Orange Creamsicle Bars

1 ½ cups of graham crackers, crushed

½ cup butter, melted

2 tablespoons sugar

1 ½ cups of cream cheese

14 oz. condensed milk

1/3 cup sugar

2 tablespoons orange zest

1 cup orange juice

½ teaspoon orange extract

1/3 cup powdered sugar

1 cup heavy whipping cream

Combine graham crackers, butter and sugar in a small bowl and mix to combine. Line a baking tin with foil, then cover the bottom with graham cracker crust. Push the crust down with your hands to solidify it. Stick crust in freezer. In a mixer, combine cream cheese, condensed milk, and sugar. Mix to combine. Add orange zest, juice and extract to the mixture and combine. In a separate bowl, combine powdered sugar and whipping cream. Mix to combine.

Add whipped cream mixture to the original mixture and combine. Pour the entire thing into the graham cracker crust.

Freeze. Once set, cut into bars and top with orange slices if desired.
