**Commissioner Comments/Reports**

**Commissioner Bailiff**

Commissioner Bailiff reported that he has been working with Solid Waste Disposal District No. 2 and noted that a board appointment will be made later in the day. Commissioner Bailiff reported that he attended the Parks and Recreation Board meeting and explained that a board member was upset about the money spent at the events complex, particularly the campground sites. Commissioner Bailiff further reported that he and Commissioner Van Matre attended the Volunteers of America meeting relative to implementing best practice methods of working with youth in the Juvenile Justice system by supporting a diversion program for low risk juveniles. Lastly, Commissioner Bailiff explained that he will attend the State Emergency Response Commission meeting on September 6-7, 2012.

**Commissioner West**

Commissioner West reported that he attended the Board of Health meeting. Commissioner West explained that the state contract for South West Counseling continues to be a concern and noted that he attended the luncheon for Southwest Counseling's 50<sup>th</sup> year in business. Commissioner West explained that the audit for Memorial Hospital of Sweetwater County is complete and the board will vote on the audit during their September 5, 2012 meeting. Commissioner West noted that he met with Deputy County Attorneys John Prokos and Cliff Beavers relative to ambulance services and questioned whether the Wyoming State Statutes authorize the creation of an ambulance district. Commissioner West explained that, once the legal aspects are reviewed, they will be able to determine the course of action required.

**Chairman Johnson**

Chairman Johnson reported that he attended the Coalition of Local Government meeting in Kemmerer and expressed his disappointment that Sublette County Commissioner John Linn was defeated in the election. Chairman Johnson reported that he attended a meeting in Cheyenne to discuss Wyoming Wilderness Study Areas (WSAs) and explained that presentations were made by individuals from Utah and Idaho who have experience in getting WSAs released. Chairman Johnson explained that there are forty-two wilderness study areas in Wyoming with thirteen of those studies in Sweetwater County. He noted that, in addition to those study areas, there are nine areas within Sweetwater County that have been identified as areas with wilderness characteristics. Chairman Johnson questioned how much area that Sweetwater County can afford being tied up and explained that mineral development becomes curtailed within these areas. Chairman Johnson explained that he continues to spend a great portion of time studying the issues as wilderness study areas are a convoluted process.

Chairman Johnson expressed his desire to appoint Commissioner West as the commission liaison for 6<sup>th</sup> cent issues. The commission concurred.

Chairman Johnson explained that the September 18, 2012 Board of County Commissioner meeting will need to be cancelled due to the Wyoming Association of County Officers Convention. Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to approve Resolution 12-09-CC-01. *Commissioner Kolb made the motion to approve Resolution 12-09-CC-01. **Commissioner Van Matre**







**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR  
SWEETWATER COUNTY, AND THE YOUTH HOME INC.**

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into by and between the County of Sweetwater, Wyoming, 80 West Flaming Gorge Way, Green River, Wyoming, 82935-4250, and Youth Home Inc., P.O. Box 2263, Rock Springs, Wyoming 82902-2263.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners for Sweetwater County, Wyoming, hereinafter "THE COUNTY," has preliminarily budgeted funds to provide for certain services to the residents of Sweetwater County, Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, the Youth Home Inc., hereinafter "YOUTH HOME", is willing, able and capable of providing the services herein specified to the citizens of Sweetwater County, Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, THE COUNTY has determined that it is in the best interests of the citizens of Sweetwater County that it enter into an agreement with YOUTH HOME to furnish services to the citizens of Sweetwater County, Wyoming;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Term. The term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.
2. Services. YOUTH HOME agrees to make available facilities and staff for the purpose of sheltering troubled youth in Sweetwater County, troubled youth with behavioral problems and troubled youth with significant risk of immediate contact with juvenile justice systems. YOUTH HOME retains the right to reject any youth who is inappropriate for placement as outlined in its Admissions Policy. Services to residents in Sweetwater County include:
  - a. Long-Term Care Program: Community-based residential group care designed to provide a physically and emotionally healthy atmosphere where the problems of troubled youth and their families can be decreased. Care includes, but is not limited to, proper shelter, nutrition, screening, and counseling in a home environment.
  - b. Crisis Program: Placement of youths in YOUTH HOME'S facilities up to a period of thirty (30) days per child for emergency and crisis care when authorized pursuant to law.
3. Funding. THE COUNTY has budgeted, appropriated, or otherwise made available up to a maximum amount of \$201,000.00 for YOUTH HOME expenses in providing the services identified in this Agreement. THE COUNTY'S total liability shall not exceed said amount.

The payment of all amounts hereunder is subject to final approval of the preliminarily budgeted amount, the availability of County funds and to YOUTH HOME'S compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

4. Payments. The parties hereto mutually agree that YOUTH HOME shall submit vouchers, with supporting invoices and receipts attached, to THE COUNTY on or before the 25th day of each month during the contract term for review, approval and payment by THE COUNTY.

5. Responsibilities of YOUTH HOME: YOUTH HOME shall:

- a. Use the budgeted, allocated and appropriated funds only to provide the services specified herein.
- b. Insure that the staff hired by YOUTH HOME is qualified.
- c. Insure that a good and sufficient fidelity bond covers all personnel handling money.
- d. Insure that no eligible person is denied services contracted for by THE COUNTY because of that person's inability to pay for such services.
- e. Insure that no person shall be discriminated against in employment, or be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of any activity funded in whole or in part with the funds made available under this Agreement on the grounds of race, color, national origin, age, sex, handicap or disability.
- f. Maintain detailed minutes of all YOUTH HOME board meetings. The minutes shall include a list of all checks issued and their correct amounts, except for checks identifying individual clients which may be consolidated so that individual clients cannot be identified. The minutes shall be made available for public inspection during regular business hours. The minutes shall comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations concerning confidentiality of client records. YOUTH HOME may use executive sessions for the discussion of personnel or client matters where permitted by applicable law.
- g. Allow THE COUNTY to examine YOUTH HOME'S financial records at any time.
- h. Insure that a certified public accountant will conduct an annual independent

financial and compliance audit and provide THE COUNTY with a copy of the audit.

i. Comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations applicable to YOUTH HOME with respect to the services provided pursuant to this Agreement.

j. Provide regular reports to THE COUNTY concerning the services provided and the funds expended pursuant to this Agreement.

6. County Responsibilities: THE COUNTY shall:

a. Consult with and advise YOUTH HOME as necessary with respect to the completion of YOUTH HOME responsibilities under this Agreement.

b. Make regular payments to YOUTH HOME based on vouchers received from YOUTH HOME, up to the total maximum amounts allocated pursuant to this Agreement, subject to the budgeting, allocation and availability of funds and to YOUTH HOME'S compliance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

7. Indemnification. YOUTH HOME shall indemnify and hold harmless the THE COUNTY, its officials, officers, agents and employees from and against any and all liabilities, claims and demands and causes of action of any kind or character, including death, or damages of any nature whatsoever to any person or property, arising out of the acts or omissions of YOUTH HOME, its officers, agents, employees or other persons, in the performance or non-performance of this Agreement. 10. Assignment. YOUTH HOME may not assign this Agreement, or its rights, duties or obligations therein, without the prior written consent of THE COUNTY, which consent will not be withheld unreasonable.

11. Termination. This Agreement may be terminated by either party, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notification to the other party and subject to the settlement of all outstanding accounts within thirty (30) days of the date of termination.

13. General Provisions.

- a. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations. The parties acknowledge that there are no other agreements that have not been fully set forth herein.
- b. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by the prior written consent of both parties.

11. Termination. This Agreement may be terminated by either party, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notification to the other party and subject to the settlement of all outstanding accounts within thirty (30) days of the date of termination.
12. General Provisions.
  - a. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations. The parties acknowledge that there are no other agreements that have not been fully set forth herein.
  - b. This Agreement may be amended or modified only by the prior written consent of both parties.
  - c. If any provision or portion of this Agreement is held unconstitutional, invalid or otherwise unenforceable, THE COUNTY shall have the right at its sole option to

declare the Agreement void and enter into negotiations with FOOD BANK for a new Agreement.

d. Headings used in this Agreement are provided for the convenience of the parties and shall not be deemed or construed to affect the substance of the Agreement.

e. Failure by either party to enforce the terms of this Agreement shall not operate as a waiver of any future enforcement.

f. Notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall be delivered personally or deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, to the following addresses:

## ENHANCED AIR SERVICE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

This agreement is entered into by and between SWEETWATER COUNTY, hereinafter referred to as "County", whose address is 80 West Flaming Gorge Way, Suite 150, Green River, WY 82935, CITY OF GREEN RIVER, a Wyoming Municipal Corporation whose address is 50 East 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Green River, WY 82935, and CITY OF ROCK SPRINGS, a Wyoming Municipal Corporation whose address is 212 D Street, Rock Springs, WY 82901, collectively referred to as "Co-Sponsors".

### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto understand and agree that enhanced air service at the Rock Springs Airport as provided by Wyoming Statute provides a benefit and advantage to the Co-sponsors, the traveling public, and the citizens of the Rock Springs, Green River, and Sweetwater County; and,

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto understand and agree that each of them bears responsibility for providing the funding necessary to perpetuate the program.

NOW, THEREFORE, in support of their mutual covenants and the exchange of consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

#### I. The Program

The program will consist of enhanced service through SkyWest Airlines from Rock Springs, Wyoming to Salt Lake City, Utah. The level of service is to provide no less than two frequencies per day scheduled to optimize the bank time to Delta Airlines in Salt Lake City, Utah. SkyWest Airlines will provide service with the Brasilia, 30-passenger aircraft. The service will be provided from January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. The parties agree that the Co-Sponsors and the traveling public shall derive a benefit and advantage by reason of having contracted under this cooperative agreement.

#### II. Terms of Agreement

The purpose of this Agreement is to provide for the funding of air service enhancement, as defined in Wyo. Stat. Ann. § 10-3-601 et seq., from Salt Lake City, Utah to Rock Springs, Wyoming. By contract between Sweetwater County and the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT), WYDOT has represented that SkyWest Airlines has assured that there shall be scheduled air service instituted and continued between Rock Springs, Wyoming (RKS) and Salt Lake City, Utah (SLC), (the "Service") for 1 year ("Service Period"). Said contract between Sweetwater County and the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT) is attached hereto as "EXHIBIT A" and is specifically incorporated herein by reference.

### III. Responsibilities of Co-Sponsors during the Service Period.

Monthly invoices will be received by the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT) and County from SkyWest Airlines with a daily summary of load factors, number of revenue and non-revenue passengers using the service, flight completion information, on time performance, and all other relevant data concerning flight operations for the Service. At the end of each quarter an invoice will be sent to WYDOT. WYDOT will review and approve invoices prior to invoices being submitted to the County. The County will then provide this invoice to the Co-Sponsors. Co-Sponsors shall pay full amount due to the County within 30 days of the submission of the invoice.

### IV. Reimbursement

SkyWest Airlines completes its accounting for each month approximately two to three weeks after the close of the month. Soon after this occurs, a statement shall be sent to WYDOT and the County which shall show the final revenues and actual costs for the preceding month. The statement will show all calculations for the subsidy, including a 5% margin on costs. Each quarter will be trued up and summarized with all costs and revenues in the invoice. At the end of this Agreement, SkyWest shall prepare a report to the County showing total revenues, costs, and margin for the 1 year term of this Agreement. The County shall provide this report to the Co-Sponsors. County shall be responsible for payment of Eighteen Percent (18.86923%) of the total monthly subsidy submitted each quarter, with a total maximum exposure of Three Hundred Eight Thousand Three Hundred Ninety-one Dollars (\$308,391.00). The Co-Sponsors hereby agree to reimburse the County for their proportionate shares of the total monthly subsidy based on the airline revenue for that quarter, less previous payments, as set forth below, within thirty days after billing. Invoices will be submitted to each Co-Sponsor with calculations already completed and totals due to the County. The percentages set forth below shall reflect that portion of the total invoice for which each Co-Sponsor is responsible. Billing will occur at the completion of each quarter, unless otherwise agreed upon between the parties. Co-Sponsors shall pay as follows:

- A. The City of Rock Springs shall pay Thirty-three Percent (33%) of the total quarterly invoice. The maximum exposure for the City of Rock Springs for the 1 year contract shall be no more than One Hundred One Thousand Seven Hundred Sixty-nine and 00/100 Dollars (\$101,769.00);
- B. The City of Green River shall pay Twenty-two Percent (22%) of the total quarterly invoice. The maximum exposure for the 1 year contract shall be no more than Sixty-seven Thousand Eight Hundred Forty-seven and 00/100 Dollars (\$67,847.00).
- C. County shall be responsible for the remaining Forty-five Percent (45%) of the total quarterly invoice.

## V. General Provisions

- A. To the extent required by any state or federal law, the Co-Sponsors shall be bound as though they were a "Sponsor" by the terms of the agreement between County and WYDOT, attached hereto as "EXHIBIT A" as though the provisions regarding "Americans with Disabilities", "Non-discrimination" and "Kickbacks" were fully set forth herein.
- B. Any party may request changes in this Agreement. Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this Agreement which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this Agreement shall be incorporated by written instrument, executed and signed by all parties to this Agreement.
- C. The County and Co-Sponsors shall provide free access to any pertinent books, documents and papers to each other, the State of Wyoming, the Federal Grantor Agency, the Comptroller General of the United States, the United States Department of Labor, or any of their duly authorized representatives for the purpose of inspection, audit and copying. The parties hereto shall keep copies of these records for at least three years after final payment and settlement.
- D. The Parties hereto shall keep informed of and comply with all applicable Federal, State, and Local laws and regulations in the performance of this Agreement.
- E. This agreement, consisting of four pages and an "EXHIBIT A", represents the entire and integrated Agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations and agreements, whether written or oral.
- F. Each party is responsible for its own acts and omissions and the result thereof to the extent provided by law.
- G. All notices arising out of, or from, the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and given to the parties at the address provided under this Agreement, either by regular mail or delivery in person.
- H. Should any portion of this Agreement be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.
- I. The parties hereto do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary, and this Agreement shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Agreement shall operate only between the parties to this Agreement and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement. The provisions of this Agreement are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this Agreement.

J. The terms of this Agreement, and any amendments thereto, shall be binding upon and inure to the parties hereto, their administrators and successors.

IN WITNESS HEREOF, the parties to this Agreement, either personally by and through their duly authorized representatives, have executed this Agreement on the day and date set forth below and certify that they have read, understood, and agreed to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

1. **Parties.** The parties to this agreement are the WYOMING DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, hereinafter referred to as "WYDOT", whose address is 5300 Bishop Blvd., Cheyenne, WY 82009 and the SWEETWATER COUNTY COMMISSION, hereinafter referred to as "Sponsor," whose address is 80 West Flaming Gorge Way, Suite 109, Green River, WY 82935.
2. **Purpose.** The Sponsor desires to participate in the Air Service Enhancement Program administered by WYDOT. This Program will consist of enhanced service through SkyWest Airlines from Rock Springs, Wyoming to the Salt Lake City hub. The level of service will provide two round trips per day scheduled to optimize bank times to Delta Airlines at Salt Lake City, Utah. SkyWest Airlines will provide service with the EMB 120 and 30 seats. The service will be provided January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. WYDOT, the Sponsor, and the traveling public shall derive a benefit and advantage by reason of having contracted under this Air Service Enhancement Program.
3. **Terms of Agreement.** The purpose of this Agreement is to provide air service enhancement, as defined in Wyo. Stat. Ann. §10-3-601 et seq., from Salt Lake City, Utah to Rock Springs, Wyoming. SkyWest Airlines will assure, by contract, that there is scheduled air service instituted and continued between Rock Springs, Wyoming (RKS) and Salt Lake City, Airport (SLC), (referred to as the "Service") for 12 months ("Service Period").
4. **Responsibilities of the Sponsor during the Service Period.** Monthly statements and quarterly invoices will be received by WYDOT and the Sponsor from SkyWest Airlines with a summary of load factors, number of revenue and non-revenue passengers using the service, flight completion information, on time performance, and all other relevant data concerning flight operations for the Service. WYDOT will review invoices and send payment to the Sponsor. The Sponsor will pay full amount to SkyWest Airlines within 15 days of receipt of payment from WYDOT.
5. **Reimbursement.** SkyWest Airlines completes its accounting for each month approximately two to three weeks after the close of the month. Soon after this occurs, a statement will be sent to WYDOT and the Sponsor which shall show the final revenues and actual costs for the preceding calendar month. The statement will show all calculations supporting the total, including a 5% margin on costs. Total costs are the sum of non-fuel costs and fuel costs. Non-fuel costs shall be calculated by multiplying the block hours associated with the market by the following cost per hourly rate of One Thousand, Four Hundred and Seventy One Dollars (\$1,471) for the EMB 120 block

hours operated January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. The rate includes the 5% profit margin and all non-fuel costs. In addition, the rate reduction reflects an on-going discount for SkyWest performing the ground handling in Rock Springs. Each quarter the amounts will be trued up and summarized with the total costs (non-fuel and fuel costs) and revenues in an invoice. To the extent the Sponsor owes SkyWest Airlines a payment for such quarter it shall pay to SkyWest Airlines, within 15 days of its receipt of payment from WYDOT, the full amount owed. Sponsor agrees to pay Eighteen and Eight Six Nine Two Three percent (18.86923%) of the total monthly payment submitted each quarter with a maximum exposure of Three Hundred Eight Thousand, Three Hundred and Ninety Dollars (\$308,390) for the 12-month term. To the extent SkyWest Airlines' revenues for such calendar month were greater than the actual costs plus margin for the month, WYDOT and the Sponsor shall have no monthly payment obligation to SkyWest Airlines for such month or partial month as the case may be. At the end of the term of this Agreement, SkyWest shall prepare a report to the Sponsor showing total revenues, costs, and margin for the 12-month term of the Agreement. In no event shall WYDOT and the Sponsor be obligated to pay SkyWest Airlines an aggregate amount in excess of One Million, Six Hundred Thirty Four Thousand, Three Hundred and Fifty Six Dollars (\$1,634,356). Assuming all criteria above are met, WYDOT's financial commitment to this service, through the Sponsor, shall be Eighty One and Three Zero Seven Seven percent (81.13077%) of the total payment submitted each quarter with a maximum exposure of One Million, Three Hundred Twenty Five Thousand, Nine Hundred and Sixty Six Dollars (\$1,325,966). Exhibit A shows the forecasted monthly revenue payment. The individual monthly amount is not considered a monthly cap on payment, just a representation of how the cost-not-to-exceed amount of \$1,634,356 was derived.

6. **Default.** If the Sponsor fails to pay any amount herein provided when the same shall become due and payable, WYDOT may terminate this Agreement as to any or all items and any other remedy at law or in equity. Notwithstanding any such action, the Sponsor shall remain liable for the full performance of all obligations on its part to be performed under this Agreement.

7. **General Provisions:**

- a. **Amendments.** Either party may request changes in this Agreement. Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this Agreement which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this Agreement shall be incorporated by written instrument, executed and signed by all parties to this Agreement.
- b. **Americans with Disabilities Act.** The Sponsor shall not discriminate against a qualified individual with a disability and shall comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act, P.L. 101-336, 42 U.S.C. 12101, *et seq.*, and/or any properly promulgated rules and regulations related thereto.
- c. **Applicable Law and Venue.** The construction, interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wyoming. The Courts of the State of Wyoming shall have jurisdiction over this Agreement and

the parties, and the venue shall be in the First Judicial District, Laramie County, Wyoming.

- d. **Assignment/Agreement Not Used as Collateral.** Neither party shall assign nor otherwise transfer any of the rights or delegate any of the duties set forth in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.
- e. **Audit/Access to Records.** The Sponsor shall provide free access to any pertinent, books, documents, and papers to the State of Wyoming, the Federal Grantor Agency, the Comptroller General of the United States, the United States Department of Labor, or any of their duly authorized representatives for the purpose of inspection, audit and copying. The Sponsor shall provide proper facilities for such access and inspection. The Sponsor shall keep copies of these records for at least three years after final payment and settlement.
- f. **Availability of Funds.** Each payment obligation of WYDOT is conditioned upon the availability of government funds which are appropriated or allocated for the payment of this obligation. If funds are not allocated and available for the continuance of the services, this Agreement may be terminated by WYDOT at the end of the period for which the funds are available. WYDOT will notify the Sponsor at the earliest possible time of the services which will or may be affected by a shortage of funds. No penalty shall accrue to WYDOT in the event this provision is exercised, and WYDOT will not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this section. This provision shall not be construed to permit WYDOT to terminate this Agreement in order to acquire similar services from another party.
- g. **Compliance with Law.** The Sponsor shall keep informed of and comply with all applicable, Federal, State and Local laws and regulations in the performance of this Agreement.
- h. **Entirety of Agreement.** This Agreement, consisting of five pages, represents the entire and integrated Agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations and agreements, whether written or oral.
- i. **Indemnification.** Each party is responsible for its own acts and omissions and the result thereof to the extent provided by law. The liability of state agencies and state governmental entities is governed by Wyo. Stat. 1-39-101, *et seq.*
- j. **Kickbacks:**

- (i.) The Sponsor shall comply with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (18 U.S.C. 874) as supplemented in the Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR, Part 3). This Act provides that the Sponsor are prohibited from inducing by any means, any person employed in the construction, completion, or repair of public work, to give up any part of the compensation to which he is otherwise entitled.

- (ii.) The Sponsor certifies and warrants that no gratuities, kickbacks or contingency fees were paid in connection with this Agreement, nor were any fees, commissions, gifts, or other considerations made contingent upon the award of this Agreement.
  - (iii.) No staff member of the Sponsor shall engage in any contract or activity which would constitute a conflict of interest as related to this Agreement.
  - (iv.) If the Sponsor breach or violate this warranty, WYDOT may, at its discretion, terminate this Agreement without liability to WYDOT, or deduct from the agreement price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of any commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingency fee.
- k. **Nondiscrimination.** The Sponsor shall comply with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Wyoming Fair Employment Practices Act (Wyo. Stat. 27-9-105, *et seq.*), the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), 42 U.S.C. 12101, *et seq.*, and the Age Discrimination Act of 1975. The Sponsor shall not discriminate against any individual on the grounds of age, sex, color, race, religion, national origin or disability in connection with the performance of this Agreement.
- l. **Notices.** All notices arising out of, or from, the provisions of this Agreement shall be in writing and given to the parties at the address provided under this Agreement, either by regular mail or delivery in person.
- m. **Prior Approval.** This Agreement shall not be binding upon either party unless this Agreement is approved as to form by the Attorney General or his representative.
- n. **Severability.** Should any portion of this Agreement be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.
- o. **Sovereign Immunity.** The State of Wyoming and WYDOT do not waive sovereign immunity by entering into this Agreement, and specifically retains all immunities and defenses available to them as sovereigns pursuant to Wyo. Stat. 1-39-101, *et seq.*, and all other state law. Designations of venue, choice of law, enforcement actions and similar provisions should not be construed as waiver of sovereign immunity. The parties agree that any ambiguity in this Agreement shall not be strictly construed, either against or for either party, except that any ambiguity as to sovereign immunity shall be construed in favor of sovereign immunity.

- p. **Third Party Beneficiary Rights.** The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary, and this Agreement shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Agreement shall operate only between the parties to this Agreement and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement. The provisions of this Agreement are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this Agreement.
  
- q. **Independent Contractor.** The Sponsor is an independent contractor for the purpose of this Contract, and shall not be considered an employee of the State of Wyoming for any purpose. The Sponsor shall assume sole responsibility for any debts or liabilities incurred by the Sponsor in fulfilling the terms of this Contract, and shall be solely responsible for the payment of all federal, state and local taxes which may accrue because of this Contract. ## SWEETWATER COUNTY-SKYWEST REVENUE AGREEMENT

THIS SWEETWATER COUNTY-SKYWEST REVENUE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") made and entered into as of the \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2012, by and between SkyWest Airlines, Inc., ("SkyWest Airlines") and the Sweetwater County Commission ("County").

### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, SkyWest Airlines is a regional air transportation carrier serving the United States and Canada and will operate this service as Delta Connection, a code-share partner with Delta Airlines

WHEREAS, SkyWest Airlines agrees to provide scheduled air service between Rock Springs, Wyoming (RKS), and Salt Lake City, Utah (SLC) on the terms and conditions set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the above recitals and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto, intending to be legally bound, hereby agree as follows:

1. Scheduled Service. SkyWest Airlines shall provide scheduled service between Rock Springs and Salt Lake City, with the schedules in Exhibit A as an example of anticipated service, using EMB-120 or equivalent aircraft (each flight segment scheduled for a single day is hereinafter referred to as a "Scheduled Flight" and all such flight segments are hereinafter referred to collectively as "Scheduled Flights").

SkyWest has full discretion in setting the schedule times and frequency of its flights, save that it will schedule no less than two round trips daily. Such decisions will be based upon, but not limited to, aircraft, staff, crew, gate availability, business necessity and weather and seasonal changes. Flights will be scheduled by SkyWest Airlines at reasonable times and will be posted in advance. Flight schedules are subject to change.

All travel covered by this agreement is subject to applicable tariffs and other rules and regulations.

2. Margin Requirement. Agency hereby guarantees that SkyWest Airlines shall receive a 5% margin for each calendar month and for the term of this Agreement as outlined in Exhibit B, subject to the caps and limitations set forth in Section 7 hereof.

3. Revenue Sharing. SkyWest Airlines receives prorated passenger revenues from Delta Airlines and other validating carriers for tickets sold on Scheduled Flights. For passengers who purchase a ticket that includes a segment beyond RKS-SLC, Delta and SkyWest and/or SkyWest and all other carriers will prorate the interline revenue. Revenue from Interline Travel will be

prorated in accordance with the provisions of the Multilateral Prorate Agreement ("MPA"). For local RKS-SLC origin and destination passengers, "Revenue" shall mean actual revenues received by SkyWest Airlines for tickets purchased by passengers in each calendar month for the Scheduled Flights and collectively during the term of this Agreement, less taxes and fees. All fares are those prevailing on date of ticket purchase. These revenues shall be aggregated as set forth in Paragraphs 2 and 7.

4. Airline Employee Travel. All of Delta Airlines' and SkyWest Airlines' employee pass agreements are valid for these flights. Except for company business, all SkyWest pass agreements are based on space available travel and do not displace revenue passengers. No revenues attributable to employee travel shall be included within the definition of Revenues.

5. Fuel Costs. Fuel costs for purposes of subsidy calculation and the total costs will be the actual fuel costs, including related fueling costs, taxes and fees, associated with operating the scheduled service.

6. Term. The term of this agreement is 1 January, 2012, through 31 December, 2012. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, if Agency shall fail to pay the amounts due SkyWest Airlines hereunder within the time agreed and such failure shall continue for 10 days after a demand for payment from SkyWest Airlines, then SkyWest Airlines shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon five days written notice to the County. If SkyWest Airlines does not achieve 5% margin for one quarter, then either Party may thereafter cancel this Agreement upon five days written notice to the other party. This Agreement and SkyWest's operations hereunder are being conducted under SkyWest's code-share agreement with Delta Airlines. If Delta Airlines shall object to such flights or impose any financial penalty or additional financial obligations on SkyWest Airlines as a result of this Agreement, or if Delta Airlines shall cancel its code share agreement with SkyWest Airlines or amend it in any way which prohibits or unreasonably restricts, in SkyWest's sole judgment, SkyWest Airlines from flying these flights under its code share agreement with Delta Airlines, or if Delta Airlines adds additional financial obligations on SkyWest Airlines as a condition of allowing such flights, then SkyWest Airlines shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon five days written notice to Agency.

In the event that WYDOT, the County, and SkyWest agree to enter into a different type of agreement (such as the Master Plan with jet service currently being discussed), this agreement will be prorated within the month that the change takes place. All completed months prior to the change will be calculated as usual and this contract will terminate with the commencement of any new agreement.

7. Payment of Subsidy. SkyWest Airlines completes its accounting for each month approximately two to three weeks after the close of the month. Soon after this occurs, a statement will be sent which shall show the final revenues and costs for the preceding calendar month. The statement will show all calculations for the subsidy, including revenue and total

costs. Total costs are the sum of non-fuel costs and fuel costs. Fuel cost calculations are outlined in section 5 of this agreement. Non-fuel costs shall be calculated by multiplying the block hours associated with the market by \$1,471 for the EMB 120. The rate includes the 5% margin and all non-fuel costs. Each month's subsidy payment will be subject to the maximum as set forth in Exhibit B. Each quarter the amounts will be trued up and summarized with the total costs (non fuel and fuel costs) and revenues in an invoice. To the extent the County owes SkyWest Airlines a subsidy for such quarter, it shall pay to SkyWest Airlines, within 15 days of its receipt of such invoice, the full amount owed. To the extent SkyWest Airlines' revenues for such calendar month were greater than the total costs, the County shall have no monthly payment obligation to SkyWest Airlines for such month or partial month as the case may be. At the end of the term of this Agreement, SkyWest shall prepare a report to the County showing total revenues and total costs for the 12 month term of this Agreement. In the event that SkyWest changes the aircraft type utilized to operate the service, the non-fuel block hour rates will be renegotiated to reflect the appropriate equipment type. The maximum obligation of the county to SkyWest will not increase in the aggregate amount owed as a result of a change in aircraft type. In no event shall the County be obligated to pay SkyWest Airlines an aggregate amount in excess of \$1,634,356.

8. Audit Rights. SkyWest Airlines' calculation of the total amount due shall be binding and conclusive, provided that Agency shall have the right upon reasonable notice, to examine the business records of SkyWest Airlines relating to such calculation and to dispute the amount within thirty (30) days of such examination, if this examination reveals errors or irregularities in SkyWest Airlines' accounting practices. Such audit must be conducted no later than six months after the end of the term of this Agreement. If any audit indicates a discrepancy between the amounts paid or the amounts that should have been paid hereunder, such amounts shall be promptly paid to the applicable party, subject to SkyWest Airlines' right to dispute the audit results. Any such audit shall not unreasonably interfere with the day-to-day operations of SkyWest Airlines or any of its employees. The Agency and its auditors will be required to enter confidentiality and nondisclosure agreements prior to reviewing SkyWest's business records, subject to disclosure in accordance with law.

9. Termination. This agreement is subject to unilateral termination in the sole discretion of the County or SkyWest Airlines upon 90 days written notice by either party to the other in accordance with the Notice Provision of this agreement.

10. Reports. Within sixty (60) days of the end of each month, SkyWest Airlines may provide the following information by non-directional route and total:

- Total revenue passengers
- Revenue
- Average fare
- Flights operated
- Block hours

During the term of this Agreement, SkyWest Airlines shall provide additional information, as reasonably requested by the County, to determine the amount of subsidy likely to be required per the terms of this Agreement. The financial information given to the County shall be considered confidential and is not to be disclosed publicly.

11. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may be modified or amended only by writing signed by the party against whom enforcement of the modification or amendment is sought. All provisions of this Agreement intended to survive beyond the term of this Agreement as set forth in Section 7 shall survive as long as required for their intent to be completed.

12. No Assumption of Liability. The County and all affiliated entities hereby disclaim any and all liability to passengers or other third parties associated with the Scheduled Flights. Such liability is solely the responsibility of SkyWest Airlines and this Agreement may not be construed as an assumption of liability on the part of the County.

13. Best Efforts in Promotional Activities. The county agrees that it will use commercially reasonable efforts to promote the scheduled flights in such a way as to maximize the public awareness of the availability of the scheduled flights.

14. Governing Law. The construction, interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wyoming. The courts of the State of Wyoming shall have jurisdiction over this Agreement and the parties, and the venue shall be the State or federal courts located in Wyoming. The parties acknowledge and agree that this subsection does not waive, limit or otherwise affect or reduce the full operation and effect of the provision in this Agreement relating to the State's and the County's full retention of all rights of sovereign immunity.

15. Notices. All notices and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given (i) when delivered personally, (ii) when received by the addressee, if sent by Express Mail, Federal Express or other express delivery service (receipt requested), or (iii) three business days after being sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, in each case to the other party at the following addresses (or to such other address for a party as shall be specified by like notice; provided that notices of a change of address shall be effective only upon receipt thereof):

16. Counterparts. This Agreement is comprised of 9 typed pages including exhibits and may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. This Agreement may be executed by facsimile signatures, each of which will be deemed an original.

17. Mutual Understandings. This Agreement has been freely and fairly negotiated by the parties hereto and each party has been provided the opportunity to have the Agreement reviewed by legal counsel of its choice and to modify the terms hereof and, therefore, this Agreement shall be construed and interpreted without any presumption, or other rule, requiring construction or interpretation against the interest of the party causing this Agreement to be drafted. This Agreement embodies the entire understanding between the parties and supersedes and cancels all prior understandings and agreements, whether oral or written.

18. Attorney's Fees. In the event that a dispute arises between the parties concerning this agreement, the parties shall make good faith efforts to resolve the matter without resorting to litigation and incurring legal fees. If, however, a resolution cannot be reached and the parties engage attorneys and resort to the state or federal courts for redress, the prevailing party in such action shall be entitled to recover its costs, including reasonable attorney's fees, of pursuing or defending any such action.

19. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be liable for failure to perform under this Agreement if such failure to perform arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the non-performing party. Such causes may include, but are not limited to, acts of God or the public enemy, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, freight embargoes, unusually severe weather, breakdowns in aircraft or availability of parts, strikes or labor disruptions or other causes which prevent SkyWest Airlines from flying the Scheduled Flights. The obligation to pay money is not subject to the provisions of this Section 19.

20. Assignment/Contract Not Used as Collateral. Neither party shall assign or otherwise transfer any of the rights or delegate any of the duties set forth in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

21. Availability of Funds. Each payment obligation of the County is conditioned upon the availability of government funds that are appropriated or allocated for the payment of this obligation. If funds are not allocated and available for the continuance of the services performed by SkyWest Airlines, this Agreement may be terminated by the County at the end of the period for which the funds are available. The County shall notify SkyWest Airlines at the earliest possible time of the services that will or may be affected by a shortage of funds. No penalty shall accrue to the County in the event this provision is exercised, and the County shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this section. This provision shall not be construed to permit the County to terminate this Agreement to acquire similar services from another party nor relieve the County from payment responsibility for services that have been provided under this Agreement.

22. Award of Related Contracts. The County may undertake or award supplemental or successor contracts for work related to this Agreement. If such contracts create competitive air services that negatively affects SkyWest Airlines' load factors, SkyWest Airlines may seek a higher subsidy or immediately cancel this Agreement.

23. Independent Contractor. SkyWest Airlines shall function as an independent contractor for the purposes of this Agreement, and shall not be considered an employee of the State of Wyoming for any purpose. SkyWest Airlines shall assume sole responsibility for any debts or liabilities that may be incurred by SkyWest Airlines in fulfilling the terms of this Agreement, and shall be solely responsible for the payment of all federal, state and local taxes which may accrue because of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted as authorizing SkyWest Airlines or its agents and/or employees to act as an agent or representative for or on behalf of the State of Wyoming or the County, or to incur any obligation of any kind on the behalf of the State of Wyoming or the County. SkyWest Airlines agrees that no health/hospitalization benefits, workers' compensation and/or similar benefits available to the State of Wyoming employees will inure to the benefit of SkyWest Airlines or SkyWest Airlines' agents and/or employees as a result of Agreement.

24. Kickbacks. SkyWest Airlines certifies and warrants that no gratuities, kickbacks or contingency fees were paid in connection with this Agreement, nor were any fees, commissions, gifts or other considerations made contingent upon the award of this Agreement. If SkyWest Airlines breaches or violates this warranty, the County may, at its discretion, terminate this Agreement without liability to the County, or deduct from this Agreement price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of any commission, percentage, brokerage or contingency fee.

25. Sovereign Immunity. Except for the breach of this Agreement, the State of Wyoming and the County do not waive sovereign immunity by entering into this Agreement, except to the extent necessary for the parties to pursue a contract action to clarify or enforce the written terms of this Agreement. In all other situations, the State of Wyoming and the County specifically retain immunity and all defenses available to them as sovereigns pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 1-39-104(a),


and all other state law. The parties agree that any ambiguity in this Agreement shall not be strictly construed, either against or for either party, except that any ambiguity as to sovereign immunity shall be construed in favor of sovereign immunity.

26. Compliance with Laws. SkyWest Airlines shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations in the performance of this Agreement.

27. Third Party Beneficiary Rights. The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary and this Agreement shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Agreement shall operate only between the parties to this Agreement, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement. The provisions of this Agreement are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this Agreement.





## **Memorandum of Understanding**

### **Parties:**

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into between the Sheriff of Sweetwater County (hereinafter "Sheriff") and Sweetwater County, whose address is 80 West Flaming Gorge Way, Green River, WY 82935, and Fremont County and its respective Sheriff (hereinafter "Requesting Party"). Their address is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

**Purpose:** The purpose of the Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter "Memorandum") is to establish the specific terms and conditions for the Sheriff to accept juveniles from the other counties into the Sweetwater County Detention Center.

### **SPECIFIC PROVISIONS:**

#### **1. Term of Memorandum:**

This Memorandum is effective upon the day and date of the last signature affixed hereto. This Memorandum shall remain in full force and effect until terminated by the parties. Any party may terminate this Memorandum, without cause, upon thirty (30) days written notice, which shall be delivered by hand or by certified mail sent to the address listed herein.

#### **2. The Procedures for Requesting the Sheriff to Accept Juveniles Into the Sweetwater County Detention Center:**

- a. Prior to transporting any juvenile to the Sweetwater County Detention Center, the Requesting Party shall contact Sweetwater County's designee from the Sweetwater County Sheriff's Department to determine if the Sheriff will accept the juvenile into the Sweetwater County Detention Center. The request shall contain the information required in Paragraph 2.c. A separate request shall be provided for each juvenile. Upon Requesting Party's compliance with Paragraph 2.c., the Sheriff or a designated Deputy shall promptly respond to the request by advising the Requesting Party whether the juvenile will be accepted into the Sweetwater County Detention Center.
- b. The Sheriff has exclusive discretion in determining whether a juvenile from a Requesting Party may be accepted into the Sweetwater County Detention Center. The factors to be applied, though not exclusive, are:
  - i. Whether there is or will be sufficient space available in the Sweetwater County Detention Center to accept the juvenile from the Requesting Party. The Sweetwater County Sheriff may refuse to accept juveniles from the Requesting Party if, in his opinion, the Sweetwater County Detention Center does not or will not have sufficient space.

- ii. The Sweetwater County Sheriff may refuse to accept juveniles who suffer from serious health conditions which could create an unreasonable burden on the administration of the Sweetwater County Detention Center.
- c. The requesting Party shall provide the following information for each juvenile:
- i. Personal information regarding the juvenile, including the name, address, date of birth, social security number, height and weight and any other information regarding the juvenile that would assist the Sweetwater County Sheriff.
  - ii. Criminal history information that includes the juvenile's criminal record and the reasons and authority for the detention of the juvenile
  - iii. The expected period of incarceration. If the juvenile has been sentenced to jail, the number of days remaining on the juvenile's sentence. If the juvenile is not serving a sentence, the date in which any hearing or trial is set. In some instances this may be an estimate.
  - iv. The juvenile's medical requirements.
  - v. All reports within the possession of the Requesting Party which contain allegations of misconduct against the juvenile while incarcerated, including, but not limited to, theft, using controlled substances, fighting with jail staff or other detainees, threatening jail staff or other detainees or attempting to escape.

### **3. The Obligations of the Sheriff**

- a. The Sheriff shall provide a secure and safe environment for every juvenile incarcerated in the Sweetwater County Detention center pursuant to this Memorandum
- b. The Sheriff shall comply with all state and Federal requirements that apply to the detention of juveniles, including the requirement for sight and sound separation from adult prisoners.
- c. The Sheriff shall afford to all juveniles incarcerated pursuant to this Memorandum the same counseling and educational benefits that are presently provided to the juveniles who are incarcerated in the Sweetwater County Detention Center by an order of a court in Sweetwater County, or due to the arrest and detention by a Sweetwater County law enforcement agency. If the juvenile from the Requesting Party requires additional counseling or educational services, those services shall be made available to the juvenile.

- d. The Sheriff shall provide to the Requesting Party, upon request, the Sweetwater County Detention Center's operational records that are specific to the juvenile or juveniles of the Requesting Party.
- e. The Sheriff shall provide for, at the expense of the Requesting Party, all the juvenile's necessary medical needs, including prescription drugs, clinic or hospital visits and emergency care.
  - i. The Sheriff shall provide the Requesting Party a detailed accounting of all medical expenses of the Requesting Party's juveniles who receive medical care.
  - ii. The Sheriff shall provide all mileage data to the Requesting Party when the Sheriff or his designee has transported the juvenile of the Requesting Party to a clinic or hospital for medical care, or for such other purposes at the request of the Requesting Party.

#### **4. The Obligations of the Requesting Party**

- a. In consideration of the Sheriff permitting access to the Sweetwater County Detention Center for the detention of the Requesting Party's juveniles, the Requesting Party shall pay \$105.00 per juvenile, per day of detention to Sweetwater County. The payment for partial days shall be determined as follows: A day shall consist of a twenty-four (24) hour period beginning at midnight. If a juvenile is incarcerated on a partial day for twelve (12) hours or less, the Requesting Party shall pay fifty percent (50%) of the daily rate, which is \$52.50. If a juvenile is incarcerated for more than twelve (12) hours, the Requesting Party shall pay one hundred percent (100%) of the daily rate which is \$105.00.
- b. The Requesting Party is responsible for all transportation of the juvenile. When medical care for the juvenile is required outside the Sweetwater County Detention Center, the Requesting Party shall reimburse Sweetwater County for the costs of transporting the juvenile at the rate of fifty-eight cents (\$0.58) per mile. If the Sheriff or his designee transports the juvenile for other purposes at the request of the Requesting Party, the Requesting Party shall reimburse Sweetwater County at the same rate.
- c. Prior to the detention of the Requesting Party's juvenile, the Requesting Party shall exercise its best efforts in providing the information to the Sheriff required by Paragraph 2.c. Inaccurate or insufficient information may delay the response from the Sheriff, or in some instances the Sheriff may deny the request due to insufficient information.
- d. Should any juvenile of the Requesting Party challenge his or her detention by filing habeas corpus or any other challenge to the grounds for detention, the Responding party shall defend such action, and indemnify Sweetwater County accordingly. This obligation shall not

apply if Sweetwater County has caused or is somehow at fault for the claim, beyond and outside of its role in this Memorandum as the detention agency.

#### **5. Method of Payment**

Payment shall be made as follows: Upon receipt of an invoice from Sweetwater County or the Sweetwater County Sheriff specifying that the Sweetwater County Sheriff has complied with this agreement by performing the services described herein, the Requesting Party shall promptly remit payment to Sweetwater County.

#### **6. Confidentiality**

In the performance of this Memorandum, each party will generate and receive identifiable information regarding a juvenile. If the juvenile has not been charged with a violation or sentenced in a circuit court or a municipal court, all reports, information, data, research, or any other information that discloses any legal or administrative process or disposition relating to a juvenile's misconduct are deemed confidential. This information and the existence of this information shall remain confidential, and shall not be released to any third party, unless a court of competent jurisdiction orders the release, or the information is released pursuant to the provisions of Wyo. Stat. Ann. 14-6-203(g).

#### **GENERAL PROVISIONS:**

##### **1. Amendment**

Any party may request changes to this Memorandum. All suggested changes shall be mutually agreed upon by the parties, and shall be in writing and incorporated into this Memorandum.

##### **2. Assignability**

A party's interest in this Memorandum may not be assigned without the prior written approval of the remaining parties.

##### **3. Audit**

The Responding Party, through its authorized representatives, shall have reasonable access during regular business hours, Monday through Friday, upon reasonable notice, to any books, documents, papers, and records of the Sweetwater County Sheriff or Sweetwater County which are directly pertinent to the placement of the Requesting Party's juveniles.

**4. Wyoming Government Claims Act**

No waiver of any immunity or limitation of liability afforded by the Wyoming Government Claims Act is intended by the parties, and Sweetwater County specifically retains all such immunities and limitations of liability.

**5. Whole Agreement**

This Memorandum represents the entire and integrated Agreement between Sweetwater County and its Sheriff and the Requesting Party, and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral.

**6. Construction and Forum**

This Memorandum shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Wyoming. Any action to enforce this Memorandum or any provision there of shall be brought in the appropriate court located within Sweetwater County.



During the FY2013 budgeting process, the Detention Center requested and received funding for the replacement of the louvers on two of the three Air Handling Units serving the detention areas. At that time there were concerns raised about if the system was still functioning as designed.

I contacted the original Mechanical design engineer, Richard Reeder P.E., VBFA, and requested an estimate to "re-commission" the Automatic Temperature Controls (ATC) and Smoke Management Systems. Should either of these systems not function as designed, a premature failure of their components will continue to occur.

I received and reviewed the **attached** proposal from Mr. Reeder.

### Recommendation

I recommend that the proposal be accepted, and have Mr. Reeder proceed with re-commissioning the ATC and smoke management systems at the Detention Center.

RE: Re-commissioning of Controls

The Sweetwater County Jail in Green River, Wyoming has been identified as a project that could benefit by having the ATC and Smoke Management controls re-commissioned. A re-commissioning effort would consist of methodically going thru the ATC control systems to 1- compare with the original design, 2- identify any discrepancies or issues, 3- make recommendations as required for correcting the operations. The main focus would be for the Jail related ATC systems and Smoke Management systems.

We propose the following scope of work to accomplish this:

1. Review the existing design including the blue prints, specifications and ATC submittal/as-built drawings.
2. Spend 8 hours on site going thru the controls. We feel that in 8 hours we could go thru the jail related portions of the project. If time is available, we could also look at the non-jail related controls.
3. Prepare and submit a report of the findings and recommendations.

This effort will require two people from VBFA for re-commissioning, one person at the controls directing the process and second person field verifying the operation of the systems. We propose Richard Reeder, P.E. as the lead engineer, plus another engineer from VBFA as the second person. It will also require a Carrier control representative to operate the controls. We have contacted Jim Norton of Carrier and he will be the Carrier representative to operate the controls.

We propose a fee of \$8,000 for this effort. This fee includes the two people from VBFA, one person from Carrier, all travel, hotel, and meals for the site visit.

We understand the desired schedule for these efforts would be in the early fall of 2012. We can coordinate the exact dates once the project is underway.





### Sweetwater County Emergency Amendment to Fee Schedule for Commercial and Industrial Applications

**Whereas**, the Board of Sweetwater County Commissioners (Board) is empowered by Wyoming Statutes 18-5-201 et. Seq. to regulate and restrict the location and use of buildings and structures, and the use, condition, or occupancy of lands in the unincorporated areas of Sweetwater County; and,

**Whereas**, the Sweetwater County Comprehensive Plan of 2002 encourages and supports the creation and enforcement of **appropriate regulations** to ensure the protection of public health, safety and welfare; and,

**Whereas**, Wyoming Statute 18-5-309 requires permit fees for applications to be a reasonable fee and not to exceed the cost of processing the application as determined by the board; and,

**Whereas**, The Board recognizes that the current fee in Section 23 of the Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution for commercial and industrial applications can exceed the cost of processing applications; and,

**Whereas**, the Board recognizes the need to amend the fee schedule for commercial and industrial applications, both pursuant to its general authority and pursuant to statute; and,

**Whereas**, the Board is empowered by Wyoming Statute 16-3-103 (b) to declare an emergency and to establish emergency rules to protect public health, safety and welfare; and,

**Whereas**, the Board of Sweetwater County Commissioners has determined that the Sweetwater County Emergency Amendment to Fee Schedule attached hereto are in conformance with the public needs and will serve to promote public health, safety and well-being;

**Now therefore let it be resolved**, to provide reasonable fees for the residents of Sweetwater County, the Sweetwater County Board of County Commissioners, as authorized by Wyoming Statute 16-3-103 (b), hereby declares an Emergency and hereby adopts the attached Sweetwater County Emergency Amendment to the Fee Schedule.

This resolution and the attached emergency rules serve as the official notice of the said emergency and shall be filed in the Records of the Sweetwater County Clerk.

A Business Survey was recently completed by the Rock Springs Chamber of Commerce for the Sweetwater County area. The businesses surveyed indicated they are planning on \$450 million worth of construction activity over the next 3 years. They anticipate 200 new, fulltime jobs will be created.

The survey respondents were half local businesses and half national or Multi-National companies, 80% reported they view the business climate in SW Wyoming as favorable. While 50% reported that their total company sales were increasing most of the others reported stable sales figures, 50% of the surveyed businesses said their employment needs are increasing and will continue over the foreseeable future.

Workforce continues to be a major concern for most of the companies surveyed. Skill set of workers were rated low, especially in technical fields. Stability of workforce was also a concern expressed by many of the respondents. A common comment was, "There are drug issues," that need to be addressed. This was noted as the pool of available workers shrinks and especially in those jobs requiring CDL's and Hazmat Certification. A shortage of professionals from accountants to Diesel Mechanics to electricians and supervisors is also a theme heard many times. The aging of the workforce was a change that many employers are experiencing already as retirements increase. A shift from older to younger workers is a definite trend in many of our large industry sectors as is more of a gender blend on the worksite. About 70% of those interviewed showed an increase in spending on training to meet new regulation changes and demands for new or advanced skills.

Western Wyoming Community College Training Programs are well thought of in the community. Of the businesses surveyed 80% were aware of some type of training available at WWCC. The extraction industries appear to be more aware of what programs are offered at WWCC than the retail sector of our economy. Utility Services were seen as vital to the continued growth of our local economy. While 20% of the respondents predicted an increase need for the (water, sewer, and Natural Gas) 40% anticipate an increase in electricity, telecom, and Internet. For the most part businesses were satisfied with utility services. Telecom and Internet services were areas that businesses said could improve, especially in coverage and data capacity.

The City Services provided were ranked at a high level of satisfaction. Next were K-12 schools, roads/highways and ambulance service. There were some positive comments such as, "healthcare is improving" and "area schools are an attraction for young families." It was also noted that more flights would be desirable for the business traveler and the airport appears to be getting busier.

The Rock Springs Chamber interprets the overall business atmosphere in the county to be positive, with the extraction sector leading the way in expansion. Tourism was also a bright spot with Hotel Occupancy, lodging tax collections and average daily

rates are all up for the year. Visitation numbers in Sweetwater County and the surrounding area are also on the rise. With the low unemployment rate we currently have 4.3% and strong housing and rental market (rental rate at 97%) it is east to see a bright future for our area. Current population trends also indicate a positive trend. Average age of our population is 32.7 years (35.7 is the national average) Rock Springs in particular has experienced an annual population growth of 1.2% annually.

With these identified trends and continued demand for our products it is east to see a stable growth pattern in Sweetwater County for the future. Two areas of concern are pricing on commodities we produce and the impact of overseas demand as this will drive production and expansion of our export commodities. Mainly, this applies to Trona and possibly Coal and Natural Gas in the future.

Overall, we are in a positive growth mode and indications are we will see steady, continued movement in that direction. The conclusions of this survey are based on a small but diverse sample of area business. It in no way scientifically sound and is subjective from the surveyors perspective. All information gathered was confidential and only generalizations are presented to protect individual company's responses. This survey provides a snapshot of what is happening in our local economy and also identifies some common trends. The Rock Springs Chamber presents their information only as a guide and a starting point to gather more information as situations dictate. We thank all participating businesses for their time in providing the following information.




