Catering Permits

Approval of 24 Hour Catering Permit for Santa Fe Trail, Inc. for the Solvay Picnic & Approval of Catering Permit for Santa Fe Trail, Inc for the Jim Bridger Power Plant Employee Picnic

County Clerk Dale Davis explained that Santa Fe Trail, Inc. requested two (2) 24 hour Catering Permits; one for the Solvay Picnic scheduled for July 11, 2015 and the second for the Jim Bridger Power Plant Employee picnic scheduled for July 25, 2015. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to approve the catering permits for Santa Fe Trail, Inc. *Commissioner Kolb moved to approve the Santa Fe Trails request for July 11, 2015 and July 25, 2015 for catering permits contingent upon the approval of Rock Springs City Council. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* The motion carried.

Commissioner Comments/Reports

Commissioner West

Commissioner West reported on his liaison meetings for the Board of Health; Southwest Counseling discussing Title 25 issues; and Memorial Hospital of Sweetwater County sharing that they have infrastructure capital needs. Commissioner West queried Public Works Director John Radosevich regarding the Salt/Sand structure.

Commissioner Kolb

Commissioner Kolb reported that he attended the City of Rock Springs Council meeting to request a letter of support for the National High School Finals Rodeo. Commissioner Kolb noted that he attended the Events Complex Board meeting, the Fiscal Year 2015-16 adoption of the budget meeting, and shared information with the commission regarding Wamsutter EMS response. Commissioner Kolb shared that he attended Flaming Gorge Days celebration.

Chairman Johnson

Chairman Johnson shared information regarding a Title 25 Committee meeting that he attended and shared that he, along with Public Lands Specialist Mark Kot, met with WY Game and Fish relative to issues involving the Rock Springs RMP. Chairman Johnson noted that he met with federal agencies and spoke of a proposal for the Marsh Creek boat ramp. Chairman Johnson also shared that a request has been made to have a designated short term 15-30 minute parking space outside of the courthouse for people with special mobility needs and spoke that he was in favor of the request but that it would be an issue for the City of Green River to address. Chairman Johnson also addressed blading of county roads.

Commissioner Van Matre

Commissioner Van Matre reported that he visited the Bicentennial Park in Eden, attended the Public Hearing for the budget, participated in the Flaming Gorge Days celebration, and visited the county picnic grounds. Commissioner Van Matre also noted that he spoke with IT Director Tim Knight.

Chairman Johnson shared a report from Facilities Manager Chuck Radosevich.

County Resident Concerns

Chairman Johnson opened county resident concerns. Shirley Delambert, resident of Eden Valley, shared her concerns relative to the Eden Valley Solid Waste Board appointment. After discussion, Chairman Johnson thanked her for coming before the board. Hearing no further comments, resident concerns was closed.

Break

Chairman Johnson called for a break.

Action/Presentation Items

Parks & Recreation Board Appointment (to fill Ryan Van Kam's unexpired term through 7-1-17)

Following discussion, *Commissioner Van Matre moved to appoint Tracy Ciepiela. Commissioner West seconded the motion.* The motion carried.

Corporation for National & Community Service's AmeriCorps VISTA Program Support Letter

Chairman Johnson shared that the commission was presented with a letter of support from Young at Heart Senior Center Executive Director Jeanine Cox regarding the Corporation for National & Communities Service VISTA Program. Following discussion, *Commissioner West moved to approve the letter of support for the Young at Heart application to the Corporation for National and Community Service's AmeriCorps Vista Program. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* The motion carried.

Contract for Rock Springs Roof Project

Purchasing Manager Marty Dernovich and Facilities Manager Chuck Radosevich presented the results from the bid opening for the 731 C Street re-roofing project and asked for authorization to award the bid to Big Horn Roofing, Inc. for a sum of \$133,440.00. Following discussion, *Commissioner West moved to approve the re-roofing contract with Big Horn Roofing out of Laramie, Wyoming for the C street office building in Rock Springs. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* The motion carried with Commissioner Kolb voting in opposition.

Approval to Donate Surplus Vehicle

Purchasing Manager Marty Dernovich explained that the Rock Springs-Sweetwater County Airport and the Town of Superior have both requested a surplus vehicle. Following discussion, it was decided to wait until the full list was completed and available before filling the request.

Request Approval for Mutual Aid Agreement with Sublette County Unified Fire Department

County Fire Warden Mike Bournazian presented the Sweetwater County Fire Department and Sublette County Unified Fire Department Fire Protection Agreement. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson asked for a motion to approve the Sweetwater County Fire Department and Sublette County Unified Fire Department Fire Protection Agreement. *Commissioner West moved to approve and authorize the Chairman to sign. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.* The motion carried.

Award of the 2015 Paint Striping & 2015 High Risk Rural Road Projects

Public Works Director John Radosevich presented the results from the 2015 Paint Striping bid opening that was held on June 30, 2015 and recommended to award the bid to S&L Industrial for a sum of \$255,920.00 and authorize the Chairman to sign all necessary documents. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson asked for a motion. **Commissioner Van Matre so moved. Commissioner West seconded the motion.** The motion carried.

Mr. Radosevich presented the results of the Rural Roads Paint Striping bid opening that was held on June 30, 2015 and asked for a motion to award the bid to S&L Industrial for a sum of \$110,978.20 and authorize the Chairman to sign all necessary documents. Following discussion, **Commissioner West so moved. Commissioner Kolb seconded the motion.** The motion carried.

Request to Staff Vacant Position in the Attorney's Office

Human Resource Specialist Brenda Rael requested authorization to staff an investigator position in the County Attorney's Office and explained that the position was approved during the FY 16 budget. Following discussion, **Commissioner Kolb moved to approve the request. Commissioner Van Matre seconded the motion.** The motion carried.

Request to Staff Vacant Position in the Sheriff's Office

Human Resource Specialist Brenda Rael and Captain Rick Hawkins requested authorization to change a Patrol position to be reclassified as a Captain's position in the Sheriff's Department and explained that the position was approved during the FY 16 budget. Following discussion, Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to approve the request from Sheriff Lowell. **Commissioner Van Matre moved to approve the request.** With the lack of a second, the motion was defeated. Commissioner Kolb shared that he supports the sheriff but would like clarity so that the right choices are made and requested that Sheriff Lowell come before the commission. Commissioner West shared that he feels there are too many administrative positions.

Executive Session(s)-Personnel/Legal

Chairman Johnson entertained a motion to enter into executive session for certain real estate issues and an update on personnel. **Commissioner Kolb made a motion to go into executive session. Commissioner West seconded the motion.** The motion carried. A quorum of the commission was present.

After coming out of executive session, Chairman Johnson explained that no action was required.

There being no further business to come before the Board this day, the meeting was adjourned subject to the call of the Chairman.

Interlocal Agreement

**Between the City of Rock Springs, the City of Green River and the County of Sweetwater,
Wyoming.**

Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program Award 2015

This agreement is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2015, by and between the County of Sweetwater, acting by and through its governing body, Sweetwater County Commission, hereinafter referred to as "County" and the City of Rock Springs, acting by and through its governing body, the Rock Springs City Council, hereinafter referred to as "City of Rock Springs", and the City of Green River, acting by and through its governing body, the Green River City Council, hereinafter referred to as "City of Green River", all within the County of Sweetwater, State of Wyoming, witnesseth:

WHEREAS, each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental function hereunder, shall make that performance of those payments from current revenues legally available to that party: and

WHEREAS, each governing body finds that the performance of this Agreement is in the best interest of all parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the division of costs fairly compensates the performing party for the services or functions performed under this agreement: and

WHEREAS, the FY 2015 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) award from the Bureau of Justice Assistance, (BJA) allocates available funding based on UCR Part 1 crime within their jurisdictions and for JAG purposes, these entities remain a partner receiving funds and must be a signatory on a required Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) or Agreement.

WHEREAS, the FY 2015 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) allocated the funding as follows.

- Sweetwater County \$0
- City of Green River \$14,979
- City of Rock Springs \$17,077

NOW THEREFORE, the County, the City of Green River and the City of Rock Springs agree as follows:

Section 1.

PROVIDER AGREEMENT

This agreement (the "Agreement") dated the 1st day of July, 2015, by and between Natrona County, Wyoming, acting by and through its Board of County Commissioners and the Natrona County Sheriff (hereinafter "Provider"); and the Board of County Commissioners of Sweetwater County, Wyoming and the Sweetwater County Sheriff (hereinafter "Sweetwater County").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Sweetwater County is desirous of having the Provider provide juvenile detention services and sentencing options to Courts and Law Enforcement in Sweetwater County when space is available at the Natrona County Regional Detention Center; and

WHEREAS, this function necessitates the need for supervision, administration and coordination; and

WHEREAS, the Provider represents that it is ready, willing, and able to provide the professional services to Sweetwater as required by this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Sweetwater County desires to retain the Provider to perform such services.

WHEREAS, Provider has contracted with Cornerstone Programs Corporation to operate the Natrona County Regional Juvenile Detention Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged, the parties, intending to be bound, agree as follows:

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

Provider shall perform the following services:

- A. Provider will operate a secure and safe Regional Juvenile Detention Center ("RJDC") meeting the requirements of applicable State standards for the detention of a population not to exceed the maximum number of juveniles allowed by the certifying authority; housing the following juveniles when space is available at the RJDC:
1. Juveniles sentenced or held pursuant to the order of the court to serve a period of detention or held pending arraignment.
 2. Juveniles held awaiting transport to a State facility after sentencing by the Court to serve a period of incarceration.

3. Juveniles placed under an agreement with other State, Federal or local governments.
 4. Juveniles arrested for violations of state statute by any State law enforcement agency and/or municipal police officers.
- B. Provider will provide routine health care screenings at Intake for juveniles at the RJDC. Provider reserves the right to refuse detainees who suffer from serious health conditions which cause a threat to the proper care of the detainee or an undue burden of care on the Provider. Provider provides on-site nursing services for sick call, to facilitate medications, and for minor medical care not requiring a physician's attention. Provider will ensure that provisions are made for emergency services for each juvenile detainee, outside of the routine and non-emergency health care provided by Provider. Provider will not be financially responsible for the costs of any health care provided outside the facility including, but not limited to clinic visits, doctor visits, prescriptions, emergency room or hospitalization etc., unless incurred as a result of provider's actions or inactions.
- C. The Provider will prepare a detailed accounting of medical expenses of the juvenile who received medical services. Sweetwater County agrees to reimburse the Provider for any medical expenses for juveniles placed by Sweetwater County paid by the Provider that were not incurred as a result of the Provider's actions or inactions. Sweetwater is responsible for prescription drugs and other prescribed medical equipment and care for juveniles placed by Sweetwater County at the RJDC. For specialized medical appointments within Natrona County, Provider's secured transport division will provide transportation. Specialized medical appointments outside of Natrona County will be facilitated by Provider's secured transport division at a cost to Sweetwater County of the current federal GSA per diem rate in effect at the time of such transport.
- D. Provider will provide for transportation of juveniles for court ordered functions and hearings. Provider will bill for such transportation at the rate proscribed by the federal GSA per diem in effect at the time of transport.
- E. Provider will provide for education, recreation and counseling programs for each juvenile to include the following:
1. Educational instruction will be conducted by the Natrona County School district and will meet applicable State educational standards, for the minimum amount of weekly classroom time required by the Wyoming Department of Education. Any reimbursement received by provider from the Department of Education for these services shall not reduce the daily rate of the Placement Agency as provided for herein.
 2. Weekly counseling programs to include basic life skills groups, substance

abuse education and relapse prevention, and vocational, elective and cognitive skills programming.

3. A minimum of one (1) hour per day structured recreation programming.

F. The Provider shall have a procedure for systematically assessing each juvenile for their individual criminal risks, criminogenic needs, suicidal tendencies and responsiveness to various intervention strategies. The Provider shall use the assessment protocol to determine housing classification, group activities, counseling program, treatment recommendations and compatibility of juveniles.

1. No juvenile shall come into any contact with an adult inmate while at the facility. No juveniles shall be housed in a detention area allowing sight or sound access to adult inmates.
2. Provider shall comply with State and Federal requirements regarding juvenile detention.
3. Sweetwater County will have full access to operational records specific to those juveniles detained for Sweetwater County and may conduct reviews of use-of-force and criminal incidents related to those juveniles.

PLACE OF PERFORMANCE:

- A. The services of the Provider will be rendered at the Natrona County Regional Juvenile Detention Center, Casper, Wyoming, (the Premises"). At the discretion of the Provider, in consultation with the Sheriff, services may also be provided at the Southeastern Wyoming Juvenile Center located at 3304 East 1-80 Service Road, Laramie County, Wyoming for space considerations. All costs of such transportation will be borne by the Provider.

TERM OF AGREEMENT:

- A. The services of the Provider will commence upon July 1, 2015 and extend for twenty-four (24) months from that date.

COMPENSATION:

- A. In consideration of the performance of services rendered under this Agreement, the Provider shall be compensated for services performed in accordance herewith in the amount of \$195.00 per day per juvenile, plus any additional expenses provided in this Agreement, including but not limited to, medical expenses and transportation cost.

METHOD OF PAYMENT:

- A. Payment will be made in the following manner. Upon receipt of a voucher for payment from the Provider specifying that the Provider has performed the services in conformance with the Agreement, Sweetwater County shall promptly remit payment to Provider
- B. Payments on invoices will be made by Sweetwater County within forty-five (45) days of receipt.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

- A. **Termination of Agreement** – Sweetwater County or Provider may terminate this Agreement by providing thirty (30) days written notice to other party of intent to terminate this Agreement. Notice of violation of the terms of the Agreement shall be given in writing to the other party. Loss of licensure may, at the option of Sweetwater County, result in immediate termination.
- B. **Assignment** - The Provider shall not assign any interest in this Agreement without the prior written approval of Sweetwater County.
- C. **Findings Confidential** - All reports, information, data, studies, surveys, juvenile information or other intelligence or communications of whatever sort, kept in any medium, given to, prepared by, assembled by or otherwise in the possession of the Provider or Sweetwater County under this Agreement, shall be deemed confidential and shall not be made available to any third party by the Provider or Sweetwater County without the order of a Court of competent jurisdiction, or the written consent of the parties hereto.
- D. **Governing Law** - This Agreement has been executed by the parties hereto on the day and year first above written and shall be governed by the laws of the State of Wyoming.
- E. **Intent** – Sweetwater County and Provider each represent that it has read and agrees to the terms of this Agreement and further agrees that it is the intent of the parties hereto that Provider shall perform all of the services to be provided hereunder for the compensation set forth herein. Provider agrees that it has made a careful examination of the services to be rendered hereunder, and that the Agreement price set forth herein above is adequate compensation for all the services to be rendered under the terms of this Agreement.
- F. **Wyoming Governmental Claims Act** - No waiver of any immunity or limitation of liability afforded by the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act is intended by the parties, and that Natrona County, Natrona County Sheriff, Sweetwater County, and Sweetwater County Sheriff retain all such immunities and limitations of liability.

G. Third Party Beneficiary Rights. The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of third party beneficiary, and this Agreement shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this Agreement shall operate only between the parties to this Agreement, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this Agreement. The provisions of this Agreement are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this Agreement.

**AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Amendment is entered into by and between the Sweetwater County Conservation District, hereinafter referred to as "the District: and Sweetwater County, herein after referred to as "the County".

WHEREAS, the County and the District entered into a Memorandum of Understanding signed by the County on January 20, 2015 and by the District on January 8, 2015 wherein the County granted the District access to certain properties owned by the County for the purposes of conducting water quality and soil data collection monitoring activities; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend said agreement to add an additional property to the list of properties covered by said agreement.

NOW THEREFORE it is agreed as follows:

1. Paragraph 5 of said agreement is amended to include the property located in the West Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 31 Resurvey Township 20 North, Range 102 West of the 6th P.m., Sweetwater County Wyoming more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto. REGARDING MITIGATION OF ADVERSE EFFECTS
TO 48SW18892, PERU CUTOFF BRIDGE
WYDOT PROJECT CN04106

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the Wyoming Department of Transportation (WYDOT), and Sweetwater County will implement replacement of 48SW18892 on Sweetwater County Road 4-37; and

WHEREAS, FHWA and WYDOT have determined, and the Wyoming State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) concurs that, by virtue of its association with the NRHP eligible Lincoln Highway and its distinctive characteristics of a type, period, and method of construction, 48SW18892 is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A and C of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 as amended through 2014 (16 U.S.C. 470; 36 CFR § 60) and that replacement of this structure will constitute an adverse effect, and is depicted in Appendix A; and

WHEREAS, FHWA and WYDOT have determined that the 1985 Programmatic Agreement between FHWA, WYDOT, the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) and SHPO *Regarding Management of Historic Bridges in Wyoming Which Must Be Replaced or Rehabilitated* is not applicable to this project; and

WHEREAS, FHWA and WYDOT have determined that there are no reasonable and prudent alternatives by which to avoid or minimize adverse effects to 48SW18892 in accordance with DOT Section 4(f) (49 U.S.C. 303; 23 CFR § 774), and the SHPO has concurred; and

WHEREAS, the Sweetwater County Historical Museum, the Lincoln Highway Association, Tracks Across Wyoming, the Alliance for Historic Wyoming, Fort Bridger Historic Association, Sweetwater County Historical Society, Green River Historic Preservation Commission, and A. Dudley Gardner, Historian were invited to participate; and

WHEREAS, Sweetwater County, the Sweetwater County Historical Museum, the Lincoln Highway Association, and Tracks Across Wyoming, and A. Dudley Gardner, Historian have been invited to participate as invited signatories to this agreement, and they have accepted; and

WHEREAS, the Alliance for Historic Wyoming has been invited to participate as a concurring party to this agreement, and they have accepted; and

WHEREAS, FHWA has notified the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (ACHP) in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470f; 36 CFR § 800.6(a)(1)) and the ACHP has chosen not to participate; and

NOW, THEREFORE, FHWA, WYDOT, SHPO, SWEETWATER COUNTY, THE SWEETWATER COUNTY HISTORICAL MUSEUM, THE LINCOLN HIGHWAY ASSOCIATION, TRACKS ACROSS WYOMING, and concurring parties agree that the undertaking will be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effects of the project on historic properties and these stipulations shall govern the project and all of its parts until this MOA expires or is terminated.

I. STIPULATIONS

A. FHWA and WYDOT shall ensure that the following stipulations are implemented.

1. Completion of large format photography consistent with the Historic American Engineering Record (HAER) program standards by reimbursing SHPO for supplies and travel expenses. WYDOT shall distribute digital copies of the photographs to all signatories and in addition provide a print copy of the photographs to the Sweetwater County Historical Museum. WYDOT shall consult with the National Park Service as to the appropriate level of HAER documentation.
2. Prior to demolition of 48SW18892, WYDOT's contractor shall salvage the commemorative manufacturer's plaque attached to the bridge. WYDOT shall give the plaque to the Sweetwater County Museum.
3. WYDOT and/or its consultant shall complete historic research and prepare text and graphics for an interpretive brochure. The topics for the brochure will be the evolution of the highway system emphasizing the various Lincoln Highway alignments from Green River to the Sweetwater/Uinta County line, as well as the change in bridge technology from riveted to welded plate girder construction. The brochure shall include maps, photographs, and LiDAR imagery as appropriate. The format and design of the brochure shall be consistent with other Lincoln Highway related brochures being created by WYDOT. WYDOT shall send drafts of the brochure to the signatories of this agreement for review and comment. Upon the completion of the design of the brochure, WYDOT shall print 10,000 copies and distribute them along with the electronic version to the Lincoln Highway Association, Sweetwater County Historical Museum, Tourism, Green River Chamber of Commerce and other organizations as appropriate.

4. WYDOT shall ensure that the procedures outlined in Section 112.1 of the Wyoming Department of Transportation's 2010 Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction are followed for any unanticipated discoveries.

B. SHPO shall ensure that the following stipulations are implemented.

1. SHPO shall have 48SW18892 photographed to National Park Service HAER standards and will submit an invoice to WYDOT for reimbursement.

2. SHPO shall post the HAER photographs to their online photo database and provide digital copies to the Wyoming State Archives.

3. Review and provide comments on drafts of the brochure.

C. The Sweetwater County Historical Museum shall ensure that the following stipulations are implemented.

1. Take ownership of the salvaged plaque from 48SW18892.

2. Review and provide comments on drafts of the brochure.

D. The Lincoln Highway Association shall ensure that the following stipulations are implemented.

1. Review and provide comments on drafts of the brochure.

2. Post copies of the HAER photographs and the electronic version of the brochure to their website and archive.

E. Tracks Across Wyoming shall ensure that the following stipulations are implemented.

1. Review and provide comments on drafts of the brochure.

2. Post copies of the HAER photographs and the electronic version of the brochure to their website.

II. DISPUTE RESOLUTION

A. FHWA and WYDOT shall consult with any signatory to this agreement in accordance with 36 CFR §800.6(c)(1), if there is an objection by a signatory in the manner in which the terms of the agreement are implemented.

B. If FHWA and WYDOT determine that the objection cannot be resolved among the involved parties, FHWA and WYDOT shall forward all documentation relevant to the dispute to the ACHP in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.2(b)(2). After reviewing the documentation, the ACHP will either:

1. Provide FHWA and WYDOT with recommendations, which FHWA and WYDOT can take into account in reaching a final decision regarding the dispute; or

2. Notify FHWA and WYDOT it will comment pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.7(c)(4) with reference to the subject of the dispute.

C. Any recommendations or comments provided by the ACHP will pertain only to the subject of the dispute. Any signatory's responsibility to carry out all actions under this agreement that are not subjects of the dispute will remain unchanged.

D. Nothing in this Section shall be construed or interpreted as a waiver of any judicial remedy that would be available to any party to this MOA.

III. AMENDMENT

Any parties to this agreement, in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.6(c)(1), may request that other parties consider amending it, if circumstances change over time and warrant revision of the stipulations. Any changes, modifications, revisions, or amendments to this agreement which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this agreement shall be incorporated by written instrument, executed and signed by all parties to this agreement.

IV. TERMINATION

Any party to this agreement, in accordance with 36 CFR §800.6(c)(1), may initiate consultation for termination by providing 30 business days notice to other parties of their intent. After notification by the initiating party, the remaining parties will have 60 business days to consult to seek agreement on amendments or any other actions that would address the issues and avoid the termination. In the event of termination, FHWA and WYDOT will seek the ACHP's comments on any remaining adverse effects to historic properties for the project and the terms of this agreement.

V. SUNSET TERMS

This agreement shall be null and void if its terms are not carried out within a term of ten years from the date of its execution, unless the Signatories agree in writing for any extension for carrying out its terms.

General Provisions

- A. Entirety of Agreement.** This MOA, consisting of nine (9) pages, represents the entire integrated agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations and agreements, whether written or oral.
- B. Prior Approval.** This MOA shall not be binding on any party unless this MOA has been reduced to writing before performance begins as described in the ^{under} wider the terms of this MOA, and unless this MOA is approved as to form by the Wyoming Attorney General or his representative.
- C. Severability.** Should any portion of this MOA be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the MOA shall continue in full force and effect, and any party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.
- D. Sovereign Immunity.** The parties to this agreement do not waive their sovereign immunity by entering into this MOA, and each retains all immunities and defenses provided by law with respect to any action based upon or occurring as a result of this MOA.
- E. Indemnification.** Each Signatory to this MOA shall assume the risk of any liability arising from its own conduct. Each Signatory agrees they are not obligated to insure, defend, or indemnify the other Signatories to this MOA.

Execution of this MOA by FHWA, WYDOT, SHPO, Sweetwater County, the Sweetwater County Historical Museum, the Lincoln Highway Association, and Tracks Across Wyoming, submission and filing of this MOA with the ACHP pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.6(b)(1)(iv) prior to FHWA's approval of the undertaking and implementation of its terms are evidence that FHWA and WYDOT have taken into account the effects of the removal of 48SW18892 on historic properties and afforded the ACHP an opportunity to comment.







Summary of Application

Dick and Mary Schuck are requesting a Zoning Map Amendment from A and R-3 to RR (Rural Residential). The property is 4.89 acres in size. Access to the property is from Country Club Road. In the application, the applicant states that the RR Zone District is more compatible with the use of their property which includes a barn and horses, and there is additional RR Zoning north of I-80 and near their property and in the Jamestown area.

Background:

The Zone Districts which surround the Schuck property consists of:

North: A (Agriculture)

South: A (Agriculture)

East : R-3 (Multi-Family Residential)

West: RR (Rural Residential)

In the application the applicants state the need for RR Zoning for their uses which include a barn and horses. The applicants are correct in that RR Zoning is needed for the keeping of animals. R-3 Zone regulations do not allow keeping of animals.

There exists a history of recent Zoning and Nuisance Violations regarding the Schuck property. In August, 2008 Staff investigated Nuisance Violations for manure and piles of wood and materials. Staff also investigated a Zoning Violation for illegally operating a mancamp. Both violations were resolved by November, 2008. In July, 2010, a new Nuisance Complaint was filed and determined to be valid. This Nuisance Complaint went to District Court and was not resolved until 2013 at which time it was cleaned up. In 2015 a Nuisance and Zoning Complaint was filed and found to be valid. The Nuisance consisted of garbage and debris on the property. The Zoning Violation consisted of the keeping of animals on R-3 Zoned property, barb wire fence on R-3, and fenced area in the county road right-of-way used for keeping of animals. As a means to come into compliance, the Schuck's are filing for a Zoning Map Amendment regarding animals on the property and furthermore must clean the property to resolve the Nuisance Violation.

Section 20.D.2 of the Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution lists the following criteria for review for a Zoning Map Amendment:

- a. The amendment is consistent and compatible with the current Resolution and Comprehensive Plan
- b. The proposed zoning is suitable for the existing topography and creates buildable lots
- c. The proposed zoning is compatible with existing or allowable uses of adjacent properties and neighboring zoning districts
- d. The proposed zoning can demonstrate adequate public facilities including roads, drainage, potable water, sanitary sewer, and police and fire protection will exist to serve the requested use at the time such facilities are needed.
- e. The amendment shall not adversely affect adjacent properties, communities or the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Sweetwater County.
- f. The request conforms to all applicable provisions of this Resolution

Staff recommends that Criteria a, b, d are met. Staff recommends that Criteria c, e, f are not met. Please refer to the Comments submitted by Duane and Courtney McCauley regarding how this request relates to Criteria e.

Background Continued:

In Section 5 of the Zoning Resolution the purpose of the R-3 District reads: "This district is intended to accommodate mixed residential opportunities (single-family through multi-family housing) in an organized and well-developed manner. The R-3 District should be applied judiciously where urban conveniences and services are available or readily accessible. This zone should not be applied in isolated, rural locations or within areas developing as strictly single family residential".

An additional issue that must be addressed is the use of the county road right-of-way by Schuck's for a fenced in corral area. Any motion must include a condition that approval for a license must be approved by the Board of County Commission in order for Schuck's to continue using the fenced in right-of-way.

Staff Comments, Recommendations and Conditions:

This request for Zone Map Amendment from A & R-3 to RR is primarily intended to allow the keeping of animals on the entire property owned by the Schuck's. The property is split-zoned with the majority of the property zoned R-3. The keeping of animals is permitted on the portion zoned A. The Schuck property is surrounded by property zoned A, RR and R-3.

The criteria for reviewing a Zoning Map Amendment is found in Section 20.D.2 a-f. One of the criteria states: "The amendment shall not adversely affect adjacent properties, communities or the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Sweetwater County". Due to repeated violations of Zoning and Nuisance Regulations, and proximity to an adjacent neighbor, it is difficult to find that this criteria has been met. Staff has difficulty supporting the request for Zone Map Amendment. On July 8, 2015, the Planning & Zoning Commission voted 4-0 to recommend approval of the Zone Map Amendment from A & R3 to RR with the condition that before the Zone Map Amendment is adopted, an encroachments in the Right-of-Way is cleared to the approval of the Board of County Commissioners. Commissioners Moody was recused due to a conflict of interest.





This letter is to address the proposed zoning change for Richard and Mary Schuck, 33A Blue Rim Road, Green River, WY 82935.

We will not be attending the Planning & Zoning Hearing on July 8, 2015 or the Public Hearing of the Board of Commissioners on July 21, 2015, due to previously well documented hostile behavior on the part of the Schuck family towards our family.

The zoning change, if allowed, would essentially be an appeasement by the county, allowing the Schuck family to continue what is currently the illegal raising of animals corralled on county land. Their horses and dogs are habitually allowed to wander Country Club Road, creating a driving hazard; our land, creating large holes, piles of manure, and destroying our landscaping; and the adjoining BLM land at will. This is further evidence to the lack of responsibility as animal owners the Schuck family displays. Nowhere else within the Jamestown/Green River area are farm animals or canines allowed to roam at will, without their owners being held responsible. The current cleaning schedule of their illegal corrals is at a one year interval, as stated by Mr. Schuck to Mr. Horton on May 18, 2015. Upon cleaning the corrals, the manure is then dumped on BLM land, behind their home. At this point, there are 6 to 7 horses living in these abhorrent conditions. When we bought this land in 2007, there were only 3 horses being illegally raised. If a change in zoning is allowed, this could give the Schuck family the right to conditionally board additional animals, wherever they see fit.

The barbed wire fencing of the property, if rezoned, would still remain in violation due to it abutting a more restrictive R3 zoned residential area. As stated in the zoning regulations.

The above property is currently regarded as a nuisance property by the County. This is the third time the property has been considered as such since 2008.

The County needs to research the additional unique violations of this property due to the fact that this area is included in the Growth Management, Highway Overlay, and Scenic Slope areas, which a zoning change would not remedy.

If allowed to change their zoning from R3 to RR; would they not be violating the free space requirements of 50% as stated in the zoning regulations?

The original homestead has been used as an additional income/rental property, would this be allowed to continue with the change in zoning? I do not see where this is permitted in RR. (Section F – District Use Chart – Lodging)

For eight years, we have been treated by Sweetwater County and the Schuck family as if we have no private property rights whatsoever. Nowhere else in the Green River/Jamestown area would these violations and utter disregard of adjoining properties be allowed to continue. Instead of being rewarded with a zoning change, the county is legally bound to enforce its own zoning rules and regulations that have continually been violated by the Schuck family at 33A Blue Rim Road.

We have built and maintained our property in strict accordance with Sweetwater County Zoning, Growth Management, Highway Overlay, and Scenic Slope regulations. Sweetwater County and the Schuck family's actions, or lack thereof, illustrates responsible land ownership and adhering to this County's regulations, all depends on who you are and who you know. How many other properties in this county with multiple nuisances, illegal dumping, and animal control issues are allowed to remain unchecked without strict intervention?
