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**Commissioner Comments/Reports**

**Commissioner West**

Commissioner West reported that he had meetings with Castle Rock Hospital District relative to their request for funding and attended the bid opening for the Health and Human Service (HHS) building. Commissioner West noted that he spoke with Facilities Chuck Radosevich relative to the HHS project as well as other facility issues. Lastly, Commissioner West reported that he communicated with George K Baum Attorney Mary Keating Scott relative to the Specific Tax Joint Powers Board.

**Commissioner Kolb**

Commissioner Kolb reported that he attended the City of Green River meeting relative to the Jamestown Rio Vista Improvement District as well as liaison meetings for Planning and Zoning and the Airport Board. Additionally, Commissioner Kolb reported that he attended the HHS bid opening and spoke with Public Works Director John Radosevich and Rock Springs Councilman Billy Shalata relative to the surplus fire truck and recommended that the City of Rock Springs table the item to allow the commission time to review if other municipalities could utilize the truck. Commissioner Kolb noted that he spoke with County Clerk Dale Davis, County Assessor Pat Drinkle and Land Use Director Eric Bingham. Lastly, Commissioner Kolb explained that he attended the interview process for the 4-H Director.

Chairman Johnson explained that Glenn Canyon Institute left a voice message regarding the proposal for Colorado River moving water from the Flaming Gorge and questioned if Communities Protecting the Green River board member Don Hartley knew anything about it. Mr. Hartley explained that he was not aware of the issue.

**Commissioner Van Matre**

Commissioner Van Matre reported that he, along with VSO Director Larry Levitt, Human Resource Director Garry McLean and Lincoln County Commissioners Kent Connelly and Deb Wolfley, conducted interviews for the VSO position in Lincoln County. Commissioner Van Matre reported that he attended the museum board meeting, met with IT Director Tim Knight and Grants Manager Krisena Marchal. Lastly, Commissioner Van Matre reported that he attended the HHS bid opening.

**Chairman Johnson**

Chairman Johnson reported that he attended a Federal Agency meeting which included the Forest Service, Seeskadee and the BLM. He explained that it is a great forum to represent the county and stressed how important Federal Lands are to Sweetwater County and voiced concerns that a BLM director has not been present during the meetings. Chairman Johnson further reported that he met with the CLG (Coalition of Local Government) in Kemmerer and expressed disappointment regarding the air quality with the NPL and discussed seasonal curtailment. Chairman Johnson explained that the Clerk's office requested a meeting on December 30, 2013 to approve vouchers/warrants and noted that Commissioner Van Matre will be acting chairman during his absence. Chairman Johnson questioned if County Treasurer Robb Slaughter knew why Fremont County was borrowing money out of their reserves to fund a project or projects.

**Commissioner Bailiff**

Commissioner Bailiff reported that he visited Public Works Director John Radosevich relative to widening White Mountain Road. Commissioner Bailiff noted that the Bairoil fire truck froze and expressed that everyone needs to be responsible for checking their vehicles. Commissioner Bailiff reported that he attended the STAR Transit meeting and noted that their audit was good. He asserted they discussed communications between the CDC (Child Development Center) and STAR cancelling routes during inclement weather and added that STAR had two bus accidents. Commissioner Bailiff further reported that he visited with Sheriff Haskell regarding personnel and attended the library board meeting and conveyed that they are working on their budget.

The commission expressed their appreciation to one another sharing that they are looking forward to working together for another year.

Chairman Johnson opened county resident concerns. Hearing no comments, the hearing was closed.

**Discuss Office Sapce for Guardian Ad Litem**

Following discussion relative to Guardian Ad Litem (GAL) attorney David Arnold utilizing a vacant office at juvenile probation and having the judges use Mr. Arnold exclusively for the GAL, the commission concurred to allow Mr. Arnold to utilize the vacant office. Following discussion, ***Commissioner West moved to have the***

***Chairman draft a letter to the BLM in support of the Greater Little Mountain Coalition request of us today, for the well to be drilled on Iron Mountain and to have a public hearing and a 30 day extension to the scoping period. Commissioner Bailiff seconded the motion. The motion carried.***

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**Action/Presentation Items Continued**

**Release a Letter of Credit for Double J Subdivision**

Double J Subdivision Owner Jeff Fritz was present. Land Use Director Eric Bingham explained that Jeff Fritz has requested that his letter of credit, in the amount of \$147,921.48, be released for the establishment of roads in the Double J. Subdivision. Mr. Bingham further explained that Mr. Fritz has completed the construction of the roads within the Double J Subdivision with the exception of reseeding and installing rip-rap that is estimated to be completed in the spring of 2014. Mr. Bingham also shared that Mr. Fritz will provide a new letter of credit to bond the remaining improvements in the amount of \$5,000.00. Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to release. *Commissioner West so moved. Commissioner Kolb seconded the motion.* The motion carried.

**Funding Request from Castle Rock and Presentation by Mission Health Services**

Castle Rock Hospital District Board Member Bob Gordon, CEO Bailey Dockter, CFO Todd Toolson and Attorney George Lemich along with Mission Health Services CEO/President Gary Kelso and Vice

President Warren Walker were present. Mr. Gordon provided the history of Castle Rock Convalescent Center, the position that the district is in today and the cost associated with Medicaid reimbursement rates. Mr. Gordon and Ms. Dockter explained that 60% of Castle Rock Convalescent Center residents are on Medicaid. Mr. Kelso explained that Medicaid reimbursement is a national problem and, even with the current payer mix, Mission Health Services believes that they will be fine monetarily and will remain viable. Mr. Kelso provided the Mission Health Services background explaining that they are a 23 year old non-profit organization and noted that they have provided outstanding, nationally recognized, care. Mr. Kelso further explained that they are currently working with four counties within the State of Utah who happen to be in the same situation as Castle Rock Hospital District relative to their convalescent center and shared that they have strategies that will need to be implemented to make it work. Mr. Kelso expressed that they have a very strong philosophy for quality of care. Mr. Kelso further explained that Mission Health Services is able to make this a viable entity due to having multiple locations, staff with the capacity to expand its abilities and absorb some overhead costs, and also having the ability to look at purchasing programs that add to provision of similar services at a lesser cost. Mr. Kelso explained that the challenge in most county homes is dwindling revenues and increased costs and the employee benefit structures are so rich in the nursing home setting that it makes it nearly impossible to remain viable. He noted that Mission Health Services will review how the facility is staffed, what can be done to ensure that benefits are still provided to employees to the level that makes it viable to operate with a financially positive solution. Mr. Kelso expressed that he is confident that Mission Health can step in, meet the requirements and still be viable. Chairman Johnson questioned what the Mission Health Services relationship would be with the current Castle Rock Hospital District Board. Mr. Kelso explained that they would lease the property and would have no legal accountability to the board, however; within the lease, there will be certain confinements that will have to be followed and acknowledged that a relationship would exist to ensure a smooth transition. Mr. Lemich explained that the lease is currently in draft mode and is being reviewed by Mission Health Services attorney noting that the term of the lease is six years which is the remaining debt obligation on the facility. Mr. Lemich further explained that there are covenants on the lease which require Mission Health Services to ensure that services are provided. Ms. Dockter requested operation money in the amount of \$450,000.00 to get Castle Rock through the transition period until June 30, 2014. Ms. Dockter requested an additional \$515,000.00 to cover benefit obligations to employees and explained that 101 employees working at the nursing home will each receive a severance payment along with built up sick leave and vacation days. Ms. Dockter requested that the total amount requested in the amount of \$965,000.00 be disbursed by the end of January, 2014, to avoid Castle Rock defaulting on other payments. A lengthy discussion ensued regarding the funding request, finalizing the lease, transferring the state license and the employee severance package. Mr. Toolson explained that Castle Rock Hospital District policy requires the severance package after which employees will have the potential to be hired by Mission Health Services. The commission expressed their fear that Castle Rock Hospital District would request additional funding. Ms. Dockter assured the commission that the board has a plan in place to ensure that they would not request additional funding from the county. The commission expressed that the convalescent center/villa has been very important to the community noting that it is a high priority to support the request to avoid losing the hospital, convalescent center and the villa entirely. ***Commissioner West moved to approve the request from Castle Rock Hospital District and begin whatever paperwork that needs to be done for a budget amendment and to grant them \$450,000.00 in operational funds by the end of January, 2014 and to also fund them another \$515,000.00 for other benefits needed when the completion of the deal with Mission Health Care Services is done for the convalescent center and the villa. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion. Commissioner Kolb moved to amend the motion to stipulate that the ambulance subsidy that is currently given be withdrawn in next year's funding.*** With no second, the amended motion failed. Following further comment stating that the loss of the operation is not what the commission wanted, the commission requested the board to get their affairs in order to avoid this happening again and the original motion carried.

#### **SLIB Fund Expenditure**

Judge Richard Lavery and Judge John Prokos presented potential projects for the Green River Circuit and District Court facilities to be expended from the SLIB funds. Also present were Facilities Manager Chuck Radosevich, Clerk of District Court Donna Lee Bobak, Sheriff Haskell and Sergeant Brett Stokes.

#### **Adjourn**

There being no further business to come before the Board this day, the meeting was adjourned subject to the call of the Chairman.

This Contract for the Provision of Emergency Medical and Ambulance Services (hereinafter "Contract") is entered into on this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2014, by and between the Board of Sweetwater County Commissioners, 80 West Flaming Gorge Way, City of Green River, County of Sweetwater, State of Wyoming, 82935, (hereinafter "County") and \_\_\_\_\_ (hereinafter "Ambulance Company").

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners desire to contract ~~to~~ with a competent party for the purpose of coordinating the provision of emergency medical services and to contract with a single provider of emergency ambulance service to provide primary response of an advanced life support level ambulance for all emergency calls requiring an ambulance within the geographic area encompassing the County; and

**WHEREAS**, \_\_\_\_\_ is an emergency ambulance service duly-licensed and operating in the State of Wyoming which desires to contract with the County to provide emergency ambulance service and is capable of providing that service to the County; and

**WHEREAS**, the parties hereto both desire for the County to have prompt, efficient, and high quality advanced life support capable emergency ambulance service available for the benefit of the citizens and visitors to the areas encompassed by the Sweetwater County Ambulance Service - Rock Springs Service Area, (hereinafter "Service Area");

NOW, therefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereby agreed as follows:

### **1. DEFINITIONS**

As used in this contract, the following terms should have the following meaning:

- A. **ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT (ALS)** means treatment defined in Section 1 of the Wyoming Rules and Regulation for Emergency Medical Services.
- B. **AMBULANCE** means a motor vehicle properly authorized and equipped for the purpose of ~~transportation-transporting~~ and administering to patients needing ~~medical~~-Emergency medical services, fully equipped to provide advanced life support care in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, and medical protocols, and that is staffed with a minimum of at least one certified EMT-P and one EMT-I or EMT-B at all times.
- C. **BASIC LIFE SUPPORT (BLS)** means treatment described in Section 1 of the Wyoming Rules and Regulation for Emergency Medical Services.
- D. **BOARD** means the ~~Sweetwater County Ambulance Service-Rock Springs Board-Rock Springs, so identified in and~~ appointed by the Sweetwater County Commissioners.
- E. **EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE ("EMS")** means any service as described in Chapter 1 of the Wyoming Rules and Regulation for Emergency Medical Services that is to be performed by EMT-P, EMT-I, and EMT-B including transport for medical services.
- F. **EMT-B** (Emergency Medical Technician - Basic), **EMT-I** (Emergency Medical Technician - Intermediate), and **EMT-P** (Emergency Medical Technician - Paramedic) shall be as defined in Section 1 of the Wyoming Rules and Regulation for Emergency Medical Services.

- G. **PHYSICIAN** means an individual who holds a current valid certificate issued pursuant to the Rules and Regulations of the Wyoming Department of Health.
- H. **RESPONSE TIME** means the total elapsed time from the moment a 911 or seven digit emergency call is communicated to Ambulance Company until the first responding ambulance arrives at the scene where emergency services are desired.
- I. **SERVICE AREA** means the Sweetwater County Ambulance Service - Rock Springs service area, as defined by the Sweetwater County Commissioners, to coordinate the provision of emergency services and emergency ambulance service within Sweetwater County. The coverage area is that shown on the Sweetwater County Ambulance Service Area – First Call Out Map which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference as Appendix A..
- J. **ADDITIONS TO THE SERVICE AREA** The above-defined Service Area may be expanded at any time by the Board of Sweetwater County Commissioners.

## 2. **DURATION OF CONTRACT (5 years)**

This Contract and all obligations attached to it, will commence on July 1, 2014 at 12:01 a.m. and will expire at 12:00 a.m. (Midnight) on June 30, 2019, unless the Contract is otherwise terminated pursuant to the terms and conditions contained herein.

A 5 year renewal is optional if fees and terms are agreeable to all parties and the option passes by a majority vote of the Board of Sweetwater County Commissioners.

## 3. **STATUS AND LEGAL RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES**

Independent Contractor Relationship. Ambulance Company shall perform this Agreement as an independent contractor and not as an agent or employee of the County. Nothing in this Contract shall be construed to be inconsistent with that relationship or status. Except, as where described otherwise in this Contract, the manner and method of completing the work under taken by Ambulance Company shall be determined by its sole discretion.

Independent Contractor Responsibilities. Except where otherwise limited by this Contract, Ambulance Company shall have the sole duty, responsibility, control and right to control its agents and employees, including, but not limited to, recruiting, hiring, and training employees, establishing and providing wages and benefits, and discipline and termination of employees or others assigned by Ambulance Company to provide services pursuant to this Contract. Ambulance Company shall further have sole responsibility and control over compliance with all federal, state and local laws and regulations relating to its employees and agents, including, but not limited to, withholding requirements, reporting requirements, unemployment benefits, worker's compensation compliance, compliance with federal and state wage and hour laws, including the Fair Labor Standards Act, all federal and state health and safety requirements, and compliance with all Medicaid and Medicare provider requirements.

Agreement to Retain Individuals Who Are Not Excluded from Federal Health Programs. Ambulance Company agrees that it will at all times employ, hire, or contract with only those entities or individuals who have not been excluded by the federal government from participating in a federal health care program, and that Ambulance Company will provide bi-annual written assurance that all individuals and entities it employs or contracts have not been excluded from a federal health care program. This section applies to all individuals and entities retained by the Ambulance Company, including those that may provide billing and other management services to the Ambulance Company.

#### 4. LAWS/RULES/REGULATIONS

The Ambulance Company shall be required to comply with all Wyoming laws, regulations, and rules that relate to the provision of emergency medical services and ambulance services.

All services furnished by Ambulance Company shall be rendered in full compliance with all applicable federal, state and local law, rules, and regulations. It shall be Ambulance Company's sole responsibility to determine which laws, rules, and regulations apply to the services rendered under this Contract, and to maintain compliance at all times. For example: Under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, national origin, or religion be discriminated against.

This Agreement is subject to the requirements of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and all federal statutes and state regulations with respect to equal employment opportunities. Ambulance Company agrees to comply with all federal and state anti-discrimination laws.

Ambulance Company must also meet all statutory requirements promulgated by the County and all administrative requirements promulgated by the Board, including ordinances or regulations that deal with the licensure or operation of an ambulance service within the Service Area.

#### 5. EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Ambulance Company agrees to provide ALS emergency ambulance service for all requests for such service, however received, for the Service Area. Ambulance Company is required to answer and respond immediately to all emergency calls within the Service Area. Such services shall include:

##### a. Staffing

All ambulances that respond to emergency calls under this Contract must be staffed by a minimum of at least one (1) certified EMT-P or Registered Nurse and one (1) certified EMT-I or EMT-B.

All ambulances that respond to emergency calls under this Contract shall have, at all times, a full complement of properly working ALS equipment as required for ALS ambulances by the Wyoming Office of Emergency Medical Services and as required to comply with regional and local medical protocols as defined by the designated medical director.

Ambulance Company will supply, within the response area, a minimum of two (2) ALS ambulances with fully staffed crews, 24 hours per day, and seven days a week. The ambulances will be available solely for emergency medical responses within the Service Area. The Ambulance Company must staff at a minimum four (4) personnel on duty at all times to respond to emergency calls.

One (1) ambulance and crew will be reasonably available to respond to an emergency response in the event the other designated emergency staffed unit is already committed to an emergency response or is otherwise unavailable.

Backup Support. Ambulance Company shall ~~have execute~~ mutual aid agreements sufficient to provide a prompt response to emergency calls in the event that the Ambulance Company is unable to take a call for whatever reason. The mutual aid agreements shall be with other ambulance services within close proximity of to the Service Area, and its terms shall be in writing.

In the case of mass casualty incidents or high call volume, the ~~provider~~ Ambulance Company shall utilize mutual aid agreements and may staff ambulances with any available staffing required to provide ambulance transport from the incident.

Scheduling. Personnel shall be scheduled so that two (2) crews consisting of a minimum of two

(2) persons per crew, twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week, cover the Service Area.

All ambulances shall be staffed with no less than one (1) EMT-P for ALS and no less than one (1) EMT-I or EMT-B.

All responding ambulances shall have a driver who is familiar with the Service Area and who-said driver shall have a current map of the area.

**b. Ambulance Personnel**

Quality Personnel. All EMS personnel (including, but not limited to EMT-P's, EMT-I's, and EMT-B's), that are utilized by Ambulance Company to fulfill its obligations under this Contract shall be of good moral character, and shall be physically and mentally capable of performing their job duties. No individual utilized to fulfill the obligations under this Contract, including the management staff of the Ambulance Company, may-shall have a criminal record involving the conviction of a felony, or a misdemeanor conviction that involves a crime of moral turpitude, as identified in the Wyoming Office of Emergency Medical Services rules and licensing requirements.

Ambulance Company is at all times required to ensure that all personnel it employs are professional and do not pose a potential threat to the health and safety of the public.

Policies. The Ambulance Company must maintain and enforce the following personnel policies:

- Secondary Employment, Overtime and Being Well Rested for Work
- Drug-Free Workplace Policy, Drug and Alcohol Testing Procedures, and Random Drug Testing Policy
- Safe Vehicle Operations and Vehicle Accident Policy
- Corporate Compliance Policy
- No Discrimination and No Harassment
- Professional Conduct Policy and Code of Conduct
- Workplace Safety (including OSHA Blood and Airborne Pathogens Standards, Injury Reporting, etc.)
- Confidentiality of Information Policy
- Any other policies necessary to comply with Wyoming Law

Professional Conduct and Dress. Ambulance Company agrees that its employees and agents will maintain courteous and professional conduct and appearance at all times, including proper identification (Ambulance Company name, individual's name, EMT certification level, etc.).

Roster of Qualified Personnel. A current roster of personnel assigned to provide ambulance services under this Contract shall be provided to the Board on a quarterly basis.

The roster shall include the employee's name, certificate number, expiration dates of all certifications, EMS training completed and continuing education completed or planned. Ambulance Company shall attempt to maintain local, full-time, regular staff, ~~who shall enhance have the~~ familiarity with the response area, and provide continuity of care with other entities and public safety agencies.

Current Certification. Ambulance Company will ensure that it's EMT-P, EMT-I, and EMT-B personnel meet and comply with all federal, state, and local certification and licensing requirements promulgated or adopted pursuant to Wyoming Law.

Familiarity with the Service Area. All responding ambulances based in the response area must have staff familiar with the geography of the Service Area and surrounding areas; and each ambulance must be equipped with an adequate map.

When operating an ambulance, all personnel shall abide by all applicable safety and traffic regulations. Emergency vehicles are to be operated at all times in a safe manner with due regard ~~to~~ for the safety of all persons and property, and in accordance with all applicable laws.

c. Emergency Services Supervisor

Ambulance Company will employ an Emergency Services Supervisor ("EMS Supervisor") who will be responsible for governing the day to day operations and provisions of emergency medical services available to the Service Area, and who will be responsible for the timely reporting as required in this contract.

The EMS Supervisor shall maintain good public relations and ~~be able to~~ attend City and County meetings, as well as ~~be serve as~~ an active participant on the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). ~~and The EMS Supervisor shall~~ have a working knowledge of the County Emergency Operations Plan developed by the Sweetwater County Emergency Management Agency (SCEMA). The EMS Supervisor shall submit monthly reports, which shall include but not be limited to: total number of runs, number of emergency runs, number of transports in the response area and outside, fractile response times and range of response times, information regarding training of personnel, changes in staffing (personnel), changes in equipment (including vehicles), unusual incidents, emergency vehicle accidents, collection on accounts, including the total billed and received for ambulance operations within the response area and the number and amounts of all delinquent accounts and changes in the contractor charges or reimbursement levels for all levels of ambulance service provided.

The EMS Supervisor ~~will~~ shall also compile and forward monthly statistical reports to the Board by the third Wednesday of the following month. Information from the daily Logs and Ambulance Reports for all the 911 or seven digit emergency responses within the Service Area for the month, along with copies of the daily vehicle and equipment inspections records for that month, shall also be maintained and made immediately available at the request of the Board. The EMS Supervisor will be required to attend monthly Board meetings.

**6. VEHICLE AND EQUIPMENT INSPECTIONS & MAINTENANCE**

Each ambulance in service or on standby status shall be licensed and equipped in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, and rules concerning ambulances and the equipment and supplies that are required to be carried by an advanced life support ambulance in the State of Wyoming.

All ambulances shall be clearly identified with the name of the Ambulance Company. Any vehicle used as an ambulance shall be of recent manufacture and shall conform to the construction standards as set forth by federal ambulance manufacturing requirements and standards concerning specifications for emergency ambulances, emergency ambulance equipment, and ambulance services and shall be mechanically sound and in safe operating condition. Each ambulance shall also be subjected to, and pass, a DOT inspection annually.

Each ambulance and all equipment shall be inspected daily using an appropriate checklist. Ambulance Company shall keep copies of all daily ambulance and equipment inspection checklists for at least one year and shall provide the same immediately upon request by the Board.

#### **7. RESPONSE TIMES AND PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO MEET RESPONSE TIMES**

Ambulance Company shall respond to all requests for service received in accordance with the following standards:

Ambulance Response time is defined as the actual time between when a dispatcher notifies the ambulance to respond and the time that the first ambulance arrives at the scene.

##### **A. City Response Time Standard:**

1. All emergency responses within the City of Rock Springs shall be performed as safely and expeditiously as possible. Response times are measured from the time the 911 or seven digit emergency calls were received by the ambulance service until the first ambulance is on scene. Response times within the City of Rock Springs shall maintain a 90% fractional response time (example of report is attached) of eight (8) minutes and fifty nine (59) seconds or less. The Board will evaluate justification for an exception the response time standard in each particular instance on a case-by-case basis. If the Board finds that the justification for the response is reasonable, then the Board may, in its sole discretion, opt not to assess any penalty against the Ambulance Company. All determinations made by the Board as to whether a response time is in excess of the standard will be final.

##### **B. Outside of City Response Time Standard:**

1. Given the large geographical area of the response jurisdiction outside of the City of Rock Springs, the provider will be required to maintain an average en-route time of two (2) minutes and fifty nine (59) seconds or less when responding to these emergent situations.

In the event that any emergency call is not completed within standards outlined above, a Variance Report shall be completed and submitted to the Board at the next monthly meeting of the Board, explaining why the failure occurred.

Possible exceptions for delays may include inclement weather, construction and road closures, disasters situations and other unforeseen circumstances which must be fully described in the exception reports.

The failure of Ambulance Company to complete 90% of its emergency calls within the time parameters outlined above for two (2) consecutive quarters is grounds for termination of the Contract (within the sole discretion of the County) and forfeiture of its **performance bond**.

Failure of Ambulance to meet the monthly requirement ~~of~~ for the appropriate percentage of responses in the parameters outlined above shall result in a penalty against the ambulance service in the amount of \$100.00 per 1/10 percentage point below required level.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, no penalty shall be assessed in the event that the ambulance service can provide evidence reasonably satisfactory to the Board that it acted promptly and reasonably, as determined by Board under the particular facts and circumstances out of which the penalty in question arose.

The actual time that a dispatcher receives a 911 or seven digit emergency request, and all other response times, must be recorded on an Ambulance Report sheet which shows the time that the emergency call was received by the dispatcher, the time that the ambulance service was notified and the time the emergency vehicle arrived on the scene.

The Board will evaluate emergency run time and service on a quarterly basis using a Fractile Response Time Measurement (example of report is attached and is labeled as Appendix B). Emergency runs and response times will be kept by the Sweetwater County Combined Communications Center on a computer aided dispatch (CAD) data base and made immediately available upon the request of the Board.

#### **8. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS AND DOCUMENTATION**

##### **A. General**

Ambulance Company will maintain and will promptly make available to the ~~Sweetwater County Ambulance Service Board~~ Rock Springs Board, the following records and documents:

1. Copies of Ambulance Company's Wyoming Worker's Compensation certificate and related documents showing Ambulance Company is a complying employer under Wyoming's Worker's Compensation law.
2. A complete copy of Ambulance Company's liability insurance policies or contracts of insurance, including all declaration of pages and endorsements.
3. Copies of all vehicles and equipment inspection records.
4. Copies of all daily logs and run reports with run times as they pertain to the this Contract, but information, such as the name of the patient and the house number of The address, will not be disclosed unless Ambulance Company is provided with an executed authorization by the patient.
5. Copies of all Disaster Planning and Disaster Aid Agreements.
6. Copies of Ambulance Company's health and safety programs and other personnel and operational policies, including, but not limited to, documentation of employee safety training, i.e. Hazmat, Driver Training, Infection Control, etc.
7. Copies of all written protocol established pertaining to this Contract.
8. Copies of Ambulance Company's drug licenses for the ambulances based in the response area.
9. Copies of continuing education files for personnel.
10. Copies of insurance company's correspondence regarding review of personnel driving records.

11. Daily Log on all 911 calls (emergency and urgent) runs within the Service Area as described below.
12. Copies or other available documentation of complaints from the public or any user of Ambulance Company's emergency services, a description of the investigation and disposition of the complaint.

Ambulance Company shall keep and maintain separate records and books for the operation of its ambulance services within the Service Area and not combine them with records of any other businesses or operations. These records shall be promptly made available on request of the Board.

**B. Daily Log and Ambulance Reports**

Ambulance Company shall maintain Daily Logs and Ambulance Reports for all 911 and any emergency responses within the response area in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. Ambulance Company shall maintain full records of response time, including:

1. the time the call was received and dispatched;
2. the time the ambulance arrived on the scene;
3. the time the ambulance departed from the scene for the hospital or to clear from the emergency;
4. the time the ambulance arrived at the hospital;
5. the time the ambulance cleared from the emergency.

**9. LIABILITY INSURANCE**

Ambulance Company shall keep, maintain and submit proof of insurance bonding to the Sweetwater County Ambulance Service Board – Rock Springs as follows:

Ambulance Vehicle Liability and uninsured and underinsured coverage with a per accident combined single limit of coverage of at least \$1,000,000. Sweetwater County, Wyoming, shall be named as an additional insured under this coverage: and

Professional Liability insurance coverage, covering Ambulance Company's agents and employees in the amount of \$1,000,000 per person/\$2,000,000 per occurrence. The County shall also be named as an additional insured under the Professional Liability insurance coverage.

Current, valid certificates of insurance should be provided by Ambulance Company to the County for the duration of this Contract which provide that no insurance may be canceled or non-renewed without at least ten (10) days written notice by the insurer to the County.

**10. PERFORMANCE BOND**

Ambulance Company agrees to provide the County with a performance bond, guaranteeing Ambulance Company's performance under the terms and conditions of this Contract. Said performance bond shall be in the amount of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) made payable to the County in the event of Ambulance Company's default of or breach of this Contract.

Said performance bond must be procured within ninety (90) days of the date this ambulance contract is executed.

#### 11. INDEMNITY

Ambulance Company agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County, the Board, and its agents, employees, and affiliates against:

- A. any and all negligent, reckless, willful or wanton, intentional or criminal conduct of Ambulance Company or any of its agents or employees, including attorneys' fees, costs and expenses associated with defending any such claim; and
- B. any costs, expenses, attorneys' fees, liability damages, fines and penalties with respect to claims for worker's compensation, unemployment compensation, or other employee claims for benefits and for Ambulance Company's violation or alleged violation of any federal, state or local law or regulation.

#### 12. MEDICAL CONTROL AND QUALITY ASSURANCE

##### Medical Direction

Prior to the time of the execution of this contract the Ambulance Provider and the Board shall jointly select a qualified Medical Director to serve as the Medical Director of the operations of the Ambulance Company providing services in the response area. The Medical Director ~~will~~ shall be selected from the Memorial Hospital of Sweetwater County Emergency Department (MHSC ED) physician staff.

The Medical Director shall ~~be responsible for evaluating~~ evaluate the quality assurance of service activities of provided by the Ambulance Company, and in evaluating the quality of the service being rendered by the Ambulance Company from a medical perspective.

The Medical Director shall be responsible for the purchase of controlled drugs and other controlled supplies, as well as for issuing and signing written standing orders.

The Medical Director shall follow the directives of the Board in the performance of ~~their~~ his or her duties, including, but not limited to, cooperation with the Memorial Hospital of Sweetwater County.

The Medical Director shall be responsible for the enforcement of all written protocols and current ambulance procedures relative to basic life support as well as advance life support.

At all times relevant to this Contract, Ambulance Company will provide emergency medical services in full compliance with current and then-existing rules and regulations of the Wyoming Office of Emergency Medical Services, and other applicable federal and state laws. Ambulance Company will also provide a copy of the Medical Protocol and evidence that the Medical Director has monitored at least half the emergency transports, as well as submitting quarterly the training and quality assurance results.

The County, by and through its agents, employees or designees (including an outside consulting or auditing entity) retains the right, but not the duty, to audit or evaluate the quality of emergency medical services provided under this Contract.

All complaints regarding services under this Contract shall be resolved by Ambulance Company to the reasonable satisfaction of the ~~Board, the~~ County and/or its designee.

### **13. SUBSIDY PAYMENTS FROM THE COUNTY AND PATIENT CHARGES**

In addition to providing the opportunity to serve as a provider of emergency ALS ambulance service for the County as set forth in this Contract, the County agrees to pay Ambulance Company \_\_\_\_\_ subsidy per year in monthly installments of \_\_\_\_\_ dollars.

Charges for Services Provided by Ambulance Company: The County understands that the Ambulance Company will bill/charge respective patients for the emergency medical services provided under this Contract, above and beyond any subsidy payment that it may receive from the County. Ambulance Company will provide a current schedule of rates to the Board and will notify the Board of any changes to those rates 30 days prior to an increase/decrease. No party or person is entitled to any other additional compensation for any acts performed in connection with this agreement. The amount charged will be determined solely by Ambulance provider. Excessive fees in comparison to service delivery and local costs shall be reason to terminate this agreement.

The parties agree that the initial rates charged to users of emergency medical services shall be as set forth in Appendix C (to be provided by Ambulance Service prior to signing).

Rates and charges may increase up to 4% percent annually. Rates and charges to and reimbursement for emergency medical services to eligible Medicare/Medicaid or welfare recipients shall be in accordance with all federal and state laws, rules and regulations.

Acceptance of Assignment: The Ambulance Company agrees that it will accept assignment for all services provided to Medicare beneficiaries and that it will make reasonable efforts to collect any available coinsurance and deductibles.

Ambulance Membership Programs: The Ambulance Company may conduct an annual ambulance membership program to collect membership fees from residents to help offset the Ambulance Company's cost of providing service and to reduce any necessary subsidy proportionately.

Billing Services: Ambulance Service agrees that it will conduct any billing for services it renders in a manner consistent with all applicable reimbursement and regulatory laws and regulations, as well as all policies established by the federal and state government agencies that oversees ambulance service reimbursement.

If Ambulance Service relies on a third party billing agent, it will enter into an agreement with that billing service requiring it to abide by all applicable reimbursement laws and regulations.

### **14. Ambulance Station Location**

Ambulance Company must locate suitable premises for the ambulance service and will be required to conduct its operations under this Contract from a base location within the Rock Springs City limits. Ambulance Company must ensure that its Rock Springs operation is located so as to perform emergency responses within the Service Area limits in the time parameters set forth in section 7 of this Contract. Said locations will be used to house the staff, ambulances, all equipment and the communications system. If satellite stations are desired by the Board they may be created upon the mutual agreement of the Ambulance Company.

#### **15. COMMUNICATIONS CENTER, DISPATCH PROCESS AND RECORDS**

Ambulance Company and/or the Sweetwater County Joint Communications Center (Center) shall maintain a 24-hour dispatch and call intake center designed, equipped, and professionally staffed to provide for communications to and with the local 911 centers, contractors ambulances and personnel, mutual aid companies, and other public safety entities for which communication is required to provide EMS services to the Service Area.

Ambulance Company shall have and maintain appropriate communications equipment in all of its ambulances, in all dispatching locations and elsewhere as may be necessary to perform the services outlined in this contract.

County Center shall maintain a reputable computer-aided dispatch (CAD) system so as to ensure accurate call taking, dispatch, and preparation of verification reports to demonstrate to the Board that the response time standards are being met, as well as other records regarding performance of service within the Service Area, as the Board may require.

Each ambulance shall be equipped with radio equipment to provide direct on-line communications with the MHSC ED and other regional hospitals.

Ambulance personnel shall utilize without delay all available means of communication in notifying the MHSC ED and the ED physician on duty as to the number and condition of patients being transported.

Ambulance Company will develop, maintain and submit to the Board written protocols pertaining to communication with the emergency rooms, hospitals, the 911 emergency system, and other public safety entities.

Ambulance Company will generate and submit reports identifying response times and other required reports as required by the Board.

#### **16. DISASTER PLAN**

Ambulance Company shall participate in the County Disaster Services Plan for providing emergency medical services to the Service Area; and surrounding areas in the event of a natural or man-made disaster or emergency, including cooperation with Public Service Agencies, comparable disaster service operations in Sweetwater County, Wyoming, MHSC Disaster Plan,; and participation in simulated emergency or disaster exercise.

#### **17. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT**

**Termination upon Default.** Either party may terminate this Agreement upon default. A "default" shall mean a material breach of any provision of this Agreement, according to the language of the Agreement. Should such a default occur, either party shall have the right to terminate the Agreement as of the 30th day following the receipt of a written notice to either party describing such default and intended termination, provided:

Such termination shall be ineffective if within the thirty (30) day period either the defaulting party cures the default; and

Such termination may be stayed, pending cure of the default if action to cure begins during the thirty (30) day period and is successfully completed during a reasonable time after the conclusion of the thirty (30) day period.

**General Termination.** This Agreement may only be terminated under the specific provisions listed below.

The parties hereto agree that this Contract may be terminated and the performance bond forfeited for any of the following reasons:

- a. Revocation or suspension of Ambulance Company's licenses, ambulance permits or provider agreements by the Wyoming Office of Emergency Medical Services, or other governmental agency or regulating agency.
- b. In the event that the Board determines that Ambulance Company is not performing satisfactorily under this Contract, and, upon written notice to Ambulance Company of a particular concern, and Ambulance Company has failed to correct, or failed to implement a plan to correct the concern to the satisfaction of the Board.
- c. Ambulance Company is deemed insolvent under federal or state law, or in the event Ambulance Company's assets and equipment are seized or attached by any governmental agency or by order of any Court.
- d. Failure of Ambulance Company to substantially comply with any federal, state or local statute, regulation; rule or order that has a direct relationship to the parties' performance under this Contract.
- e. Ambulance Company's failure to conduct emergency runs within the time requirement set forth in section 7 of this Contract.
- f. Ambulance Company's failure or inability to meet the staffing, vehicle, and other requirements of this Contract.
- g. This contract may be mutually terminated with six (6) months written notification from either party.

**18. COORDINATION WITH AREA FIRE DEPARTMENT & AREA POLICE DEPARTMENTS**

Mutual Aid. In the event that all Ambulance Service ambulances are being utilized and are therefore unavailable, Ambulance Service shall contact the closest, next available, mutual aid transport unit and have them proceed to the scene. Ambulance Service shall also advise the Communications Center which mutual aid service has been started and "responding from" location. Ambulance Service shall provide a list annually to the Board of mutual aid providers that have agreed to respond with a contact name and number.

In the unusual event when a Fire Department begins transport of a patient, the Ambulance Company agrees to rendezvous with the transporting ambulance when and wherever possible to initiate ALS and ongoing care, if necessary.

Relationship to Fire Department and Special Response Law Enforcement Units

The Ambulance Company shall be required to respond with at least one (1) ambulance unit to any reported structure fires within the Service Area on a daily 24-hour basis.

The responding ambulance unit shall remain at the fire scene until released by the fire officer in charge of the responding fire company. Said response to structure fires shall be at the expense of the Ambulance Company, and shall be to provide emergency protection to fire fighters and law enforcement officers. Emergency services provided to civilians at a fire scene shall be subject to the applicable rate schedule.

Ambulance Service ~~must~~ shall provide an ambulance ~~response~~ to all ~~structure~~ structural, chemical, or ~~other~~ serious emergencies ~~in~~ any Service Area fire department responds ~~to an emergency. to,~~ Ambulance Service shall providing-provide medical support, when requested or on dispatch protocols established by the respective fire department.

Ambulance Service must provide an ambulance response to any requests by the Special Response Law Enforcement Units.

The duties outlined above and to be performed by the Ambulance Company will be provided free of charge.

**19. EXCLUSIVITY OF EMERGENCY SERVICES CONTRACT**

~~The parties agree that Ambulance Company will be the sole entity authorized to provide emergency medical services for the County in the Response Area for the duration of this Contract. Ambulance Company has the obligation, through use of other ambulances outside the Response Area limits and/or emergency medical services via mutual aid agreements or resolutions, to ensure that the proper amount of ambulances are available within the Response Area at all times for the provision of emergency medical services.~~

**20. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

Non-Discrimination. Ambulance Service with-in regard to the services provided by it during the term of this Agreement, shall not discriminate on the grounds of sex, race, religion, color, national origin, handicap, veteran status or ability to pay in the selection and retention of sub-contractors, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment, or against any employee or applicant for employment, to be employed in the performance of this Agreement, with respect to his/her tenure, terms, conditions or privileges of employment or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment. Breach of this covenant may be regarded as a material breach of the Agreement.

Inter-facility Transports. Non-emergency inter-facility transfers between hospitals may be handled only if the Service Area remains covered by the crews and proper vehicles equipped for ALS service to respond to calls within the Service Area.

Emergency Medical Transport of Prisoners. The Ambulance Company shall provide emergency medical transport of prisoners who have been booked into the Sweetwater County Detention Facility from such facility to MHSC, without charge to Sweetwater County.

Wyoming Behavioral Institute Transports. The Ambulance Company shall provide transport of patients requiring medically-necessary ambulance transport, as determined by a physician, to Wyoming Behavioral Institute in Casper, Wyoming, when these patients fall under Wyoming State Statute Title 25, Institutions of The State. These services shall be provided at a rate of \$2750.00 per round trip charge to Sweetwater County.

Community Services. The Ambulance Service must provide free community services such as standbys to civic functions such as high school football games, Public Safety Day, Sweetwater County Fair and various other community health fairs within the Service Area as requested and as it may reasonably provide with existing on-duty personnel and vehicles. These services will be provided free of charge. It is understood by the County that these services will not impede the Ambulance Company obligations to respond to emergencies. If certain events require "committed" ambulance services, the Ambulance Company will be allowed to charge additional fees.

The Ambulance Company shall provide event stand-by services for events that require ambulance stand-by services at the Sweetwater County Events Complex, at the request of the Events Complex administration. The Ambulance Company agrees to be compensated under the terms of an agreement with the Sweetwater County Events Complex.

The Ambulance Company shall provide standby service at no additional charge for all emergency responders in the event of man-made or natural disasters (e.g., ice, snow, wind, flooding, drowning, mass casualty incident, structure fires), or other conditions as determined by Sweetwater County government agencies.

Resources allocated to such events shall be allowed to respond to other concurrent emergencies if no direct on-scene medical emergency is present. Notification and clearance shall be given to do so by the agency commanding the incident.

This requirement shall not require the Ambulance Company to provide stand-by service to wildland fires that will take units out of the population centers of the response area, unless an identified medical emergency exists related to the wildland incident(s).

This requirement shall not require the Ambulance Company to provide stand-by service for incidents involving State or Federal emergencies, unless an identified medical emergency exists related to the emergency.

Audits and Inspections. At any time during normal business hours with seventy-two (72) hours notice, and as often as may be necessary, county representatives who have been designated by the County or Board to do so, may observe Ambulance Company operations. Ambulance Company shall make available to the Board for its examination any information with respect to all matters covered by this Agreement.

The Ambulance Company shall allow County, or its designee, to examine its financial records pertaining to the services provided under this agreement at any time upon reasonable notice.

Sweetwater County Ambulance Service – Rock Springs Board Meetings. A service review meeting will be held monthly between the Board and Ambulance Company or their designees. This meeting may be cancelled at any time if mutually agreed to by both parties.

Severability. In the event that any provision of this Contract shall be held invalid, unenforceable or overboard, in whole or in part, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the provisions of this Contract shall not be affected thereby and shall continue to have full force and effect, except and only to the extent that the underlying purpose of the Contract would be frustrated.

Jurisdiction and Applicable Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed and interpreted under the laws of the State of Wyoming, and the parties to this Contract hereby consent and submit themselves to the sole and exclusive jurisdiction of the ~~Common Pleas~~Third District Court of Sweetwater County, Wyoming, for the purposes of any legal action or proceeding arising out of or in connection with this Contract, and both parties hereto waive any contention that such court is an improper venue.

The Ambulance Company shall comply with all HIPAA Guidelines, federal, state, and local laws, rules and regulations governing the provision of ambulance services in accordance with this Agreement.

HIPAA Compliance Clause – Provider shall adhere to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA), Public Law 104-191, which was enacted on August 21, 1996. The Privacy Rule standards address the use and disclosure of individuals' health information – called "protected health information" by organizations subject to the Privacy Rule – called "covered entities," as well as standards for individuals' privacy rights to understand and control how their health information is used.

Provider shall provide monthly HIPAA Compliance call sheets to the County that shall consist of number of calls, amount billed, amount collected, bad debt write-offs, non-transport calls (otherwise known as "dry runs"), and transfers to other medical facilities.

Provider shall provide to the Sweetwater County Ambulance District Board a monthly schedule for coverage.

Amendment. This Contract may be amended or modified only by a writing duly executed by each of the parties hereto.

Entire Agreement. The parties agree and understand that this Agreement and the prior executed Legal Notice -Invitation To Bid Agreement (This prior executed Legal Notice- Invitation to Bid Agreement and all the terms and conditions therein stated are incorporated within this agreement by reference as if that entire agreement was re-written herein) is the entire agreement and understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any previous agreement or understanding, whether oral or otherwise. No modification of this Agreement shall be valid unless in writing and signed by each of the parties hereto.

Non-Assign ability. Neither this Agreement nor any rights, privileges or duties rising there from may be assigned, transferred or delegated, without the express written permission of the other party, except that Ambulance Company may assign this Agreement in whole or in part to any of its current parents, subsidiaries or affiliates under common control or ownership with Ambulance Company.

No Waiver. No waiver by either party, at any time, of any branch, by the other party or failure by the other party to comply with any condition or provision of this Contract shall be deemed a waiver of the applicable provision of the Contract, or of that party's future right to terminate the Contract for the other party's breach.

Headings. The headings contained herein are for reference only and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of any provision of this Contract.

Notice. Every notice or other communication required or permitted to be given herein shall be in writing and shall be delivered either by hand-delivery, or by first-class mail, postage pre-paid, registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the parties at the following addresses:

Sovereign Immunity. The County does not waive sovereign immunity by entering into this Contract and the County does not waive governmental immunity, and it specifically retains all immunities and defenses available to it as a governmental entity pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 1-39-101,et seq., and all other applicable law.

## SWEETWATER COUNTY-SKYWEST REVENUE AGREEMENT

THIS SWEETWATER COUNTY-SKYWEST REVENUE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") made and entered into as of the \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 20\_\_\_, by and between SkyWest Airlines, Inc., ("SkyWest Airlines") and the Sweetwater County Commission ("County").

### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, SkyWest Airlines is a regional air transportation carrier serving the United States and Canada and will operate this service as Delta Connection, a code-share partner with Delta Airlines

WHEREAS, SkyWest Airlines agrees to provide scheduled air service between Rock Springs, Wyoming (RKS), and Salt Lake City, Utah (SLC) on the terms and conditions set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the above recitals and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto, intending to be legally bound, hereby agree as follows:

1. Scheduled Service. SkyWest Airlines shall provide scheduled service between Rock Springs and Salt Lake City, with the schedules in Exhibit A as an example of anticipated service, using EMB-120 or equivalent aircraft (each flight segment scheduled for a single day is hereinafter referred to as a "Scheduled Flight" and all such flight segments are hereinafter referred to collectively as "Scheduled Flights").

SkyWest has full discretion in setting the schedule times and frequency of its flights, save that it will schedule no less than two round trips daily. Such decisions will be based upon, but not limited to, aircraft, staff, crew, gate availability, business necessity and weather and seasonal changes. Flights will be scheduled by SkyWest Airlines at reasonable times and will be posted in advance. Flight schedules are subject to change.

All travel covered by this agreement is subject to applicable tariffs and other rules and regulations.

2. Margin Requirement. Agency hereby guarantees that SkyWest Airlines shall receive a 5% margin for each calendar month and for the term of this Agreement as outlined in Exhibit B, subject to the caps and limitations set forth in Section 7 hereof.

3. Revenue Sharing. SkyWest Airlines receives prorated passenger revenues from Delta Airlines and other validating carriers for tickets sold on Scheduled Flights. For passengers who purchase a ticket that includes a segment beyond RKS-SLC, Delta and SkyWest and/or SkyWest and all other carriers will prorate the interline revenue. Revenue from Interline Travel will be

prorated in accordance with the provisions of the Multilateral Prorate Agreement ("MPA"). For local RKS-SLC origin and destination passengers, "Revenue" shall mean actual revenues received by SkyWest Airlines for tickets purchased by passengers in each calendar month for the Scheduled Flights and collectively during the term of this Agreement, less taxes and fees. All fares are those prevailing on date of ticket purchase. These revenues shall be aggregated as set forth in Paragraphs 2 and 7.

4. Airline Employee Travel. All of Delta Airlines' and SkyWest Airlines' employee pass agreements are valid for these flights. Except for company business, all SkyWest pass agreements are based on space available travel and do not displace revenue passengers. No revenues attributable to employee travel shall be included within the definition of Revenues.

5. Fuel Costs. Fuel costs for purposes of subsidy calculation and the total costs will be the actual fuel costs, including related fueling costs, taxes and fees, associated with operating the scheduled service.

6. Term. The term of this agreement is 1 January, 2014, through 30 June, 2014. Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, if Agency shall fail to pay the amounts due SkyWest Airlines hereunder within the time agreed and such failure shall continue for 10 days after a demand for payment from SkyWest Airlines, then SkyWest Airlines shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon five days written notice to the County. If SkyWest Airlines does not achieve 5% margin for one quarter, then either Party may thereafter cancel this Agreement upon five days written notice to the other party. This Agreement and SkyWest's operations hereunder are being conducted under SkyWest's code-share agreement with Delta Airlines. If Delta Airlines shall object to such flights or impose any financial penalty or additional financial obligations on SkyWest Airlines as a result of this Agreement, or if Delta Airlines shall cancel its code share agreement with SkyWest Airlines or amend it in any way which prohibits or unreasonably restricts, in SkyWest's sole judgment, SkyWest Airlines from flying these flights under its code share agreement with Delta Airlines, or if Delta Airlines adds additional financial obligations on SkyWest Airlines as a condition of allowing such flights, then SkyWest Airlines shall have the right to terminate this Agreement upon five days written notice to Agency.

In the event that WYDOT, the County, and SkyWest agree to enter into a different type of agreement (such as the Master Plan with jet service currently being discussed), this agreement will be prorated within the month that the change takes place. All completed months prior to the change will be calculated as usual and this contract will terminate with the commencement of any new agreement.

7. Payment of Subsidy. SkyWest Airlines completes its accounting for each month approximately two to three weeks after the close of the month. Soon after this occurs, a statement will be sent which shall show the final revenues and costs for the preceding calendar month. The statement will show all calculations for the subsidy, including revenue and total

costs. Total costs are the sum of non-fuel costs and fuel costs. Fuel cost calculations are outlined in section 5 of this agreement. Non-fuel costs shall be calculated by multiplying the block hours associated with the market by \$1,675 for the EMB 120. The rate includes the 5% margin and all non-fuel costs. Each quarter the amounts will be calculated and summarized with the total costs (non fuel and fuel costs) and revenues in an invoice. To the extent the County owes SkyWest Airlines a subsidy for such quarter, it shall pay to SkyWest Airlines, within 15 days of its receipt of such invoice, the full amount owed. To the extent SkyWest Airlines' revenues for such calendar month were greater than the total costs, the County shall have no monthly payment obligation to SkyWest Airlines for such month or partial month as the case may be. At the end of the term of this Agreement, SkyWest shall prepare a report to the County showing total revenues and total costs for the 6 month term of this Agreement. In the event that SkyWest changes the aircraft type utilized to operate the service, the non-fuel block hour rates will be renegotiated to reflect the appropriate equipment type. The maximum obligation of the county to SkyWest will not increase in the aggregate amount owed as a result of a change in aircraft type. In no event shall the County be obligated to pay SkyWest Airlines an aggregate amount in excess of \$919,300.

8. Audit Rights. SkyWest Airlines' calculation of the total amount due shall be binding and conclusive, provided that Agency shall have the right upon reasonable notice, to examine the business records of SkyWest Airlines relating to such calculation and to dispute the amount within thirty (30) days of such examination, if this examination reveals errors or irregularities in SkyWest Airlines' accounting practices. Such audit must be conducted no later than six months after the end of the term of this Agreement. If any audit indicates a discrepancy between the amounts paid or the amounts that should have been paid hereunder, such amounts shall be promptly paid to the applicable party, subject to SkyWest Airlines' right to dispute the audit results. Any such audit shall not unreasonably interfere with the day-to-day operations of SkyWest Airlines or any of its employees. The Agency and its auditors will be required to enter confidentiality and nondisclosure agreements prior to reviewing SkyWest's business records, subject to disclosure in accordance with law.

9. Termination. This agreement is subject to unilateral termination in the sole discretion of the County or SkyWest Airlines upon 90 days written notice by either party to the other in accordance with the Notice Provision of this agreement.

10. Reports. Within sixty (60) days of the end of each month, SkyWest Airlines may provide the following information by non-directional route and total:

- Total revenue passengers
- Revenue
- Average fare
- Flights operated
- Block hours

During the term of this Agreement, SkyWest Airlines shall provide additional information, as reasonably requested by the County, to determine the amount of subsidy likely to be required per the terms of this Agreement. The financial information given to the County shall be considered confidential and is not to be disclosed publicly.

11. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may be modified or amended only by writing signed by the party against whom enforcement of the modification or amendment is sought. All provisions of this Agreement intended to survive beyond the term of this Agreement as set forth in Section 7 shall survive as long as required for their intent to be completed.

12. No Assumption of Liability. The County and all affiliated entities hereby disclaim any and all liability to passengers or other third parties associated with the Scheduled Flights. Such liability is solely the responsibility of SkyWest Airlines and this Agreement may not be construed as an assumption of liability on the part of the County.

13. Best Efforts in Promotional Activities. The county agrees that it will use commercially reasonable efforts to promote the scheduled flights in such a way as to maximize the public awareness of the availability of the scheduled flights.

14. Governing Law. The construction, interpretation and enforcement of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wyoming. The courts of the State of Wyoming shall have jurisdiction over this Agreement and the parties, and the venue shall be the State or federal courts located in Wyoming. The parties acknowledge and agree that this subsection does not waive, limit or otherwise affect or reduce the full operation and effect of the provision in this Agreement relating to the State's and the County's full retention of all rights of sovereign immunity.

15. Notices. All notices and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given (i) when delivered personally, (ii) when received by the addressee, if sent by Express Mail, Federal Express or other express delivery service (receipt requested), or (iii) three business days after being sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, in each case to the other party at the following addresses (or to such other address for a party as shall be specified by like notice; provided that notices of a change of address shall be effective only upon receipt thereof):

16. Counterparts. This Agreement is comprised of 9 typed pages including exhibits and may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. This Agreement may be executed by facsimile signatures, each of which will be deemed an original.

17. Mutual Understandings. This Agreement has been freely and fairly negotiated by the parties hereto and each party has been provided the opportunity to have the Agreement reviewed by legal counsel of its choice and to modify the terms hereof and, therefore, this Agreement shall be construed and interpreted without any presumption, or other rule, requiring construction or interpretation against the interest of the party causing this Agreement to be drafted. This Agreement embodies the entire understanding between the parties and supersedes and cancels all prior understandings and agreements, whether oral or written.

18. Attorney's Fees. In the event that a dispute arises between the parties concerning this agreement, the parties shall make good faith efforts to resolve the matter without resorting to litigation and incurring legal fees. If, however, a resolution cannot be reached and the parties engage attorneys and resort to the state or federal courts for redress, the prevailing party in such action shall be entitled to recover its costs, including reasonable attorney's fees, of pursuing or defending any such action.

19. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be liable for failure to perform under this Agreement if such failure to perform arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the non-performing party. Such causes may include, but are not limited to, acts of God or the public enemy, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, freight embargoes, unusually severe weather, breakdowns in aircraft or availability of parts, strikes or labor disruptions or other causes which prevent SkyWest Airlines from flying the Scheduled Flights. The obligation to pay money is not subject to the provisions of this Section 19.

20. Assignment/Contract Not Used as Collateral. Neither party shall assign or otherwise transfer any of the rights or delegate any of the duties set forth in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other party.

21. Availability of Funds. Each payment obligation of the County is conditioned upon the availability of government funds that are appropriated or allocated for the payment of this obligation. If funds are not allocated and available for the continuance of the services performed by SkyWest Airlines, this Agreement may be terminated by the County at the end of the period for which the funds are available. The County shall notify SkyWest Airlines at the earliest possible time of the services that will or may be affected by a shortage of funds. No penalty shall accrue to the County in the event this provision is exercised, and the County shall not be obligated or liable for any future payments due or for any damages as a result of termination under this section. This provision shall not be construed to permit the County to terminate this Agreement to acquire similar services from another party nor relieve the County from payment responsibility for services that have been provided under this Agreement.

22. Award of Related Contracts. The County may undertake or award supplemental or successor contracts for work related to this Agreement. If such contracts create competitive air services that negatively affects SkyWest Airlines' load factors, SkyWest Airlines may seek a higher subsidy or immediately cancel this Agreement.

23. Independent Contractor. SkyWest Airlines shall function as an independent contractor for the purposes of this Agreement, and shall not be considered an employee of the State of Wyoming for any purpose. SkyWest Airlines shall assume sole responsibility for any debts or liabilities that may be incurred by SkyWest Airlines in fulfilling the terms of this Agreement, and shall be solely responsible for the payment of all federal, state and local taxes which may accrue because of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement shall be interpreted as authorizing SkyWest Airlines or its agents and/or employees to act as an agent or representative for or on behalf of the State of Wyoming or the County, or to incur any obligation of any kind on the behalf of the State of Wyoming or the County. SkyWest Airlines agrees that no health/hospitalization benefits, workers' compensation and/or similar benefits available to the State of Wyoming employees will inure to the benefit of SkyWest Airlines or SkyWest Airlines' agents and/or employees as a result of Agreement.

24. Kickbacks. SkyWest Airlines certifies and warrants that no gratuities, kickbacks or contingency fees were paid in connection with this Agreement, nor were any fees, commissions, gifts or other considerations made contingent upon the award of this Agreement. If SkyWest Airlines breaches or violates this warranty, the County may, at its discretion, terminate this Agreement without liability to the County, or deduct from this Agreement price or consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of any commission, percentage, brokerage or contingency fee.

25. Sovereign Immunity. Except for the breach of this Agreement, the State of Wyoming and the County do not waive sovereign immunity by entering into this Agreement, except to the extent necessary for the parties to pursue a contract action to clarify or enforce the written terms of this Agreement. In all other situations, the State of Wyoming and the County specifically retain immunity and all defenses available to them as sovereigns pursuant to Wyo. Stat. § 1-39-104(a),

and all other state law. The parties agree that any ambiguity in this Agreement shall not be strictly construed, either against or for either party, except that any ambiguity as to sovereign immunity shall be construed in favor of sovereign immunity.

26. Compliance with Laws. SkyWest Airlines shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations in the performance of this Agreement.

27. Third Party Beneficiary Rights. The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary and this Agreement shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Agreement shall operate only between the parties to this Agreement, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement. The provisions of this Agreement are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this Agreement.
