Commissioner Comments/Reports

Commissioner Kolb

Commissioner Kolb reported that he attended the administration of the oath of office for District Court Judge Richard Lavery, the National High School Rodeo and the Sweetwater County Fair. Commissioner Kolb acknowledged the positive comments that he received from residents, vendors, competitors and their families during the National High School Rodeo. Commissioner Kolb explained that the National High School Rodeo committee implements the rules and seating capacity requirements that the Events Complex must comply with. Commissioner Kolb further reported that, when the National High School Rodeo statistics are compiled, he will provide them to the Board of County Commissioners. Commissioner Kolb announced his support for the re-election of Chairman Johnson and Commissioner Van Matre.

Commissioner Van Matre

Commissioner Van Matre reported that he attended the Governor's Reception for the National High School Rodeo and acknowledged Events Complex Director Larry Lloyd, staff and volunteers for a job well done on achieving the completion of the project in order to hold the event in Sweetwater County. Commissioner Van Matre further reported that he also attended the Sweetwater County Fair. Commissioner Van Matre explained that the VSO interviews were completed and the offer was made to the successful candidate and noted that he worked the VSO booth during the fair. He noted that he continues to work with Grants Manager Krisena Marchal and explained that she is working on procuring block grants for eight different programs that will assist low income families and that she has completed the preliminary schedule for the grants portion of the audit. Commissioner Van Matre reported that he attended the administration of the oath of office for District Court Judge Richard Lavery. Lastly, Commissioner Van Matre expressed his appreciation to Commissioner Kolb for his candidacy support.

Chairman Johnson

Chairman Johnson expressed that the National High School Rodeo was handled extremely well and he was impressed with the completion of the project. He requested that Commissioner Kolb obtain the statistics from the event and suggested that a questionnaire be given to the participants of the rodeo to provide feedback and suggestions for future events. Chairman Johnson reported that he attended the administration of the oath of office for District Court Judge Richard Lavery. Chairman Johnson discussed that, during the 6th cent process, the cities were all in agreement regarding the projects and dollar amount, but have since received negative feedback. He noted that he hopes the cities will reconsider because the projects outlined are to benefit Sweetwater County. Chairman Johnson acknowledged that Commissioner Van Matre has been an outstanding commissioner.

Commissioner West

Commissioner West reported that he attended the Governor's Reception and ribbon cutting ceremony for the National High School Rodeo and expressed his pleasure to Events Complex Director Larry Lloyd, staff and volunteers for a job well done on the completion and improvements made to the complex for the National High School Rodeo event. Commissioner West noted that he received many positive comments regarding the rodeo and improvements made to the events complex. He explained that he didn't personally feel the impact in the community that he anticipated and credited those involved with the transportation plan. Commissioner West stated that he looks forward to receiving the true statistics and the impact it made to the county. Commissioner West further reported that he attended the Memorial Hospital Board meeting and noted that the hospital budgeted \$17,000 for labor and advertising expenses for the first aid station for the National High School Rodeo and ended up spending less than \$12,000. He noted that Memorial Hospital had 55 volunteers, treated 46 people and that Sweetwater Medics had fewer than 10 ambulance transports during the National High School Rodeo. Commissioner West explained that Memorial Hospital of Sweetwater County has been working towards affiliation with the University of Utah. He noted that the hospital has ended their fiscal year in good financial state with a 7.14 percent operating margin. Commissioner West commented on the 6th cent process and noted that he is looking forward to the presentation from Senior Vice-President-Manager of Wyoming Public Finance Mary Keating-Scott of George K. Baum & Company and PC Barbara Bonds from Freudenthal & Bonds. Commissioner West noted that he attended the fair and received positive comments relative to the paved surfaces and vendors being able to be under the tents.

Commissioner Bailiff

Commissioner Bailiff reported that he stopped by Road and Bridge and the County Fire Department. He reported that County Fire Warden Dennis Washam has tendered his resignation as he will be retiring and requested that Human Resources place an advertisement for the position. Commissioner Bailiff further reported that he attended the National High School Rodeo and the Sweetwater County Fair and acknowledged the accomplishments made by all involved. Commissioner Bailiff reported that he attended the administration of the oath of office for District Court Judge Richard Lavery. Commissioner Bailiff explained that he has had ongoing discussion relative to Solid Waste District No. 2 and noted that, 3 months ago, there was a board vacancy that the commission was not made aware of. Chairman Johnson requested that Commissioner Bailiff contact the Solid Waste District No. 2 board to inquire about the vacancy. Commissioner Bailiff expressed his concern that the Rock Springs/Sweetwater County Airport budget was doubled from the prior year and requested further explanation. A discussion ensued relative

to the airport capital projects and revenue. Commissioner Kolb explained that he would meet with the Airport Board and their accountant and report back to the commission.

Commissioner Kolb questioned if the commission would like to retain a sound expert consultant, at the cost of \$2,000-5,000, to assist staff in compiling wind regulations. Following discussion, the commission agreed to allow the expenditure to assist in writing the regulations to protect the health and welfare of the residents.

County Resident Concerns

Chairman Johnson opened county resident concerns. Green River resident Mike Lynch expressed his opposition to the 6th cent projects and the possibility of bonding. Mr. Lynch further expressed his dissatisfaction regarding the overrun of taxes received for the Child Developmental Center. Chairman Johnson explained that ultimately the decision makers on the 6th cent projects are the voters of Sweetwater County. Chairman Johnson encouraged Mr. Lynch to stay for the upcoming presentation regarding potential bonding for the 6th cent project. Hearing no further comments, the hearing was closed.

Break

Chairman Johnson called for a five minute break.

Public Hearing

Proposed High Desert Rural Health Care District

County Clerk Dale Davis presented the map for the proposed High Desert Rural Healthcare District for the community of Wamsutter and noted that it is a public hearing. Commissioner West questioned if BP has provided support for the District. Board Member Emma Waldner explained that BP did not sign the petition but, rather, provided verbal support. Ms. Waldner and board member Sherry Lyons explained that BP Government & Public Affairs Director Chad Calvert contacted Wamsutter Community Development Director Lisa Colson and assured the board that they supported the Health Care District but did not recommend submitting the petition to BP headquarters as it would slow the process. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson opened the public hearing. Ms. Waldner extended her appreciation for the support received throughout the process of forming a proposed district and explained the importance of having a health care district in the community of Wamsutter. Ms. Lyons spoke that Bairoil is excited with the potential health care district and stressed the importance of the service not only for residents but for those traveling on Interstate 80. Wamsutter Clerk/Treasurer Susan Carnes expressed the importance of the formation of the Health Care District as employers of volunteer EMT's are no longer allowing the employees to leave when called out on an emergency. Hearing no further comments, the public hearing was closed. Commissioner Kolb requested that board members provide support, in writing, from BP. Commissioner West questioned who has been notified outside of what has been written in the newspaper, during the process of the proposed High Desert Rural Health Care District. County Clerk Dale Davis explained that it has been advertised in the newspaper and public notice has been displayed at the Wamsutter Town Hall and also in the Clerk's office.

Action/Presentation Items

Approval of Mill Levies for Tax Year 2012

County Assessor Pat Drinkle presented the mill levies for tax year 2012. A discussion ensued regarding the resolution to provide income necessary to finance the budget, as it listed tax requirement amounts which included monies other than the current tax. Ms. Drinkle explained that the tax mill levy listed on the resolution was calculated based on the certified property tax value breakdown of the certified property tax value and the motor vehicle fees. Commissioner West clarified that, in the past, the component units and county received additional monies from the treasurer's office for the motor vehicle fees. He added that, because it was computed this year to be included in the resolution, in the future they will not receive additional monies. Ms. Drinkle confirmed the statement by Commissioner West. Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to have the mill levy worksheet approved and have the commission sign as presented. *Commissioner Kolb made the motion. Commissioner West seconded the motion.* With no discussion the motion was approved unanimously.

Chairman Johnson acknowledged that commission candidate Jim Jessen was present.

Presentation Regarding Potential Bonding for the 6th Cent Projects

Freudenthal and Bonds PC Barbara Bonds, George K. Baum & Company Senior Vice-President Mary Keating-Scott, Assistant Vice President Paul Taylor and County Treasurer Robb Slaughter were present to update the commission on the proposed Sweetwater County specific purpose sales and use tax. Ms. Bonds explained that she was contacted to compile the master resolution for the special purpose tax election in November and to put together the appropriate documents for each of the communities. Ms. Bonds explained that she has contacted each of the communities and has compiled a list and noted that information from Wamsutter, Granger and the county sponsored waterline is missing. Ms. Bonds explained that she has a resolution prepared and just has to place the missing information and final numbers into the document. Ms. Bonds indicated that the statutory timeline required for approval of the specific resolutions is August 27, 2012 (the 4th Monday in August). The commission agreed to advise the communities that they must provide the appropriate information to Ms. Bonds in a timely manner or the commission will consider removing their projects from the ballot. A lengthy discussion ensued relative to bonding projects. The commission requested that Public Works Director John Radosевич obtain detailed information from the City of Green River and Rio Vista & Sewer District Vice Chairman Kael Jaspersen regarding the waterline and provide it to Ms. Bonds in a timely manner. Ms. Keating-Scott presented preliminary numbers based upon a five year history of the general purpose tax revenue for Sweetwater

County in order to analyze the rating and interest expenses. Attorney George Lemich was present to explain the advantages of bonding. Chairman Johnson proposed bonding all of the projects. Following a lengthy discussion regarding the final cost of bonding, Chairman Johnson called for a five minute break. Following the break, Ms. Keating-Scott explained that the fees associated with bonding all of the projects are estimated at approximately \$14 million and are based upon the worst case scenario. Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to indicate that it is the commissions intent to bond the entire \$82.4 million as estimated by exhibits shown today by Mary Keating-Scott. *Commissioner West moved to proceed with bonding the projects in their entirety. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* Following further discussion, Commissioner Kolb spoke that he would support having the options presented to the voters to bond or not bond. The motion was approved with Commissioner Kolb voting nay.

Request to Advertise and Fill Vacancy in the Treasurer's Office

County Treasurer Robb Slaughter requested to advertise and fill an upcoming vacancy due to the recent resignation of a staff member. Following discussion of the job duties, Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to authorize the County Treasurer to replace the position. *Commissioner West so moved. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved with Commissioner Kolb voting nay.

Mr. Slaughter requested clarification as to where to deposit the payment received from Verizon Wireless in the amount of \$14,400 for towers located at the Sweetwater County Events Complex. The commission concurred that the check should be deposited into the county's general fund.

Request the Approval of the Business Ready Community Grant Agreement for a Workforce Training Facility at Western Wyoming Community College

Grants Manager Krisena Marchal presented the Business Ready Community Grant Agreement for a Workforce Training Facility at WWCC. Commissioner West commended Ms. Marchal for her high-quality work in assisting the college with the grant and explained that the college was very grateful and spoke very highly of her. Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to approve, and have the Chairman sign, the Business Ready Community Grant Agreement for a Workforce Training Facility at WWCC. *Commissioner Kolb so moved. Commissioner West seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

An Agreement with Natrona County to Provide Juvenile Detention Services for Sweetwater County
Sheriff Haskell presented an Agreement with Natrona County to Provide Juvenile Detention Services for Sweetwater County and acknowledged that he does not see any reason to sign the agreement as he does not foresee sending juveniles to Natrona County. The commission expressed their appreciation to Sheriff Haskell for bringing the agreement before the board and explaining why he does not wish to proceed.

Executive Session(s)-/Legal

Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to enter into executive session for personnel. *Commissioner West so moved. Commissioner Kolb seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously. A quorum of the commission was present.

After coming out of executive session, Chairman Johnson acknowledged that no decision will need to be made.

Lunch

Chairman Johnson recessed the meeting for lunch. After the lunch break, Chairman Johnson opened the afternoon session.

Other

Chairman Johnson questioned if the commission would accept expending the full budgeted amount of \$721,000 to the Combined Dispatch Communication Center at the request of Rock Springs Chief Mike Lowell. Following discussion, the commission concurred to disburse on a quarterly basis.

Planning & Zoning- Public Hearing

Shanna Newton- Home Occupation Permit, Type III Cute & Curly Pet Grooming and Boarding

Planner John Barton provided the Planning & Zoning report for Resolution 12-08-ZO-02, Shanna Newton-Home Occupation Permit, Type III Cute & Curly Dog Grooming and Dog and Cat Boarding. Owner Shanna Newton was present. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson opened the public hearing. Reliance resident Darold Pekas was present to provide support. Hearing no further comments, the public hearing was closed. Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to approve Resolution 12-08-ZO-02, Shanna Newton- Home Occupation Permit, Type III Cute & Curly Dog Grooming and Dog and Cat Boarding. *Commissioner Bailiff so moved. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* Commissioner Kolb requested to modify the motion to include that the property be subject to fire inspection every 5 years. *Commissioner Kolb made a motion to amend. Commissioner Bailiff seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the amended motion was approved after a roll call vote with Chairman Johnson and Commissioner West opposing. Chairman Johnson requested a vote on the resolution as amended. The amended resolution was approved unanimously.
