A public hearing was held regarding the proposed site for the new Youth Center facility. The site in question is located at Sweetwater Drive and Reagan Avenue in Rock Springs. Those speaking in favor of the facility were Fred Parady, Youth Home Board President, Greg Gillen, Green River Chief of Police, Donna Mattinson, Youth Home Director, Mike Bury-Wilder, Juvenile Probation Officer, Bernadine Craft, school counselor, and Ann Wise expressing parental support. Those expressing concerns with the location were Jack Smith, who was also representing several other landowners concerned with land values, Steve Horton, Rock Springs City Planner, and Tony Tarufelli, land developers who felt that with certain compromises, the location might be acceptable to them. Because the Youth Home is planning to use just 2 1/2 acres of a 10 acre lot to be sold by the B.L.M., additional problems existed which will require further decision by the Board.

It was moved by Linda M. Taliaferro, seconded by Larry Caller and carried that the following Resolution be adopted and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the application's accompanying letter:

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Farm Loan Board makes available financial assistance to political subdivisions of the State impacted by production of minerals; and

WHEREAS, street, road and highway improvements are eligible projects for Government Royalty Impact Assistance Grants from the Farm Loan Board; and

WHEREAS, there were compelling safety, economic and safety reasons to replace the "CCC" Bridge along the Lower Farson Cutoff Road, identified as County Road 4-8; and

WHEREAS, the cost estimate used for the Farm Loan Board application of in 1989 was based on replacing the oil 150' bridge at the same location; and

WHEREAS, the old bridge was an historic bridge and was listed on the national register of historic bridges and the bridge could not be quickly removed, necessitating an unanticipated wait of nearly one year for approval to remove the old

bridge; and

WHEREAS, the decision to located the bridge upstream from the old location called for a longer bridge and require two piers to be constructed in the river as well as having to obtain the soil samples from a barge rather than using the old bridge for a drill, all adding to the original estimated cost,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Sweetwater County Board of Commissioners hereby submits this application to the Wyoming Farm Loan Board for a Government Royalty Impact Assistance Grant for the difference in the amount of our first application (#MRG-823 Sw) and the projected amount, a total of \$81,324.48.
