Commissioner Comments/Reports

Commissioner Bailiff

Commissioner Bailiff explained that he had been on vacation and, when he returned, visited Castle Rock Hospital District, Bone and Joint and physical therapy. Commissioner Bailiff expressed his appreciation to the City of Green River for inviting the commissioners to the River Festival. Commissioner Bailiff reported that he discussed security issues at the courthouse. Commissioner Bailiff reported that he attended the library meeting and noted that a new director should be named before the end of September.

Commissioner Kolb

Commissioner Kolb reported that he attended the Green River Festival as well as meetings for the Phase Two Water Study in Farson, Planning and Zoning and the Airport Board and noted that the Airport Board expressed interest in getting back under the county health insurance program. Commissioner Kolb further reported that Communities Protecting the Green is awaiting the study on the Flaming Gorge water resource from the Bureau of Reclamation. Commissioner Kolb explained that two water seminars in Colorado will be forthcoming and requested direction from the commission if he should attend. The commission concurred that Commissioner Kolb should attend. Commissioner Kolb read aloud WY State Statute 16-4-111, Section B - "Uniform Municipal Fiscal Procedures" and expressed his desire that the commission consider this prior to adopting component units' budgets. Commissioner Kolb noted that he spoke with Public Works Director John Radosevich, Land Use Director Eric Bingham, Accounting Manager Bonnie Phillips, County Clerk Dale Davis and County Treasurer Robb Slaughter. Lastly, Commissioner Kolb reported that he attended the robing ceremony and after party for Judge Prokos.

Commissioner Van Matre

Commissioner Van Matre reported that the IVA (Independent Veterans Association) has requested to transfer veteran records that they are in possession of to the Sweetwater Veterans Service Office for follow up. Commissioner Van Matre reported that he visited with the museum board and the I/T department relative to the implementation date for the financial system. Commissioner Van Matre reported that Grants Manager Krisena Marchal has been busy with the Judicial Plan grant. Lastly, Commissioner Van Matre reported that he attended the robing ceremony for Judge Prokos, the Green River Chamber meeting that Governor Mead attended as well as the press conference Governor Mead held in the Board of County Commission Chamber room.

Commissioner West

Commissioner West reported that he missed the hospital board meeting as he attended, along with Commissioner Kolb, the Farson-Eden water system meeting. Commissioner West reported that he, along with Chairman Johnson, toured the Memorial Hospital medical office building. Commissioner West explained that he visited the Rock Springs CDC (Child Development Center) building regarding concerns with completing the project on time and the delay with opening the school. Commissioner West noted that he, along with Human Resource Director Garry McLean, Facilities Manager Chuck Radosevich and Deputy County Attorney Cliff Boevers, met with Golden Hour Director Beth Whitman relative to requests to hold various events and the potential needs of the facility. Commissioner West addressed an article titled "Riverton Justice Center back in commissioners' sights as state funding becomes possible". The commission expressed interest in looking into state funding for the Judicial Court. Commissioner West disbursed confidential estimates for the 333 Broadway building to the commission and addressed lobbying off the drive through awning, extending the parking lot and the timeline for bidding.

Chairman Johnson

Chairman Johnson emphasized how fortunate Sweetwater County is to have the Memorial Hospital medical office building. Chairman Johnson expressed that he was impressed with Governor Mead's press conference. Chairman Johnson reported that he attended the selection committee to replace the Executive Director for the WCCA and noted that the elimination process has been dropped to six and interviews will be conducted soon. Lastly, Chairman Johnson requested that Deputy County Attorney Cliff Boevers address the role of a liaison to boards that the commission interfaces with and what directly is the commission's role. Mr. Boevers advised that the role of a liaison is a communication role.

Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

Appeal of Denied Permit Filed by Dan Adams for a Shed that Exceeds the Square Footage of the House

Resident Dan Adams and Planner Steve Horton explained that the permit for a shed, filed by Dan Adams, was denied due to the shed exceeding the square footage of the house. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to grant the appeal of a denied permit, filed by Mr. Adams, for a shed that exceeds the square footage of the house. *Commissioner Kolb so moved. Commissioner Bailiff seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

Historic Racing

Wyoming Horse Racing LLC Owner Eugene Joyce requested permission for simulcast pari-mutuel wagering on historic races and explained House Bill 25. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson opened public comments and, hearing no comments, the hearing was closed. *Commissioner Van Matre moved to grant and give permission for simulcast pari-mutuel wagering. Commissioner West seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

County Commissioners 2013 Renewal Scholarship

Commissioner Kolb moved to enter into executive session to discuss the applicants. Commissioner West seconded the motion. With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously. A quorum of the commission was present. After coming out of executive session, *Commissioner Kolb moved to nominate Aaron Cheese for the 2013 renewal scholarship. Commissioner West seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

333 Broadway Building "Name that Building Contest"

Following discussion of the 29 entries received, *Commissioner Kolb moved to table the issue until the next meeting. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

Approval of the FY 2013-2014 CMAQ Grant Agreements

Public Works Director John Radosevich and Grants Manager Krisena Marchal presented the FY 2013-2014 CMAQ grant agreements #CM13010 and #CM13011. Following discussion, *Commissioner West moved to approve, and authorize the Chairman to sign, the FY 2013-2014 CMAQ grant agreements #CM13010 and #CM13011. Commissioner Bailiff seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

Request to Replace Vacant Position in Detention Center

Sheriff Haskell requested authorization to replace a vacant position in the detention center. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to approve the request. *Commissioner Bailiff so moved. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously.

SWCO Ambulance Service Board-Rock Springs, Report to BOCC

SWCO Ambulance Service Board Members including Rock Springs Fire Chief Lyle Armstrong, Ron Noble, Rock Springs Police Chief Mike Lowell and Sheriff Haskell were present to explain that the Sweetwater County Ambulance Service Board has collected and identified the service needs for insertion into a contract or request for Proposal (RFP). Chief Armstrong requested direction from the Board of County Commissioners on how to proceed with the creation of an RFP. Following discussion relative to financials, subsidies, contracts, and seeking request for proposals, Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to enter into executive session. *Commissioner Bailiff so moved. Commissioner West seconded the motion.* With no discussion, the motion was approved unanimously. A quorum of the commission was present.

Lunch

Chairman Johnson recessed the meeting for lunch. After the lunch break, Chairman Johnson opened the afternoon session. Commissioner Van Matre announced that during executive session, a discussion took place relative to the VSO Director and announced that Larry Levitt has been offered the position and he will begin employment on September 26, 2013.



LEASE AGREEMENT

This lease agreement is made and entered into this ____ day of _____ 2013, by and between the City of Rock Springs, Wyoming, a municipal corporation in the State of Wyoming whose address is 212 "D" Street, Rock Springs, Wyoming, 82901 (herein after referred to as "Lessee"), and Sweetwater County, a Governmental entity whose address is 80 West Flaming Gorge Way, Green River, Wyoming, 82935 (hereinafter referred to as "Lessor").

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR AND IN CONSIDERATION OF THE COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS HEREIN CONTAINED, IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD AS FOLLOWS:

1.) DEMISE. Lessor, Sweetwater County, for and in consideration of the covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, does hereby lease to the Lessee, the City of Rock Springs, the following described real property, to wit:

A parcel of land located in the NE ¼ NE 1/4 of Section 26, Resurvey Township 19 North, Range 105 West of the Sixth Meridian, Rock Springs, Sweetwater County, Wyoming, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point that lies South 78 degrees, 57', 32" West – a distance of 951.60 feet from the Northeast Corner of said section 26;

Thence South 00 degrees, 6', 37" East (record: South, parallel to the East line of the Sweetwater County tract as recorded in the Office of the County Clerk in Book 7008, Page #1709, for a distance of 420.35 feet);

Thence South 88 degrees, 16', 37" West for a distance of 314.56 feet (from which the most Southerly corner of the said Sweetwater County tract bears South 60 degrees, 3', 4" East (record South 59 degrees, 56', 40" East) for a distance of 170.00 feet);

Thence North 10 degrees, 21', 47" West (record: North 10 degrees, 15', 2" West) along said Westerly line of the Sweetwater County tract for a distance of 425.00 feet (from which the most Westerly corner of the said Sweetwater County tract bears North 10 degrees, 21', 47" West along the said Westerly line a distance of 142.20 feet);

Thence North 88 degrees, 16', 31" East for a distance of 390.24 feet to the Point of the beginning.

The above described tract contains an area of 3.40 acres, more or less, and is subject to any rights-of-way and/or easements which have been legally acquired. The basis of bearing for said parcel is North 89 degrees, 57', 7" West from the Northeast Corner to the North Quarter of said Section 26.

- 2.) CONSIDERATION. The Lessee, City of Rock Springs, in consideration of the lease and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained shall pay to the Lessor, Sweetwater County, as rent for the same, the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) per year. Said sum shall be due and payable upon the execution of this lease agreement.
- 3.) RESTRICTIONS. The Lessee shall not assign this lease, nor sublet the premises nor any part thereof, and shall not use or permit the same or any part thereof to be used for any other purpose than as above stipulated. No alterations therein or additions thereto shall be made without the written consent of the Lessor and all additions, fixtures, or improvements with the exception of the items listed on Exhibit "A" attached hereto, which may be made by Lessee, shall become the property of the Lessor, and remain upon the premises as part thereof, and be surrendered with the premises at the at the termination of this lease.

The Lessee, at its expense, shall keep in force during the term of this lease, insurance, issued by a responsible insurance company or companies and in form acceptable to the Lessor for protection of the Lessor as an insured under such policy and Lessee, against all liabilities, judgments, costs, damages and expenses which may accrue against, be charged to or be recovered from either the Lessor or the Lessee by reasons of damage to the property of, injury or death of any person or persons on account of any matter or things which may occur on the demised premises.
- 6.) FIRE INSURANCE. All insurance policies required to be furnished by the Lessee hereunder, may be blanket policies covering the demised premises and other properties and premises owned or operated by the Lessee.

- 8.) TAXES, LICENSE AND OTHER CHARGES. The Lessee shall pay promptly all taxes and excise license fees of whatever nature, applicable to its operation and take out and keep current, all licenses, municipal, state, or federal, required for the conduct of the enterprise, and further, shall not permit any of said taxes, excise or license fees to become delinquent. Lessee shall pay and discharge all taxes, assessments, penalties, charges, rate or liens of any nature whatsoever, if any there may (during the term here of or any renewal) be levies, assessed, charged, imposed or claimed on or against the demised premises or any improvements or fixtures thereon or appurtenances thereto, and any part thereof, or against the Lessor by reason of ownership of the land by whatever authority levies, assessed, charged, imposed, or claimed.







As we have discussed, the next step for the Jamestown – Rio Vista Water and Sewer District in working towards the construction of a pipeline from the Joint Powers Water Board Treatment to the District is to develop the funding plan.

In order to assist the District in preparing the plan, Sunrise Engineering proposes to perform the following work. We will analyze all applicable funding options in order to develop the best possible funding scenario for the District. These funding sources will include the State Loan and Investment Board, Wyoming Business Council, Wyoming State Revolving Fund, Wyoming Water Development Commission, and USDA-Rural Development.

The work will include meetings with funding agencies as well as filling out funding applications. The work will also include meetings with potential project partners including the City of Green River and other land owners that may be affected by the project.

We will also analyze repayment methods. User rate increases will be analyzed for the various funding scenarios. Other repayment methods will also be analyzed including the possibility of assessments for existing users as well as vacant lots through a special service district. We will also present options for calculating how the lots would be assessed.

A written report will be prepared that outlines the proposed funding plan. This report would be used to communicate the plan to project partners (i.e. the City of Green River) as well as the public.
