Sweetwater who sell keg beer for consumption off licensed premises shall place an identification tag onto all kegs of beer at the time of sale and require the signing of a receipt therefore by the purchaser in order to allow kegs to be traced if the contents are used in violation of the laws of the State of Wyoming. The keg identification shall be in the form of a numbered label prescribed and supplied by the Sweetwater County Sheriff which identifies the seller and which is removable or obliterated when the keg is processed for refilling. The receipt shall be on a form prescribed and supplied by the Sweetwater County Sheriff and shall include the name and address of the purchaser and such other information as may be required by the Sweetwater County Sheriff. All receipts shall be kept by licensee for a period of six (6) months and shall be subject to inspection by the Sweetwater County Sheriff or his agent when conducting an investigation.

Section 2. Definitions.

As used in Section 1:

a. "Keg" means any brewery-sealed, individual container of beer having a liquid capacity of seven and three-fourth (7 3/4) gallons of more.

b. "Licensees" means a person holding a retail liquor license, limited retail liquor license, county retail malt beverage permit.
