Commissioner Comments/Reports

Commissioner Bailiff

Commissioner Bailiff reported that he has been working with Solid Waste Disposal District No. 2 and noted that a board appointment will be made later in the day. Commissioner Bailiff reported that he attended the Parks and Recreation Board meeting and explained that a board member was upset about the money spent at the events complex, particularly the campground sites. Commissioner Bailiff further reported that he and Commissioner Van Matre attended the Volunteers of America meeting relative to implementing best practice methods of working with youth in the Juvenile Justice system by supporting a diversion program for low risk juveniles. Lastly, Commissioner Bailiff explained that he will attend the State Emergency Response Commission meeting on September 6-7, 2012.

Commissioner West

Commissioner West reported that he attended the Board of Health meeting. Commissioner West explained that the state contract for South West Counseling continues to be a concern and noted that he attended the luncheon for Southwest Counseling's 50th year in business. Commissioner West explained that the audit for Memorial Hospital of Sweetwater County is complete and the board will vote on the audit during their September 5, 2012 meeting. Commissioner West noted that he met with Deputy County Attorneys John Prokos and Cliff Beavers relative to ambulance services and questioned whether the Wyoming State Statutes authorize the creation of an ambulance district. Commissioner West explained that, once the legal aspects are reviewed, they will be able to determine the course of action required.

Chairman Johnson

Chairman Johnson reported that he attended the Coalition of Local Government meeting in Kemmerer and expressed his disappointment that Sublette County Commissioner John Linn was defeated in the election. Chairman Johnson reported that he attended a meeting in Cheyenne to discuss Wyoming Wilderness Study Areas (WSAs) and explained that presentations were made by individuals from Utah and Idaho who have experience in getting WSAs released. Chairman Johnson explained that there are forty-two wilderness study areas in Wyoming with thirteen of those studies in Sweetwater County. He noted that, in addition to those study areas, there are nine areas within Sweetwater County that have been identified as areas with wilderness characteristics. Chairman Johnson questioned how much area that Sweetwater County can afford being tied up and explained that mineral development becomes curtailed within these areas. Chairman Johnson explained that he continues to spend a great portion of time studying the issues as wilderness study areas are a convoluted process.

Chairman Johnson expressed his desire to appoint Commissioner West as the commission liaison for 6th cent issues. The commission concurred.

Chairman Johnson explained that the September 18, 2012 Board of County Commissioner meeting will need to be cancelled due to the Wyoming Association of County Officers Convention. Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to approve Resolution 12-09-CC-01. ***Commissioner Kolb made the motion to approve Resolution 12-09-CC-01. Commissioner Bailiff seconded the motion.*** With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

A request was made to hold a special meeting on September 6, 2012 at 5:00 p.m. to take action on the Rural Health District for Wamsutter. The direction of action will allow the county clerk's department to start the proceeds for election. Commissioner Bailiff noted that he would not be present due to attending the State Emergency Response Commission meeting in Lander, Wy. Chairman Johnson requested that an advertisement be submitted to the Rocket Miner.

Commissioner Van Matre

Commissioner Van Matre reported that he attended the SW Wrap meeting and noted that they are trying to eliminate duplication of services and identify objectives and goals while facing funding challenges. Commissioner Van Matre further reported that he, along with Commissioner Bailiff, attended the Volunteers of America meeting relative to implementing best practice methods of working with youth in the Juvenile Justice system by supporting a diversion program for low risk juveniles. Commissioner Van Matre explained that IT hardware and software upgrades continue and that Grants Manager Krisena Marchal continues to assist with the audit.

Commissioner Kolb

Commissioner Kolb reported that he attended the Events Complex meeting and was able to meet with the promoter of the horse races regarding safety concerns. He expressed his pleasure that the concerns were addressed and taken care of. Accounting Manager Bonnie Phillips presented the FY 2013 Human Service Agreements and Salary Contribution to include the Boys and Girls Club of Sweetwater County, Castle Rock Hospital District, Golden Hour Senior Citizen's Center, Hospice of Sweetwater County, Western Wyoming Family Planning, Young at Heart Senior Citizen's Center - Amended, and the Salary Contribution for SWC University Extension Educator/4-H and 4-H Clerical. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to approve the Agreements for FY 2013 as presented by Bonnie Phillips. *Commissioner West so moved. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

Request the Approval of the "Certificate of Completion of Installation" for the 2011 ARRA Energy Retrofit Grant

Due to being ahead of schedule, Chairman Johnson requested to move the "Certificate of Completion of Installation" for the 2011 ARRA Energy Retrofit Grant ahead of the Wildlife Hazard Assessment Grant. The Sheriff then requested that the remaining detention vacancy be used to hire a part-time custodian, to assist with cleaning the jail, and to also promote a part-time Food Service Worker to full-time. Sheriff Haskell explained that with the proposed changes, it results in an annual savings of \$44,000.00. Following discussion, *Commissioner Bailiff moved to grant the request. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

Acceptance of Subdivision Roads in Area 33 Estates Subdivision

Public Works Director John Radosevich presented Resolution 12-09-EN-01, Area Thirty3 Estates Subdivision final acceptance of subdivision road improvements. Following discussion regarding the possibility of the city annexing the area and growth management area requirements, *Commissioner Bailiff moved to accept Resolution 12-09-EN-01 and give the board permission to sign the resolution. Commissioner Kolb seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.
