The Board of County Commissioners met this day at 8:30 a.m. in Regular Session with all commissioners present. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

County Clerk Dale Davis introduced Account Manager Bonnie Phillips to the Board of County Commissioners.

Approval of Agenda

Chairman Johnson requested to amend the agenda to include discussion relative to the assignment of the chairman and liaisons to the various boards and departments. Commissioner Comments/Reports

Chairman Johnson

Chairman Johnson expressed his appreciation to the Board of County Commissioners and the various boards within the county for their efforts over the past year. Chairman Johnson reported that he continues to work with the Rock Springs RMP. Chairman Johnson questioned if the commission would like to contribute monetarily for the 2012 Legislative Dinner to be held on February 15, 2012. The commission concurred to split the cost of the dinner.

Commissioner West

Commissioner West echoed Chairman Johnson's comments regarding the good work that the various boards and county employees do for the county. Commissioner West reported that he attended meetings for the Board of Health and Memorial Hospital Finance and Audit Committee.

Commissioner Bailiff

Commissioner Bailiff reported that he met with Emergency Management Director Dave Johnson regarding communications that would impact private and public entities and noted that they also discussed FEMA. Commissioner Bailiff reported that he met with the following offices: Sheriff, County Attorney, Maintenance and the County Engineer's office. Commissioner Bailiff reported that he received a request to send two fire fighters for training to be certified engine bosses. He explained that the certification is a requirement of the BLM in order to fight fires on BLM land. Commissioner Bailiff explained that, if approved, the department would be over budget but the BLM would reimburse into the general fund. A discussion ensued regarding certification requirements and reimbursement to the county general fund.

Commissioner Van Matre

Commissioner Van Matre echoed Chairman Johnson's comments relative to the performance of the county employees and various boards. Commissioner Van Matre reported that he continues to work with I/T Director Tim Knight and Human Resources Manager Garry McLean relative to the VSO Office. He noted that the Memorandum of Understanding between Sublette, Lincoln and Sweetwater County has been submitted for review. Commissioner Van Matre expressed his pleasure with the addition of Account Manager Bonnie Phillips.

Amendment 1. Amend the Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution Section 3.C. Establishment of Zoning Districts to read as follows:

C. Establishment of Zoning Districts

In order to carry out the provisions of this Resolution the unincorporated areas of Sweetwater County shall be divided into the following zoning districts:

1. A (Agricultural)
2. RR (Rural Residential)
3. RR-3 (Rural Residential)
4. RR-5 (Rural Residential)
5. R-1 (Single Family Residential)
6. R-2 (Mixed Residential)
7. R-2/SF (Single Family Residential)
8. R-3 (Multi-Family Residential)
9. MH (Manufactured Home)
10. B (Retail Business)
11. CRS (Commercial & Recreational Services)
12. C (General Commercial)
13. I-1 (Light Industrial)
14. I-2 (Heavy Industrial)
15. AO (Rock Springs - Sweetwater County Airport – Airport Influence Area Overlay)
16. MD (Mineral Development)
17. LS (Special Overlay District Governing Minimum Lot Size)

Amendment 2. Amend the Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution Section 3.D. Zoning District Map to read as follows:

E. Zoning District Map

- I. The computer generated Zoning Map and all future amendments thereto are hereby established to be the "Official Zoning Map" of Sweetwater County and declared to be a part of this Resolution. The zone districts set forth on the Official Zoning Map are hereby and herewith adopted and approved; in the case of a conflict between the zone district depicted on the Official Zoning Map and the zone district adopted at a hearing pertaining to a particular parcel of property or shown in other official documents of Sweetwater County, the later shall control. The Land Use Department shall maintain on file true and correct copies of the official Sweetwater County Zoning Map. This version of the Official Zoning Map, as of the date of adoption, will be recorded in the office of the Sweetwater County Clerk and Recorder.

Amendment 3. Amend the Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution Section 3.E Zone Lot for Structures to read as follows:

Zone Lot for Structures

Except in the MD (Mineral Development) District and non-conforming sites, or as otherwise hereinafter provided, a separate ground area called the Zone Lot shall be designated, provided, and continuously maintained for each structure containing a Permitted Use or Uses and / or subordinate structures.

When Zone Lots are designated in the I-2 and MD Districts, those Zone Lots may contain more than one structure containing a Permitted Use.

No Zone Lot shall be required for the following: retaining walls, agricultural buildings, fences, flagpoles, signs, monuments and statuary, railroads and railways, bridges, utility and service installations, pipelines and underground mining activity.

All Zone Lots shall have one Front Line which shall abut a public or private street. Exemptions to the zone lot frontage requirements may be allowed for specific uses listed below. However, when an Exemption is granted, a public easement, private easement, or right-of-way sufficient to provide access is required. Exemptions to the public or private street requirement may include:

1. Unmanned communication facilities.
2. Forest management and logging
3. Mineral exploration and drilling
4. Unmanned or remotely located compressor stations.
5. Unmanned or remotely located metering stations.
6. Unmanned or remotely located fiber optic booster stations.
7. Unmanned or remotely located evaporation ponds.
8. Oil and gas drilling exploration and extraction facilities.
9. Gravel quarries.
10. Other similar commercial or industrial uses as approved by the Land Use Department.

Amendment 4. Amend the Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution Section 3 Appeal to read as follows: (This subsection removed from Section 4.D)

Rules for Proceeding before the Board of County Commissioners on Appeals

Appeal hearings shall be held in accordance with the "Rules for Contested Case Practice and Procedure before the Board of Sweetwater County Commissioners".

Amendment 5. Amend the Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution Section 4.B.1. Permits to read as follows:

1. No building or structure shall be commenced, erected, or altered until a Zoning Permit for CONSTRUCTION OR ALTERATION has been issued by the Land Use Department certifying that the proposed building or structure complies with all of the provisions of this Resolution. Structures which meet the following criteria shall not require a Zoning Permit:
 - a. Is two hundred (200) square feet or less in size.
 - b. Is one story in height.
 - c. Is not attached to a structure containing a Permitted Use.

- d. Meets all setback requirements.
- e. Is a building normally associated with agriculture purposes such as a barn.
- f. Is a retaining wall, fence, flagpole, monument or statuary.
- g. Is a roadway, bridge, water line, sewer line, utility line, utility pole, railroad, pipeline, underground tank or underground mining activity.
- h. Is a manufactured home on a sales lot.
- i. Is a manufactured home in a non-conforming Mobile Home Court or Park.

A Zoning Permit shall remain in effect for a period of two (2) years from the date of issuance at which time any and all CONSTRUCTION OR ALTERATION shall be completed. A permittee holding an unexpired permit shall have the right to apply for an extension of the time within which the permittee will complete work under that original permit when work is unable to be completed within the time required for good and satisfactory reasons. The Land Use Department is authorized to grant, in writing, one or more extensions of the time period of a permit.

Amendment 6. Amend the Sweetwater County Zoning Resolution Section 4.B.3. to read as follows:

- 3. Applications for Zoning Permits required by this Resolution shall be accompanied by a site plan, drawn to scale, containing the following information:
 - a. Address of the property
 - b. Legal Description
 - c. Location and dimensions of the land area in question
 - d. Size, shape, dimensions and location of existing or proposed structures
 - e. Location of fire hydrant or water supply
 - f. Access including dimensions, distance from property corners and size of culvert
 - g. Show general drainage of lot or parcel.
 - h. Parking and loading areas
 - i. Commercial signage, if applicable.
 - j. Septic and wells locations
 - k. Fuels being used or stored on the property
 - l. Utilities
 - m. Easements

The Land Use Staff may require additional information, such as a professionally prepared and stamped drawings by a Wyoming Licensed Surveyor, Engineer or Architect if, after review, it is deemed that such specific site plan requirements are necessary.

In addition to complying with these Regulations, the applicant shall be required to comply with rules and regulations administered by other County agencies, such as County Health and Emergency Management, utility companies, special service districts and State and Federal Agencies such as the Wyoming Department of Transportation and the Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality. The applicant shall notify and work directly with these agencies to ensure compliance with their rules and regulations.

This resolution shall be filed in the Records of the Sweetwater County Clerk.





THIS AGREEMENT made and executed this 4 day of January, 2012 by and between the City of Green River, Wyoming, a municipal corporation, and Sweetwater County, a duly organized governmental entity under the laws of the State of Wyoming.

WHEREAS, it is to the mutual advantage and benefit of the parties hereto that each agree to render supplemental emergency mutual aid fire protection outside their territorial limits in the event of an unusual emergency, disaster or conflagration that threatens the health, safety and welfare of the public; and

WHEREAS, authority exists to provide emergency response fire assistance outside the normal territorial jurisdiction of each party; and

WHEREAS, the term "governmental entity" shall hereinafter refer to any duly formed and existing cities and towns, counties, school districts, joint powers boards, airport boards, fire protection districts, public corporations, special districts and their governing bodies, all political subdivisions of the state, and their agencies, instrumentalities and institutions;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, and of the mutual covenants, promises and conditions hereinafter contained, the parties agree as follows:

1. Each party does hereby authorize and direct its fire chief or the other officer commanding in his absence to render and request mutual aid to and from the parties to this agreement to the extent of available personnel and equipment not required for adequate protection to the party rendering aid. The extent of assistance shall be determined in the sole reasonable judgment of the fire chief or officer commanding in his absence, for each department

rendering aid, as to the amount of personnel and equipment available, shall be final. The assistance may be provided upon actual or standby basis. It is understood that the assistance so furnished may be recalled at the sole reasonable discretion of the furnishing party.

2. The commanding officer of a party requested to render mutual aid assistance shall report to and receive instructions from the commanding personnel of the party to which assistance is being rendered; however, any other personnel rendering assistance to the other party shall be directly supervised, controlled and/or deployed by the commanding officer of the rendering party. Any firefighter who renders mutual aid assistance shall be responsible for his individual actions and conduct under the party's (own) regulations, guidelines and procedures, and/or state and federal laws, regardless of the jurisdiction in which he is performing such fire protection duties.

3. When providing mutual aid assistance, the firefighters who render such assistance shall not be considered for any purpose to be employees of the other party (to which assistance is rendered).

4. The fire chiefs of the various departments and/or municipalities shall establish uniform rules and regulations as to methods of requesting such assistance, the persons authorized to send and receive such requests, and the nature of the assistance provided, which shall be subject to the approval of the governing body of each such department and/or municipality. The rules and regulations may be revised and amended from time to time by the fire chiefs upon their unanimous agreement, subject to the approval of any such governing body.

5. While providing mutual aid assistance, any firefighter rendering such assistance shall have the same powers and authority conferred by law on the members of the fire department of the district and/or municipality to which such assistance is rendered.

6. While providing mutual aid assistance, any firefighter rendering such assistance shall be properly certified for the particular fire in which assistance is requested.

7. Vehicles and all equipment furnished in or for mutual aid assistance shall be operated by personnel of the party furnishing the equipment. It is understood that under no circumstances will privately owned vehicles and/or equipment be utilized in mutual aid assistance, unless commandeered and/or authorized by the commanding firefighter of the party in which such emergency exists.

8. Within the reciprocal fire protection zone, each municipality/county shall pay its own costs for a maximum of eight (8) hours following the initial call-out by the party requesting assistance. If the use of foam is appropriate and required at any time after call-out, the requesting party shall pay the reasonable expenses for the applications of foam for fire suppression. If the responding party remains at the site of the fire after eight (8) hours have lapsed since the initial call-out, the responding party shall pay the fuel costs, and minor equipment repairs incurred by the responding party, if said minor repairs are under five hundred dollars (\$500). All repairs to equipment incurred by the responding party in excess of five hundred dollars (\$500) are the obligation of the responding party or its insurance carrier as outlined in Paragraph 9.

9. It is further understood and agreed that if while rendering assistance pursuant to this agreement, personal injury, death or property damage or loss occurs outside the territorial limits of the party rendering mutual aid assistance, the party rendering such assistance and/or the party's contracted insurance carrier(s) shall be liable for all legally determined damages that are

incurred by the rendering party. Each party agrees to obtain sufficient insurance coverage to meet the responsibility hereunder. Such insurance coverage shall include, but is not limited to, Worker's Compensation (insurance), vehicular comprehensive and collision, bodily injury (minimum coverage \$500,000.00) and property damage (minimum coverage \$500,000.00) liability insurance; general liability (minimum coverage \$500,000.00).

10. The provisions of this agreement shall not be construed to impose an obligation on any party hereto to respond to a request for mutual aid assistance. At any time such assistance is requested, the party so requested may, if for any reason, deem it advisable not to respond and may so inform the requesting party. No municipality and/or department shall under any circumstances be held liable for any loss or damage by reason of its failure to effectively combat or handle any fire in the territory of the other party.

11. This agreement shall not be construed as or deemed to be an agreement for the benefit of any third party or parties, and no third party or parties shall have any right of action hereunder for any cause whatsoever.

12. The terms of this agreement shall be for one (1) year. This agreement shall become effective for each party when that party, by ordinance, resolution, or minute action of its governing body, adopts and approves this agreement and authorizes the proper official to execute the same. The term of this agreement may be renewed by mutual written consent of the parties, prior to expiration of the initial term or any successive renewed terms, upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed to between the parties.

13. This agreement shall continue in full force and effect among the parties hereto unless terminated as herein provided. Any volunteer firefighter's organization and its governing bodies may withdraw and cancel their obligations under this agreement at any time by so

notifying each of the other parties herein in writing at least sixty (60) days prior to an intended withdrawal and cancellation.

14. In the event it becomes necessary to enforce any of the terms of this agreement, either with or without suit, the losing party agrees to pay the prevailing party all reasonable costs and expenses, including a reasonable attorney's fee that may be made and incurred.


15. This agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and shall not be modified, changed or discharged in any manner except by an instrument in writing executed by the parties. If any term or provision of this agreement or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall, to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of the agreement, or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby and each term and provisions of this agreement shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law.

16. The waiver of any party hereto of any breach, condition or provision of this agreement by the other parties shall be limited to the particular instance, and shall not operate or be deemed to waive any future breach or breaches of said condition or provision. The failure of any party to insist in any one instance, or more, upon the performance of any of the conditions or provisions of this agreement, or to exercise any right or privilege herein conferred, shall not be construed as waiving any such condition, provision, right or privilege, but the same shall continue and remain in full force and effect.

17. The terms, covenants agreements herein contained shall apply to, bind and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their legal representative, successors and assigns.

WHEREAS The Sweetwater County Board of County Commissioners having previously committed to making efforts to guarantee that citizens of Sweetwater County receive care for acute mental health conditions and;

WHEREAS Sweetwater County has previously made efforts to work with local medical providers to ensure that Sweetwater County Citizens are not transported out of the County to obtain care for acute mental health crisis and;

WHEREAS Sweetwater County is part of the West Region created by the Wyoming Department of Health along with Uinta, Teton, Sublette and Lincoln Counties as a region to provide equal access to mental health care for Crisis Stabilization and;

WHEREAS Southwest Counseling Service of Sweetwater County provided Emergency Services (assessments) to 609 individuals in 2011 and provided services to 187 individuals placed on involuntary holds in 2011 and;

WHEREAS providers in the other counties in the West Region provided services to the following number of individuals:

	Assessed	Holds
Jackson Counseling Service	49	31
High Country Behavioral	337	54

WHEREAS the 337 assessed clients and 54 holds conducted by High Country included 65 assessments and 13 holds for Lincoln County; 63 assessments and 15 holds for Sublette County and 209 assessments and 26 holds for Uinta County and;

WHEREAS based upon the figures set forth above, combined Uinta, Teton, Sublette and Lincoln counties assessed only 39% of the clients to 61% provided by Southwest Counseling Service and;

WHEREAS pursuant to the plan established by the legislature to bid out contracts for mental health services pursuant to W.S. 35-1-620(a)(i) contracts for Crisis Stabilization Services in the amount of \$858,666.00 were awarded to High Country Behavioral to provide Crisis Stabilization Services in the West Region and;

WHEREAS Southwest Counseling Service, a West Regional partner was denied an opportunity to participate in the development and implementation of Crisis Stabilization in Sweetwater County, and;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE Sweetwater County Board of County Commissioners acknowledges the inequity in funding for Crisis Stabilization services in the West Region particularly to Sweetwater County and resolves to petition the Wyoming Department of Health, Legislature and Governor to seek redress.

CRISIS STABILIZATION

WEST REGION

Southwest Counseling Service is the community mental health and substance abuse center for Sweetwater County. The following information is to provide to the Sweetwater County Commissioners the historical interactions between Southwest Counseling Service and the Wyoming Department of Health, Behavioral Health Division regarding what is known as the West Region in providing Crisis Stabilization services within Sweetwater County.

Southwest Counseling Service provides an array of mental health and substance abuse outpatient and residential services. Some of the services provided by Southwest Counseling Service are considered to be for the West Region of the State. Please see the attachment to this document displaying the geographical locations of the separate Regions as indicated by the Wyoming of Health Department, Behavioral Health Division (previously called the Mental Health and Substance Abuse Division).

Background

The Select Committee on Mental Health and Substance recommended that the State consider Regions for the Division to ensure access of services to all residents regardless of where they lived. The Regions designated by the Department of Health, Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse are:

- Central Region: Natrona, Fremont, Converse, Niobrara
- Southeast Region: Carbon, Albany, Laramie, Platte, Goshen
- Northeast Region: Campbell, Crook, Weston, Sheridan, Johnson
- West Region: Uinta, Sweetwater, Teton, Sublette, Lincoln**

Regional Partners are expected to work together to ensure equal access to services and to have a Regional Delivery Plan for services.

Crisis Stabilization is a service for the West Region. Crisis Stabilization is a comprehensive array of services designed to stabilize individuals suffering from acute psychiatric symptoms. Crisis Stabilization is an alternative to hospitalization for individuals experiencing an acute episode or crisis in their lives. The primary focus is to treat and support the individual throughout the crisis and to maintain individuals needing these services in their communities rather than sending the individuals out of the community.

Southwest Counseling Service and the residents of Sweetwater County have been **excluded** from access to these services and no finances directed to Southwest Counseling Service.

According to a document received from the State of Wyoming Department of Health, Behavioral Health Division the following is a disbursement of money for Crisis Stabilization to members in the Western Region:

According to the Directors of High Country Behavioral Health and Jackson Hole Community Mental Health Center, each received \$90,000 for start-up monies for Crisis Stabilization in their communities.

The following is the disbursement of funds for Crisis Stabilization services with timelines:

High Country Behavioral Health: November 23, 2010-June 30, 2011	\$368,666.00
High Country Behavioral Health: July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012	<u>\$490,000.00</u>
Total	\$858,666.00
Total with Start-up money:	<u>\$1,038,666.00</u>

Southwest Counseling Service was not involved in the discussion of the Crisis Stabilization Services until after the fact and has been excluded from the service and monies.

To provide additional information regarding the subsequent communications regarding the distribution of funds, a timeline of the communications with the Division is outlined. Also attached are the documents referenced.

Timelines of Communication

February 28, 2011: Letter to Korin Schmidt, Administrator of the Department of Health, Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse on Crisis Stabilization

March 15, 2011: Response letter from Korin Schmidt

March 18, 2011: Response Letter to Korin Schmidt from Linda Acker

April 2011: Korin Schmidt resigns position and interim administrator Chris Newman takes position

October 17, 2011: Receive a letter from Chris Newman on the distribution of monies for the West Region

October 27, 2011: Response letter to Chris Newman from Linda Acker

From the communications that transpired regarding the distribution of the Crisis Stabilization funds, there still remain unanswered questions from Southwest Counseling Service to the Division:

Why was Southwest Counseling Service representing Sweetwater County in the West excluded from the information that ACT (Assertive Community Treatment) was being implemented in the West Region?

Why are the residents of Sweetwater being left out of the Crisis Stabilization Services?

Where is the accountability of the taxpayers' dollar for Sweetwater County in regards to this regional service? In the original proposal of High Country Behavioral Health, Sweetwater County is excluded. How is that possible with regional services and regional funding from the State of Wyoming?

Was the start up funding of \$90,000 for High County Behavioral Health and Jackson Hole Community Mental Health Center included in the October 17, 2011 document that outlines the funding for each center in the Western Region?

How is it possible that Sweetwater County continues to be left out of these services or any funding from the State of Wyoming for Crisis Stabilization?

There has been no further communication from the State of Wyoming to date on the questions in the letter dated October 27, 2011.

Statistical information on Crisis Stabilization Services Provided in Western Region

December 19, 2011: Southwest Counseling Service received a document on Emergency Services that outlines every Region and the specific centers emergency services that have been provided in calendar year 2011:

Southwest Counseling Service is by far the busiest center in doing emergency service assessments and Title 25 Emergency Detentions but receives no funding from Crisis Stabilization monies from the Division.



Summation


There are many unanswered questions in regards to the issue of Crisis Stabilization in Sweetwater County. To date, I have been unsuccessful in having these issues addressed by the Department of Health, Division of Behavioral Health (previously called Mental Health and Substance Abuse Division). I maintain that the Division of Behavioral Health has a responsibility of transparency and accountability with taxpayers monies and to date I cannot understand how Sweetwater County is excluded from equal access that is clearly defined in the Wyoming State Contracts with Southwest Counseling Service and the other Regional partner. As the Sweetwater County Commissioners and representing Sweetwater County residents, I would hope that Sweetwater County Commissioners could receive an answer to why Sweetwater County was excluded in the original proposal and continues today.

This letter results from the Regional Conference call on Friday, February 25th in which we both participated. During this conference call, it became apparent that decisions had been made about the use of West Region crisis stabilization dollars without discussion involving all region members. If all members are not included, the process is unfair and decisions are made without transparency or accountability – a minimal requirement for the award of any state funding. Sweetwater County did not have equal access to crisis stabilization monies.

During the January West Regional conference call, you announced High Country Behavioral Health would become the provider for services in Uinta County. Pioneer Counseling Service had been the provider but their contract was officially terminated by the Division on 1/1/11. During this same Regional Conference Call, Steve Corsi, Director of High Country Behavioral Health, announced he was forming Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) teams to travel to different counties in the West region. I made the suggestion that while Sweetwater County would benefit from an actual crisis stabilization unit, it was my belief that this traveling ACT team would be a poor utilization of State resources in Sweetwater County as SCS already provides this service to our community. The demand of these services are extremely high as indicated by high utilization.

On both the January and February conference calls, I stated SCS's goals include preventing unnecessary hospitalization, lowering emergency detention rates, and providing stabilization in the community for this population. There was no further

discussion about crisis stabilization services and certainly no discussion of funding redistribution.

During the February 25th conference call, Deb Sprague, Jackson Hole Community Counseling Center Director, informed the group she had hired 8 people to form an Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) team in Jackson. I asked how she was able to pay for this team and she replied that she received approximately \$235,000 from High Country Behavioral Health, *beginning in January*. High Country Behavioral Health was funded through the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse for these regional monies; however, I do not know when High Country received funds since the regional partners were informed in January that High Country Behavioral Health was taking over services in Uinta County.

It is clear to me that this was the plan in January and neither you nor Steve Corsi informed any of the West Region partners. The only person who had access to the money was Deb Sprague. I'm not sure about the motivation behind this exclusion, but I do know that State agencies are obligated to share information equally with all providers. If there are regional funds available, full disclosure and transparency is required.


During this February 25th conference call, I informed the group of my disappointment in this process and that I intended to make our legislative delegation aware of being excluded in the process. Ms. Schmidt asked "Are you making a threat?" I do not believe that my addressing the State on complete lack of disclosure should be questioned as a threat. I replied that I was advising the group about my next course of *action as legislators need to be informed* when state agencies fail to provide fair access and when it is clear that a level playing field is not provided.

I am very aware that taking a stand may put Southwest Counseling Service and Sweetwater County at risk but I believe this type of preferential funding is even more dangerous to all Wyoming residents. You have put all providers in an unenviable position and I feel compelled to disagree with these methods. I believe I have a right to express my opinion and a right to disagree with a process. I respectfully disagree with the West Region partnerships plan and the way these funds were distributed. We must all be held accountable and this includes the State being accountable for fair and transparent distribution of funding.

I appreciate your letter dated February 28, 2011, and would like to take this opportunity to respond to your concerns regarding the procurement and decision making processes of regional services in the Western Region specific to crisis stabilization funding.

The Wyoming Department of Health, Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Division (the Division) released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for crisis stabilization on June 30, 2010. The RFP was distributed by the Department of Administration and Information (A&I) through their procurement process, according to state statute. In addition, I sent an e-mail on May 25, 2010, to all Western Region partners with information on the release of the RFP (please see enclosed). We received applications from Mountain Regional Services, Inc.; Pioneer Counseling Services; and High Country Behavioral Health (HCBH). HCBH proposed to provide crisis stabilization through Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) teams. HCBH was awarded the funding and a contract was executed with HCBH on November 22, 2010, giving them the opportunity to prepare for transition of clients. The Division extended the contract with Pioneer Counseling Services, who was then the contractor for crisis stabilization services, through December 31, 2010, to ensure adequate time to transition clients. This information was never withheld from any of the regional partners as it was done through the state's procurement statutes, which by their nature are transparent. The decision to award the contract to HCBH was made by a select committee appointed by the Uinta County Commissioners after hearing testimony at a public hearing, again a transparent process.

After HCBH was awarded the contract, then Director Steve Corsi called the Division asking permission to sub-contract with Jackson Hole Community Counseling in order to fulfill its deliverables as outlined in the application and contract. The Division responded that HCBH would be responsible for meeting the terms of the contract, regardless if HCBH or a sub-contractor provided the services. HCBH then pursued a contractual arrangement with Jackson Hole Community Counseling to provide ACT services on HCBH's behalf in the northern part of the region. The Division does not interfere with centers choosing sub-contract for services, as is the case with many of the psychiatric services throughout the state, as long as the deliverable of the contract are being met.

Additionally, the Division held a Western Region conference call on October 13, 2010, where it was decided by the partners that they would like to meet separate from the Division to discuss the regional plan prior to the next Division-facilitated meeting. My understanding is that the meeting did take place; however, I do not know the date. It is also my understanding that the regional services were discussed and you indicated you were not interested in the ACU team approach, as Southwest Counseling Service (SCS) already provides this service. You stated that SCS is more interested in an actual crisis stabilization unit. In the February 25, 2011 Western Region conference call, representatives from HCBH and the Wyoming State Hospital (WSH) stated there are beds available at the Amethyst House to regional partners for crisis stabilization.

In summary, the Division provided SCS the same opportunities for participation offered to any of the other regional partners. You have our commitment to continue to work with the Western Region on building its regional capacity to serve your residents and look forward to the ongoing problem solving opportunities.

Dear Ms. Schmidt:

I am in receipt of your letter dated March 15, 2011 concerning the Western Region, specifically crisis stabilization. Although I appreciate your explanation of the process for funding for crisis stabilization, I continue to encounter problems with the lack of transparency, accountability and communication with the Division to all Western regional partners specifically Southwest Counseling Service. Crisis Stabilization is a regional service and all regional members should have an opportunity to participate. I maintain Southwest Counseling Service was excluded from conversations related to crisis stabilization for the region.

I clearly understand that High Country Counseling Service was awarded the Crisis Stabilization contract. I was not aware of the Division approval for the sub-contract with Jackson Hole Community Counseling Center until the February 25, 2011 conference call. I only learned this information by questioning how Ms. Sprague was implementing an Assertive Community Treatment team. If you are saying that High Country Counseling Service, with the Division, has no responsibility in informing the Western Region partners of regional services, I respectfully disagree with you. How can a partner utilize the service when they are unaware of the service? How can the Western Region develop a regional service plan when all the members of the region are not informed of the services? As the Administrator of the Division, I believe you have a primary responsibility to ensure communications among the partners to maximize resources and to ensure a plan that will work with all the providers in the region. There was never a regional discussion amongst the Western partners about how the crisis stabilization funds were to be used. The money was awarded to High Country Counseling Service but it is a regional service and all partners should have participated in any regional discussion concerning crisis stabilization. As the steward of the taxpayer's money, it is critical that all Western partners had an opportunity to be informed and participate. According to your e-mail on May 25, 2010 to the Western regional partners you stated, "... We understand you have a vested interest in the regional services currently being provided by Uinta County, and the implication a provider change has on those services.


The Division will be putting into place a transition team, in the case a new provider is selected. The transition team will include regional partners for the purpose of updating the regional plan and to ensure that the regional services are delivered in a manner that is agreed upon by all in the region. . . .” I do not know if a transition team was formulated but I do know that Southwest Counseling Service was not contacted by a transition team nor was Southwest Counseling Service a part of this discussion that was “agreed upon by all in the region.” As the Director of Southwest Counseling Service, I cannot agree or disagree to situations without being a part of the discussion.

In regards to the Western Region conference call on October 13, 2010 and the decision by the partners to meet separate from the Division, there was a brief call prior to the January 4, 2011 conference call. I must be missing something related to this call. When the regional call was made on January 4, 2011, Steve Corsi, High Country Counseling Service Director, participated in the regional call with you at the Division office in Cheyenne. Once again, there was no communications of the crisis stabilization for the region. I believe that Steve Corsi knew the plan as well as the Division at that time. I do not understand why the information was not provided during this regional meeting. I believe that the only partner that knew what was going on with crisis stabilization was Ms. Sprague and other partners did not receive an invitation by anyone to participate in decisions. I know I was left out of knowing what was occurring until it happened. I don't believe this is the way to do business with taxpayer's dollars. The Division with all the Western Region partners need to work together to develop the regional service plan.

In summary, Southwest Counseling Service is a part of the Western region and would like the opportunity to participate and be informed of the Western Regional Services. The Division has a responsibility of transparency and accountability to all regional partners. I am requesting the Division outline all regional services, the responsibilities of the regional partners as well as the Division, and how information will be communicated in the future. I would also request that a transition team be assembled and meet with all the Western partners to ensure that the services that are delivered in a manner that is agreed upon by all members of the region. As requested in my previous letter, crisis stabilization is a regional service and I am requesting that the Crisis Stabilization be revisited with all partners present. Lastly, during the February 25, 2011 conference call, I requested a breakdown of the finances to the Western Region partners for fiscal year 2010-2011. I would appreciate receiving this information.

Southwest Counseling Service remains committed to the development of the Western Region. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact me.

After assuming the interim administrator duties for the Wyoming Department of Health, Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Division (now known as the Behavioral Health Division) in April 2011, I was contacted by several providers in the western region who were concerned about the distribution of funds for that region. These providers informed me they refused to participate in developing a regional plan for the western region until these concerns were investigated. After careful consideration, I agreed to move forward on the fiscal year 2012 treatment contracts for all the western region providers, with the understanding that we would work together to identify and resolve the issue in that region and the providers would ultimately develop a regional plan. I also agreed to conduct a review of the western region funding for fiscal year 2010 and fiscal year 2011, to assure that funding was distributed appropriately.

This review has been completed and the corresponding report and spreadsheets are enclosed. As the report indicates, there were no significant concerns or discrepancies found with the funding. I am asking all the providers in the region to review this report and information carefully and let me know by October 31, 2011, in writing if you have concerns or questions about the findings or the funding distributions as reported. I will respond to these concerns as appropriate and send a final resolution letter when all issue have been resolved.



Western Region Review of FY 2011 Funding Decisions for Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

This report represents the results of our review of the FY 2011 treatment contract awards for the Western Region.

Two Western Region providers have voiced concerns with the competitive bidding process in Uinta County for mental health services and with the RFP process for crisis stabilization services for FY11. Additionally, there were questions surrounding the mental health SIP funding distribution in the region as well as the award of HB308 funding to High Country Behavioral Health.

The objective of our review was to determine whether the FY 2011 Western Region treatment contract awards were awarded accurately and fairly and in accordance with established rules and regulations. Additionally, this review was looking to identify any inconsistencies in award amounts to ensure future contract awards would be completed accurately.

The work consisted of reviewing contract awards for outpatient services, residential services, HB 308 substance abuse awards, peer specialist and special project awards that include services such as jail diversion, Latino services, prevention-early intervention and crisis stabilization contract awards for FY 2009, 2010 & 2011 period. As part of the review, we looked at the variances in the funding amounts for each year and identified the reason for each variance if one existed. Please see the attached excel worksheet.

Background

As outlined in the Behavioral Health-Personnel & Program Quality Rules and Regulations *Chapter I-XII*, the Legislature has authorized the Behavioral Health Division to contract for human services programs defined as "community facilities and services for the prevention and amelioration of mental illness, substance abuse, or developmental disabilities." (W.S. 35-1-620(a)(i); 35-1613(a)(iv); and W.S. 9-2-102.

The Division provides funding for mental health and substance abuse treatment services to contractors in a given region setting. The Western Region includes the following providers by counties:

- Teton County: Curran-Seeley, Jackson Hole Community Counseling
- Sublette and Lincoln Counties: High Country Behavioral Health
- Uinta County: High Country Behavior Health, MRSI/Cornerstone, and Pioneer Counseling Service, by history
- Sweetwater County: Sweetwater Counseling Services

Through FY10, the Division contracted with two providers in Uinta County: MRSI Cornerstone for outpatient substance abuse services; and Pioneer Counseling services for mental health outpatient, mental health residential and crisis stabilization services.

There was a change in mental health contractors as a result of a competitive bidding process, which occurred in FY11. The Uinta County Commissioners Select Committee recommended to the Division that the FY11 award for mental health outpatient and residential services should be granted to a new contractor: High Country Behavioral Health. The Division honored the recommendation of the Uinta County Commissioners and determined that High Country Behavioral Health would become the preferred provider in Uinta County. The Division entered into a six month transition contract with the previous contractor, Pioneer Counseling Services, to continue services with provisions to transition clients and services to High Country Behavioral Health. The Division contracted with High Country Behavioral Health for start up costs with provisions to work with Pioneer Counseling in creating a transition plan for clients and services.

On June 30, 2010, the Division issued an RFP for Crisis stabilization services in Uinta, Sweetwater, Teton, Sublette and Lincoln Counties. The award was given to High Country Behavioral Health for a two year contract, that is, FY11 and FY12. High Country entered into a business relationship with Jackson Hole Community Counseling (subcontractor) to provide crisis stabilization services (via ACT) for residents in Teton County.

A competitive bidding process occurred in Uinta County for the FY 12 contract for mental health outpatient and residential services. The Uinta County Commissioners Select Committee recommended to the Division that High Country Behavioral Health should be retained in accordance with their preferred provider status. The Division accepted the recommendation and an FY12 contract was let accordingly.

Results

Contract awards for the FY 2009, 2010 and 2011 were examined and the following variances were identified.

Outpatient & Residential Contracts FY09 & FY10 & FY11

In FY10, the Governor required a 10 percent budget reduction across the board for all state agencies. As a result, a reduction of \$6,256,061 was made to the Division's state general fund account. Of that amount, a reduction of \$3,809,085 was made to FY 2010 outpatient and residential treatment funding. In FY 2009, the Western region was awarded \$11,427,592 for residential and outpatient treatment services and for FY 10 the funding level was \$10,500,997, therein creating reduction of (\$926,595) compared to the prior year. This variance was due to the following factors:

- (\$815,543) reduction in funds due to FY10 budget reductions.
- (\$97,574) reduction in funds for CAREF certification as funding is not provided annually rather funding is provided in the first year of the biennium, which aligns to the CAREF certification period.

- (13,478) reduction to QOL respite dollars

As a result of the competitive bid process and the subsequent decision made by the County Commissioners Select Committee, the Division entered into a six month transition contract with Pioneer Counseling Services to continue services with provisions to transition clients and services to High Country Behavioral Health. The Division contracted with High Country Behavioral Health for start-up costs with provisions to work with Pioneer Counseling in creating a transition plan for clients and services.

Funding in FY11 increased \$415,634 from \$10,500,997 in FY10 to \$10,916,631. The increase and variance in funding was due to the following factors:

- Curran Seeley's funding was reduced (134,069) as they no longer desired to provide service in Sublette County. (Please see correspondence REF: RM-209-129.)
- High Country funding increased \$160,010 as substance abuse services in Sublette County were agreed to be picked up by High Country when Curran Seeley decided they no longer desired to provide services in that county and the addition of CARF funding for FY 2011.
- Overlapping funds were provided to Pioneer Counseling and High Country Behavioral Health for mental health services in Uinta County in order to transition mental health services from Pioneer to High Country. Start-up costs were also provided to High Country.
- CARF funding was provided in FY11 thus increasing the funded amount from FY10.

SIP review

- The worksheet outlining the regional funding for the Western region emailed to executive directors on April 21, 2011, contained several errors. As a result, concerns were raised about the SIP funding. In examining the worksheets, the first error identified was the inclusion of SIP funding. This is not considered a regional service and therefore was shown erroneously. In addition, errors were present indicating SIP funding in Lincoln County and Uinta County. However, SIP funding was only provided to High Country (Uinta Co) in the amount of \$133,250 and Pioneer Counseling (Uinta Co) in the amount of \$133,250. The chart below represents the actual SIP amounts awarded in FY 11.

HB308, Mental Health Special Projects, Peer Specialist and Crisis Stabilization

Funding awards for HB308 substance abuse treatment, Special Projects, Peer Specialist and Crisis Stabilization services are awarded through a competitive bid process and public or private entities may apply for grants as outlined in the Request for Application (RFA). Awards for the mental health special projects and crisis stabilization are determined by the Division in accordance to established rules.

The final determination for the HB308 substance abuse treatment services is different in that the Division makes recommendations for funding to the Governor's Advisory Board on Substance Abuse and Violent Crime, who then determines which grants and how much funding will be awarded. *(Please refer to HB 308 - 2005 general session)*

Awards for these services are provided for a two year period.

The mental health special projects include, but are not limited to, services such as Jail Diversion, Latino Services and Early Intervention programs.

In FY 2010, the Western region was awarded \$1,829,430 for the biennium covering FY09 and FY10 for HB308 substance abuse treatment, mental health special projects and Crisis Stabilization treatment services. \$2,666,872 was awarded in FY11 resulting in an increase of funding in the amount of \$837,442. The increase was due to the following factors:

- Funding provided in the Western region for **HB308** substance abuse treatment services increased \$179,991 from \$507,755 in BFY09 to \$687,746 in BFY11. The Division received applications from Curran Seeley, High Country and Southwest Counseling. Applications were reviewed and scored and recommendations were made to the select committee. The applications were reviewed a by the select committee who then made the final determinations for all awards. As a result, Curran Seeley did not receive funding; therefore, reducing FY11 funding (\$120,498). Funding awarded to High Country was increased from \$93,367 to \$101,585 and Southwest Counseling funding increased from \$293,890 to \$586,161.
- Funding provided in the Western Region for mental health services under the special projects awards increased \$303,781 in BFY11 from \$237,679 in BFY09 to \$541,460. All Applications received were reviewed and funding levels were determined based upon available funds and amount requested. All applicants were awarded funding thus increasing the FY 11 awards.
- Funding levels for peer specialist services increased \$229,060 in BFY11 from \$104,940 in BFY 09 to \$334,000. The increase was due to need and overall success of the program.
- Funding provided in the Western Region for crisis stabilization increased \$124,610 in BFY11 from \$979,056 in BFY09 to \$1,103,666. This was due to increased funding for overlapping services for service transition from Pioneer to High Country. Funding for those services changed from Pioneer Counseling Center to High Country Behavioral Health as a result of the FY10 competitive bid process.

Conclusion

Based upon the review of the FY 2011 Western Region funding, all awards provided were completed in accordance to the established rules outlined in the Behavioral Health Personnel and Program Quality Chapters I-XII. The variance in funding was due to many factors such as the reduction of state funds in FY 2010 required by Governor Freudenthal. Funding to the region amongst providers in Uinta County changed due to the competitive bid process and subsequent decisions made by the Uinta County Select Committee. Based upon all of the documentation reviewed, we found that senior management at the Division ensured all rules established for the competitive bid process were followed and subsequent awards were made properly and in accordance to those rules.

Thank you for responding to the West Region issues. There are several areas that I will address. First, I will outline the Regional partners prior to your administration and some of the problematic processes that occurred. Second, I will address concerns with Crisis Stabilization and Sweetwater County exclusion from this service. Third, I am requesting clarification of funding for the West Region. Lastly, I am requesting the Division of Behavioral Health determination of the appropriateness of Sweetwater County being excluded in Crisis Stabilization.

I appreciate that you are the new administrator of the Behavioral Health Division and have inherited these issues. I also appreciate the financial details for the West Region partners for fiscal years 2009, 2010 and 2011. The distribution of funding has impacted Southwest Counseling Service and Sweetwater County.

My concerns for the West Region started in 2010. I did write two letters to the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse concerning Crisis Stabilization in February 2011 and March 2011. I have enclosed these letters for your information with Korin Schmidt's response letter. I also acknowledge that you received your appointment as the Administrator of Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Division in July 2011 (now referred to as the Behavioral Health Division). However, your new appointment inherits the history, decisions and processes of the previous administration of the Department.

The Wyoming Department of Health, Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Division (referred to as the Behavioral Health Division) have been involved as a funding

entity and a contractual partner throughout this entire process and appears to have approved of the process to date. The question remains why the residents of Sweetwater County are being left out of the Crisis Stabilization Services? Where is the accountability of the taxpayers' dollars for Sweetwater County in regards to this regional service?

I would like to provide you some historical information about the West Region and the Wyoming Department of Health's involvements in shaping where the West Region is today. The following agencies and individuals were involved with the West Region on January 2011:

- Korin Schmidt, Administrator, Wyoming Department of Health, Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse. Presently, Ms. Schmidt works for the Department of Family Services as the Deputy Director to Director Steve Corsi.
- Steve Corsi, Director of High Country Behavioral Health representing Uinta, Lincoln and Sublette counties. Mr. Corsi is presently the Director of the Wyoming Department of Family Services.
- Deb Sprague, Director of Jackson Hole Community Counseling, representing Teton County. Ms. Sprague resigned her position as the Director in Jackson. She is presently the Administrator of the Wyoming Girl's School, Wyoming Department of Family Services.
- Ed Wigg, Director of Curran-Seeley Foundation representing Teton County.
- Melanie Mari, Cornerstone Behavioral Health, representing Uinta County.
- Linda Acker, Director of Southwest Counseling Service representing Sweetwater County.

These individuals represented the West Region during this time period. High Country Behavioral Health (HCBH) was awarded the Crisis Stabilization contract for the West Region beginning November 23, 2010 in the amount of \$368,666 as per your financial spreadsheet. I became aware of the implementation during the February 2011 Regional telephone conference call. I was unaware that the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse approved of the Assertive Community Treatment for Crisis Stabilization.

HCBH proposed Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) team in their response to the State's request for proposals. I am unsure if ACT teams meet the State's definition of Crisis Stabilization but the State approved of their proposal that ~~excluded~~ Sweetwater County. ACT is not a regional crisis stabilization service in any other part of the state. In Southwest Counseling Service contract with the Wyoming Department of Health Mental Health and Substance Abuse services Division for Fiscal Year 11; page 1, number 2 "Purpose of Contract": *The purpose of this Contract is to purchase public outpatient mental health and substance abuse services as set forth in the terms and conditions of this Contract. The Contract requires active partnership between the Division and the Contractor's board of directors and staff in system planning, management and accountability. The outcomes described in this Contract are consistent with the goals set forth in the System of Care plan as follows. Purpose and Outcome of Regional*

Services: To provide equal access throughout the state to all funded services. Services will be provided in a uniform fashion throughout a region and will be consistent with the same service provided within every other region. A system wide philosophy of care, quality improvement and accountability will guide the development of services and service delivery within each region. . .” I realize this was in last year’s contract but equal access continues to be a problem in the West Region. This contract was in effect when the State signed the Crisis Stabilization contract that specifically excluded Sweetwater County.

I maintain today that Southwest Counseling Service –Sweetwater County was excluded from the information that ACT was being implemented in the West Region for Teton, Lincoln, Uinta and Sublette counties. In the application, there is no mention of Sweetwater County as a regional partner. I will acknowledge that there were conversations about ACT but I had not seen nor knew of the State’s plan to implement ACT for Crisis Stabilization and leave Sweetwater County out of the service.

High Country Behavioral Health officially became the provider on January 1, 2011 for Uinta County. The Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse failed to provide a transitional team that met with the Sweetwater County regional partner. According to the Division’s own documentation, this was to occur but did not happen with Sweetwater County. The lack of communications and transparency with Southwest Counseling Service was an issue that continues to impact Southwest Counseling Service and Sweetwater County residents today.

During the telephone conference call on February 26, 2011, with the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Administrator, Korin Schmidt, Steve Corsi, High Country Behavioral Health (who was present with Ms. Schmidt at the Division office), Deb Sprague, Jackson Hole Counseling Service Director, Ed Wigg, Curran-Seeley Foundation Director in Jackson, Melanie Mari, Cornerstone Behavioral Health and myself, I only learned what had occurred by asking questions and hoping I was asking the right questions. Indeed, a telephone conference call was also held in January but there was not a single word concerning the implementation of ACT until Deb Sprague revealed that she hired eight people in Teton County during the February 26th conference call and I asked, “Where did you get the funding?” Since the State establishes guidelines and awards funding, all steps in the process must be transparent and all centers should have equal access. I am concerned about the level of accountability that has occurred. I was not the only West Region partner who was not included in either the communications or planning processes.

In the original proposal by High Country Behavioral Health, it is apparent there was never an intention to include Sweetwater County. If this is truly a regional service approved by the Department of Health Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, how is that possible we were excluded?

I do have some additional questions concerning funding and hope you are able to provide answers. I understand that High Country Behavioral Health was awarded funding in the amount of \$368,666 for FY 11(7 month period) for Crisis Stabilization. I was also informed that High Country Behavioral Health and Jackson Hole Counseling Service each received \$90,000 for start-up costs. Was the \$90,000 on top of the contracted amount of \$368,666? Did the \$90,000 start up funds for Jackson Hole Community Counseling come from the State or High Country Behavioral Health? How was the \$368,666 and \$90,000 released in a lump sum? Or a draw down? According to the financial spreadsheet provided, the total dollar amount for Crisis Stabilization for 19 months of service in the West Region is \$858,666. If the \$180,000 was separate from the contracted amount, the total is \$1,038,666 for 19 months of service. After 12 months of crisis stabilization in the West Region, no money and no services have been provided in Sweetwater County.

The last question I have concerns the subcontract of High Country Behavioral Health with Jackson Hole Counseling Service. I understand from your letter that the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Division approved the agreement. Now, I see the Behavioral Health Division has also approved of this subcontract? Is that correct?

I would like to also address the present contract for Crisis Stabilization and Sweetwater County. I did receive a partial copy of High Country Behavioral Health Crisis Stabilization proposal submitted to the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse and the contract between the Wyoming Department of Health, Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services Division and High Country Behavioral Health contract for FY 12 Crisis Stabilization on 9-7-11 from Kipp Dana, the new Director of High Country Behavioral Health.

According to the present State contract with High Country, page 4 of 13, (ii) "Priority of Services." *Ensure that person who are residents of the West region designated by the Division, which includes, Lincoln, Sublette, Sweetwater, Teton, and Uinta counties . . .*" Sweetwater County is identified but receives nothing, no service nor funding. I realize that the first crisis stabilization contract was signed and implemented prior to your position as Administrator of the Behavioral Health Division. This present contract is signed by you and the new Director of the Department of Health, Tom Forslund. How is it possible that Sweetwater County continues to be left out of these services or any funding from the State of Wyoming for Crisis Stabilization?

I would think it a reasonable expectation that the largest populated county would receive some funding? Alternatively, I think it is incumbent that the State directly inform me that Sweetwater County will not receive any crisis stabilization services or funding.

Significant funds have been directed to the West Region. I am hopeful that raising these issues will not result in negative repercussions for Southwest Counseling Service. As the director of Southwest Counseling Service, I have a responsibility and commitment to advocate for services in Sweetwater County, for equal access, for higher accountability and transparency and to be a partner in the development and implementation of services.

Lastly, I do not have any issues with the previous or present West Regional partners. We met in Lander on September 7, 2011 resulting in productive discussions. I hope that you are able to understand that being left out of critical communications and processes has resulted in confusion, frustrations, and challenges in the professional relationships among mental health providers in the West Region.

I look forward to working with the Division on these issues but clearly, the only source who can answer why this situation exists is your office. I am eagerly awaiting an explanation and looking forward to hearing from you.

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I. Summary

Since 2007, Sweetwater County direction with emergency detentions and involuntary hospitalizations has dramatically changed from the majority of individuals being retained in the community to the majority of individuals being sent to Wyoming Behavioral Institute Health in Casper, Wyoming. Sweetwater County is impacted in several ways:

- Individuals transported out of the community and returned within days. Transportation is provided by Sweetwater County Sheriff's Department or by ambulance
- Sweetwater County incurs the cost of the first 72 hours of emergency detention. This cost can be for up to 8 days due to holidays and weekends
- Sweetwater County Memorial Hospital Emergency Services incur the cost of individuals being held at their facility
- Southwest Counseling Service provides on-call emergency services and responds to Sweetwater County Memorial Hospital and Sweetwater Sheriff Department for consultation and evaluation.
- Sweetwater County Attorney Expense and payments to Natrona County Attorney
- Cost of Judge for legal proceeding.

II. Introduction

Southwest Counseling Service

Southwest Counseling Service has been providing comprehensive mental health and substance abuse services for over 46 years. Since 1962, Southwest Counseling Service has expanded from a staff of two employees with little space to four main offices with over 120 employees.

The primary mission of Southwest Counseling Service is to provide Mental Health and Substance Abuse services to a variety of populations in Sweetwater County. Southwest Counseling Service also provides information about Mental Health and Substance Abuse to increase public awareness.

Southwest Counseling Service provides critical emergency services, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for Sweetwater County. The majority of individuals seen are calls received from Sweetwater County Memorial Hospital Emergency Room. When an individual exhibits behaviors which may cause the individual to be a danger to self or others, or the individual is unable to meet basic needs as a result of mental illness, the individual may be legally detained. This process is referred to as Title 25 process referring to Emergency Detentions and Involuntary Hospitalization process. The Title 25 process involves several different community agencies from law enforcement, judicial system including county attorneys, defense attorneys, court commissioners, and judges, mental health examiner, detention facilities, etc. This process significantly impacts the individual detained as well as the family members.

Once an individual is detained, the individual can be detained for 72 hours, excluding weekends and holidays. In February 2007, Sweetwater County Commissioners contracted with Wyoming Behavioral Institute to assist the County in handling emergency detentions. WBI agreed to transport clients to and from their facility in Casper, Wyoming and the majority of individuals being transported would be individuals requiring involuntary hospitalization. Transportation of individuals to WBI by WBI only lasted until April 5, 2007.

Today, the majority of individuals detained at Sweetwater County Memorial Hospital are transported to WBI within hours of their detention and are transported by Sweetwater County Sheriff Department or local ambulance service when medically necessary. When an individual is detained in Sweetwater County and transported to WBI, the Natrona County Attorney's Office has agreed to handle the necessary legal hearings. The cost to Sweetwater County is for the transportation of the individual, the first 72-hours of hospitalization at WBI and to Natrona County Attorney's office for legal proceedings.

An earlier intervention to emergency detention and involuntary hospitalizations is crisis stabilization. However, once an emergency detention process is initiated, the individual is not eligible for crisis stabilization until medically cleared and the danger to self or others no longer exists.

III. Needs/Problems

Currently Sweetwater County is faced with the need for effective Crisis Stabilization in the community. The following issues have been identified for solution:

- Potentially decrease the number of individuals transported to WBI that are in need of crisis stabilization and would benefit from short term stabilization
- Potentially decrease the cost for the transportation of these individuals out of the community.
- Potentially decrease the impact on the County resources
- Address the impact of emergency detentions from surrounding counties
- Provide for effective care in the community

IV. Goals/Objectives

A goal could be to:

- Provide effective cost efficient care to individuals faced with a crisis.
- Provide adequate care for individuals in need of crisis stabilization.
- Divert individuals when appropriate from emergency detention proceedings
- Provide effective treatment in the community
- Maximize utilization of community resources for better outcomes

V. Procedures/Scope of Work

Crisis Stabilization is a comprehensive array of services designed to stabilize individuals suffering from acute psychiatric symptoms. This service is intended for individuals whose condition can be stabilized within a short-term period (3 to 10 days) and who voluntarily accept crisis stabilization. Individuals would be monitored, provided with wrap around services and linkage to community resources. A discharge plan would begin at time of admission for returning to the community as soon as symptoms are manageable.

Crisis Stabilization would be for adults, age 18 years or older, impaired by psychiatric symptoms enough to impact their life, work and personal relationships. This is a 24 hour care facility. Individuals would be able to see a master's level clinician, medication monitoring, and provided a safe, comfortable environment.

Individuals who are in imminent danger to themselves or others or under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol cannot be admitted into crisis stabilization.





1. A right-of-way is hereby granted pursuant to Title V of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of October 21, 1976 (90 Stat. 2776; 43 U.S.C. 1761).

2. Nature of Interest:

a. By this instrument, the holder:

receives a right to construct, operate, maintain, and terminate a(n) County road 4-60 Mesa Drive extension, previously authorized under grant of right-of-way approved on December 19, 1980, on Federal lands described as follows:

T. 19 N., R. 105 W., 6th P.M., Sweetwater County, Wyoming
section 8: N $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$;

b. The right-of-way or permit area granted herein is 80.00 feet wide, 2,597.20 feet long and contains 4.77 acres, more or less.

c. This instrument shall terminate on December 31, 2039, 30 years from its effective date unless, prior thereto, it is relinquished, abandoned, terminated, or modified pursuant to the terms and conditions of this instrument or of any applicable Federal law or regulation.

d. This instrument may be renewed. If renewed, the right-of-way or permit shall be subject to the regulations existing at the time of the renewal and any other terms and conditions that the authorized officer deems necessary to protect the public interest.

e. Notwithstanding the expiration of this instrument or any renewal thereof, early relinquishment, abandonment, or termination, the provisions of this instrument, to the extent applicable, shall continue in effect and shall be binding on the holder, its successors, or

assigns, until they have fully satisfied the obligations and/or liabilities accruing herein before or on account of the expiration, or prior termination, of the grant.

3. Rental

For and in consideration of the rights granted, the holder agrees to pay the Bureau of Land Management fair market value rental as determined by the authorized officer unless specifically exempted from such payment by regulation. Provided, however, that the rental may be adjusted by the authorized officer, whenever necessary, to reflect changes in the fair market rental value as determined by the application of sound business management principles, and so far as practicable and feasible, in accordance with comparable commercial practices.

4. Terms and Conditions:

- a. This grant or permit is issued subject to the holder's compliance with all applicable regulations contained in Title 43 Code of Federal Regulations part 2800 and 2880.
- b. Upon grant termination by the authorized officer, all improvements shall be removed from the public lands within 90 days, or otherwise disposed of as provided in paragraph (4)(d) or as directed by the authorized officer.
- c. Each grant issued for a term of 20 years or more shall, at a minimum, be reviewed by the authorized officer at the end of the 20th year and at regular intervals thereafter not to exceed 10 years. Provided, however, that a right-of-way or permit granted herein may be reviewed at any time deemed necessary by the authorized officer.
- d. The stipulations, plans, maps, or designs set forth in Exhibit(s) A and B, dated December 19, 1980, attached hereto, are incorporated into and made a part of this grant instrument as fully and effectively as if they were set forth herein in their entirety.
- e. Failure of the holder to comply with applicable law or any provision of this right-of-way grant or permit shall constitute grounds for suspension or termination thereof.

- f. The holder shall perform all operations in a good and workmanlike manner so as to ensure protection of the environment and the health and safety of the public.
- g. The holder shall contact the authorized officer at least FIVE days prior to the anticipated start of construction and/or any surface disturbing activities. The authorized officer may require and schedule a preconstruction conference with the holder prior to the holder's commencing construction and/or surface disturbing activities on the right-of-way. The holder and/or his representative shall attend this conference. The holder's contractor, or agents involved with construction and/or any surface disturbing activities associated with the right-of-way, shall also attend this conference to review the stipulations of the grant including the plan(s) of development.
- h. In the event that the public land underlying the right-of-way (ROW) encompassed in this grant, or a portion thereof, is conveyed out of Federal ownership and administration of the ROW or the land underlying the ROW is not being reserved to the United States in the patent/deed and/or the ROW is not within a ROW corridor being reserved to the United States in the patent/deed, the United States waives any right it has to administer the right-of-way, or portion thereof, within the conveyed land under Federal laws, statutes, and regulations, including the regulations at 43 CFR Part 2800, including any rights to have the holder apply to BLM for amendments, modifications, or assignments and for BLM to approve or recognize such amendments, modifications, or assignments. At the time of conveyance, the patentee/grantee, and their successors and assigns, shall succeed to the interests of the United States in all matters relating to the right-of-way, or portion thereof, within the conveyed land and shall be subject to applicable State and local government laws, statutes, and ordinances. After conveyance, any disputes concerning compliance with the use and the terms and conditions of the ROW shall be considered a civil matter between the patentee/grantee and the ROW Holder.
- i. The holder shall construct, operate, and maintain the facilities, improvements, and structures within this right-of-way in strict conformity with the plan(s) of development which was (were) approved and made part of the grant on December 19, 1980. Any relocation, additional construction, or use that is not in accord with the approved plan(s) of development, shall not be initiated without the prior written approval of the authorized officer. A copy of the complete right-of-

way grant, including all stipulations and approved plan(s) of development, shall be made available on the right-of-way area during construction, operation, and termination to the authorized officer. Noncompliance with the above will be grounds for an immediate temporary suspension of activities if it constitutes a threat to public health and safety or the environment.

- j. The holder shall designate a representative(s) who shall have the authority to act upon and to implement instructions from the authorized officer. The holder's representative shall be available for communication with the authorized officer within a reasonable time when construction or other surface disturbing activities are underway.
- k. Any cultural and/or paleontological resource (historic or prehistoric site or object) discovered by the holder, or any person working on his behalf, on public or Federal land shall be immediately reported to the authorized officer. Holder shall suspend all operations in the immediate area of such discovery until written authorization to proceed is issued by the authorized officer. An evaluation of the discovery will be made by the authorized officer to determine appropriate actions to prevent the loss of significant cultural or scientific values. 




USE OLD AND NEW MAGNETIC NORTH DECLINATION AT CENTER OF SHEET

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I INTRODUCTION

The Wyoming Historic Mine Trail and Byway System was created for the purpose of identifying and designating historic mine locations and trails and byways linking historic mines within the state. The objectives of the Program include:

- Identify and describe Wyoming's mining and mineral development heritage;
- Interpret the role of mining and minerals in the development of Wyoming's economy;
- Communicate the history of mineral development in Wyoming.

With assistance from the Monuments and Markers Program Coordinator, the Monuments and Markers Advisory Committee (MMAC) will oversee the Historic Mine Trail and Byway Program and determine routes to be included in the System. The Committee encourages local historical societies, cities, counties, interest groups or citizens to nominate additional highways or trails to the Committee for inclusion in the Wyoming Historic Mine Trail and Byway System. The nomination and Committee review process is described in this publication.

The emphasis of the System is to identify and select routes and trails accessing or connecting Wyoming's most culturally significant mines and/or mining areas. The features of these routes are to be identified and interpreted in the nomination so that the Committee can determine those routes, which are truly outstanding.

The MMAC is a group of individuals from the public and from State Parks and Cultural Resources (SPCR) staff that possesses knowledge of Wyoming History and an interest in its interpretation. In addition, the MMAC contains at least two members with a special knowledge of mining history in Wyoming. Members of the MMAC are recommended by the Monuments and Markers Program Coordinator and approved by the SPCR Director. The Committee meets twice a year to evaluate signage and byway nominations. The MMAC will make a final determination of which routes will be included in the System.

Nominations can be sponsored by any agency, organization, or group of individuals. The nominations are to be made on the enclosed forms, and in accordance with the following submittal requirements.

Nominations of routes which possess exceptional mining related historic, economic and/or distinctive cultural resource values are encouraged.

The determination of whether a nominated route is best qualified as a Trail or a Byway will be made by the MMAC after nomination has been submitted, and public comment has been invited, submitted, and reviewed.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS- for Nominating a route as a Historic Mine Trail and Byway.

1. Consult and coordinate trail and byway system designation and development with private landowners upon whose land the proposed trails or byways nominated for designation lie.
2. Consult and coordinate with appropriate governmental entities having jurisdiction over lands and roadways included in the trail and byway.
3. If more than one route is nominated as a Historic Mine Trail or Byway, use a separate set of forms for each route.
4. Additional pages may be added as needed to respond to any of the information requested.
5. One (1)-copy of the nomination form for a Historic Mine Trail and Byway must be submitted to:

Describe the route proposed for Historic Mine Trail and Byway.

Where does it begin and end?

This byway can be traveled in two directions, making the "beginning" and "end" interchangeable. The western point for this byway is at the intersection between Wyoming State Highway #374, Sweetwater County Road #37 (Peru Cut-off Road), and the off ramp for Interstate 80 Exit #83 (La Barge Road). Please reference Site #1 on the accompanying map, page 1(a). The southern point is at the intersection of Sweetwater County Road #37 (Peru Cut-off Road) and Wyoming Highway #530. Please reference Site #5 on the accompanying map.

What is the total mileage?

14 miles.

What is the landowner status? (private, BLM, USFS, etc.)?

This byway follows two state highways: Wyoming State Highway #374 and Wyoming State Highway #530. Landowner status of Interpretive sites are as follows: Site #1 BLM, Site #2 Private, Site #3 Sweetwater County, Site #4 Sweetwater County School District #2, Site #5 BLM. Please reference the accompanying map, page 1(a) to locate these sites.

What is the approximate time to travel?

60 minutes with brief stops at the five interpretive sites.

Sites #1 and #5 are the ends of this historic byway. Site #1 already has a large turnout just past the intersection of Wyoming State Highway #374 and Sweetwater County Road #37. Site #5, at the intersection of Wyoming State Highway #530 and Sweetwater County Road #37 has space to construct a turnout, however, there is already a medium-sized pullout along the county road, just before the intersection of the highway. This site is owned by the Bureau of Land Management, and with appropriate landowner permission, this pullout could easily be the turnaround site for this byway. What is the historical significance of the mines accessed from the nominated roadway?

Discuss those features which are part of the proposed route. Be specific. For example, are the mines currently active? If not, are there structures which may be visited by travelers? This route examines five historic and current sites for four industries. The loop path of the trail begins and ends with trona mining, so that east-west travelers as well as north-south travelers to Green River have access to the trona interpretive sites. Including trona, which is currently mined just outside of Green River, this byway explores the history and present-day issues of oil shale extraction, as well as two industries that were the precursors to trona mining in the area, a soda water plant and potash manufacturing plant. Referencing the attached map on page 1(a), the route begins or ends with trona interpretation at sites #1 and #5. The oil shale refining plant interpretation is site #2, the soda water plant is site #3 and the potash plant is site #4.

Like so many towns in the western United States, Green River was historically and is currently reliant on natural resource extraction. In the late 1800s, the Union Pacific Railroad established a division station in the burgeoning town because of its ample water supply from the similarly-named river. The coal mining done nearby had little effect on Green River, but accents the role the Union Pacific and natural resource extraction played in the early history of the area. Today, Green River's economy is based almost solely upon two natural resource industries: trona mining and natural gas drilling. Both had precursors in the early 20th century that will be examined along this byway's route. Trona mining, which is interpreted at sites #1 and #5 of this route, is a relatively new industry for the area. In 1938, a company drilling for natural gas had a drill core examined at the request of a local geologist. A ten foot section of the core was trona and after several more exploratory cores were examined, Westvaco decided the resource could be economically extracted. Today, trona is mined and refined by four companies just west of Green River. The end product, soda ash, is used to make glass and multitudes of household products.

Before the deposits of trona that led to Green River being named the "Trona Capital of the World," the town of Green River was exploiting trona's effect on groundwater. A well dug in 1898, again seeking hydrocarbons, went through a water zone that was so salty, the well owners knew they could profitably dehydrate the brine and produce soda. A soda plant, first known as Green River Soda Works and later as Western Alkali, drilled water wells and evaporated the water, leaving behind the soda that was used locally, in laundries, and shipped out of state. The plant operated till 1911, and then intermittently until 1917. At site #3, visitors can view the wellhead for this "brine well".

Site #4 is also a precursor to the trona industry, as it interprets another salt-based industry. Liberty Potash constructed a plant on this site to meet World War I demand for potash, a salt compound that contains water soluble potassium. Previously to the War, Germany had supplied the world's needs for potash, including American demand. When the war shut off this supply, investors leapt to this site and, making use of several local resources, including coal, water, and limestone, began manufacturing American potash. The industry, however, did not live long after the war and treaties with Germany once again allowed imports of potash. The plant was closed by 1921, leaving behind thousands of dollars of investment and towering buildings as legacy to its two year life.

Site #2 is the historic site for another short-lived industry; an oil shale refinery operated on this site for less than a year. Green River sits in the middle of one of the largest oil shale deposits in the world, as the local newspaper proudly touted through the 1920s, but the 1927 plant could not produce it profitably, if at all. This plant is a bit of mystery tied up with an early century inventor, Milton J. Trumble, who created the retort used at this site. Proclaimed a visionary achievement, the plant was closed within a year. Local belief describes this plant as a scam meant only to lure in investors, but oil shale is a tricky natural resource, as producers today know as their research and development departments closely eye the cost of oil as they attempt to drain the Green River Formation's oil shale deposits.

Describe the general roadway conditions, and identify the location of any problem locations

This byway travels the routes of two state highways, both of which are kept in appropriate and safe condition by the Wyoming Department of Transportation. The only problem location on this route pertains to the access to Site #3, which is a short dirt road paralleling Wyoming State Highway #530. The intersection of this access road and Highway #530 is a busy intersection, but safe and patient drivers will be able to navigate it. According to the Wyoming Department of Transportation's State Transportation Improvement Plan, Draft 2012, there are no anticipated road projects that would impact either of the highways included for this byway.

Briefly discuss below the accessibility of the route. Is it a public road under the jurisdiction and maintenance of a public entity and open to the public? Is it open year round. (Note: proposed byways do not necessarily need to be open year round.) How accessible is the route to services such as food, fuel, lodging and sanitary facilities?

This route travels public roads that are open year-round, dependent upon Wyoming Department of Transportation evaluation of winter weather risks. The route begins and ends in rural areas, but the center of the route and sites #3 and #4 are located within the City of Green River. Thus, travelers have access to approximately four gas and service stations, the Sweetwater County Visitor's and Information Center (with public sanitary facilities), and about four restaurants and five hotels.

The Sweetwater County Historical Museum and the Sweetwater County Historical Society are working together to complete this nomination. The Green River Historic Preservation Commission has also been consulted. Local municipalities, business and tourism groups will be contacted for support as well.

The proposed locations for interpretation sites are under federal, state, local and private governmental ownership as well as in private hands. The Bureau of Land Management, Rock Springs Field Office, will be invited to join discussions regarding two interpretive sites on BLM land. Sweetwater County government will be approached regarding access to, and location of a site on, county land and Sweetwater County School District #2 will be consulted regarding the use of a parking area adjacent to some school sports fields as an interpretive site. Finally, one of the sites is located on privately owned lands, as are the two potential sites interpretation signage. These two landowners have been approached verbally regarding this project. Further communication will take place as the proposal develops.

As the sites are located along state highways and local county roads, the Wyoming Department of Transportation's District #3 as well as Sweetwater County government will be notified regarding the project.

There are several industries involved in the modern chemical industries. These include FMC, Tata Chemicals, OCI Wyoming, Solvay Chemicals and Church and Dwight. These are heavy industries with safety and security issues and for this reason, the sites on this proposed tour are overlooks and do not approach the industrial installations. However, the companies will be consulted regarding project support and verification of information on interpretive materials.

Suggested placement of the five interpretive signs is mentioned previously and identified on the attached map. The trail will be developed in close consultation with Wyoming SHPO.

Promotional activities include a brochure/map to be distributed through state and local visitor centers, local businesses and cultural centers. Information about the trail will also be included in tourism material created locally and regionally and information about the trail will be incorporated in exhibits on the topic at the visitor's centers and the Sweetwater County Historical Museum.

The major development/improvement needed for the route is the installation of interpretive signs. Fortunately there are usable turn out areas located at each of these sites and these will be utilized where allowed.

Describe the availability of financial resources with which to upgrade, develop, sign, promote and otherwise make the scenic road and its corridor available for its intended uses. If no funding is presently available, indicate how the organization plans to locate funding sources.

Multiple sources for funding the development of this trail will be considered. These include the SHPO Mine Byway program, CLG grants through the Green River Historic Preservation Commission, interpretive material development and printing funds through the Sweetwater County Joint Travel and Tourism Board as well as private donations from the Sweetwater County Historical Society and the philanthropic arms of the large chemical industries (FMC, Tata, Solvay, OCI, and Church and Dwight). The Sweetwater County Museum Foundation, a 501(c)(3) organization, will be contacted to assist in raising project funds.

Describe possible concerns and issues that may arise because of future public use and development along the route and include evidence of a commitment to preserve, enhance and protect the scenic and historic qualities of the proposed byway.


